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this 1998 study serves as a contribution to both reception history examining the medieval response to Chrétien's poetry and genre history surveying the evolution of Arthurian verse romance in French it describes the evolutionary changes taking place between Chrétien's *Érec et Enide* and Froissart's *Meliador* the first and last examples of the genre and is unique in placing Chrétien's work not as the unequalled masterpieces of the whole of Arthurian literature but as the starting point for the history of the genre which can subsequently be traced over a period of two centuries in the French speaking world Beate Schmolke-Hasselmann's study was first published in German in 1985 but her radical argument that we need urgently to redraw the lines on the literary and

linguistic map of medieval britain and france is only now being made available in english

during the thirty five years from 1946 to 1981 the university of california berkeley s music library amassed nearly 3 500 manuscript volumes thanks to the remarkable efforts of professor vincent h duckies the catalog of pre 1900 vocal manuscripts focuses on the third major segment of the library s manuscript collection featuring over 700 vocal manuscripts with more than 3 300 separate compositions these works encompass a wide range of musical styles religious and secular vocal and instrumental serious and popular and date from the eleventh to the late nineteenth century although the catalog does not include musical incipits it provides a valuable inventory of these manuscripts for scholars and researchers the materials were acquired through various antiquarian dealers across europe and the united states and while some background information may have been lost during transfers the manuscripts remain a rich resource for study emerson notes that the collection s value will ultimately be determined by the scholarly community whose research and exploration will continue to uncover the insights hidden within these historical documents this title is part of uc press s voices revived program which commemorates university of california press s mission to seek out and cultivate the brightest minds and give them voice reach and impact drawing on a backlist dating to 1893 voices revived makes high quality peer reviewed scholarship accessible once again using print on demand technology this title was originally published in 1988

medieval romances with their magic fountains brave knights and beautiful maidens have come to stand for the middle ages more generally this close connection between the medieval and the romance has had consequences for popular conceptions of the middle ages an idealized fantasy of chivalry and hierarchy and also for our understanding of romances as always already archaic part of a half forgotten past and yet romances were one of the most influential and long lasting innovations of the medieval period to emphasize their novelty is to see the resources medieval people had for thinking about their contemporary concern and controversies whether social order jewish christian relations the crusades the connectivity of the mediterranean women s roles as mothers and how to write a national past this volume takes up the challenge to think romance investigating the various ways that romances imagine reflect and describe the challenges of the medieval world

the majority of these collected essays date from 1992 onwards three of them having been specially expanded for this volume drawing on recent archival research and new musicological theory they investigate distinctive qualities in french opera from early opéra comique to early grand opera media is interpreted in terms of both narrative systems and practical theatre resources one group of essays identifies narrative systems in minuet scenes in the diegetic romance and in special uses of musical motives another group concerns the theory and aesthetics of opera in which uses of metaphor help us interpret audience reception a third group focuses on orchestral

and staging practices brought together in a new theory of the melodrama model linking various genres from the 1780s with the world of the 1820s french opera's relation with literature and politics is a continuing theme explored in writings on prison scenes ossian and public private dramaturgy in grand opera david charlton has written widely on french music and opera topics for over 25 years the selection of his articles presented here focuses on the period 1730 1830 when paris was a hotbed of influential ideas in music and music theatre with many of these ideas taken up by foreign composers this volume assesses the french contribution to the development of classical and romantic styles and genres which has hitherto not received the attention it deserves

more than twenty years ago james tyler wrote a modest introduction to the history repertory and playing techniques of the four and five course guitar entitled the early guitar a history and handbook oup 1980 this work proved valuable and enlightening not only to performers and scholars of renaissance and baroque guitar and lute music but also to classical guitarists this new book written in collaboration with paul sparks their previous book for oup the early mandolin appeared in 1989 presents new ideas and research on the history and development of the guitar and its music from the renaissance to the dawn of the classical era tyler's systematic study of the two main guitar types found between about 1550 and 1750 focuses principally on what the sources of the music published and manuscript and the writings of contemporary theorists reveal about the nature of the instruments and their roles in the music making of the period the annotated lists of primary sources previously published in the early guitar but now revised and expanded constitute the most comprehensive bibliography of baroque guitar music to date his appendices of performance practice information should also prove indispensable to performers and scholars alike paul sparks also breaks new ground offering an extensive study of a period in the guitar's history notably c 1759 c 1800 which the standard histories usually dismiss in a few short paragraphs far from being a dormant instrument at this time the guitar is shown to have been central to music making in france italy the iberian peninsula and south america sparks provides a wealth of information about players composers instruments and surviving compositions from this neglected but important period and he examines how the five course guitar gradually gave way to the six string instrument a process that occurred in very different ways and at different times in france italy spain germany and britain

throughout her career colette experimented with genre for the purposes of telling stories of her life the books that resulted known collectively as her *livres souvenirs* are far from being autobiographies in the customary sense by addressing the need to reconsider the generic issues surrounding autobiographical story telling anne freadman's study brings the richness of the genre question to the fore shedding a fresh light on this much loved body of work from the vignettes of *la maison de claudine* to the note books of *l'étoile vespérale* and *le fanal bleu* from stories of losing to stories of collecting colette's memory books take different narrative forms and explore the

passing of time in different ways this book investigates colette s variegated generic choices as so many ways of telling time

this work offers for the first time a complete list of all books published wholly or partially in the french language before 1601 based on twelve years of investigations in libraries in france the united kingdom the united states germany the netherlands and elsewhere it provides an analytical short title catalogue of over 52 000 bibliographically distinct items with reference to surviving copies in over 1 600 libraries worldwide many of the items described are editions and even complete texts fully unknown and re discovered by the project french vernacular books is an invaluable research tool for all students and scholars interested in the history culture and literature of france as well as historians of the early modern book world for vols iii iv please go to french books iii iv

music it is the great pleasure of this city the great occupation of the drawing rooms which have banished politics and which have renounced literature from ennui jules janin an american in paris 1843 afternoon and evening entertainments in the drawing rooms of the aristocracy and upper middle classes were a staple of cultural life in nineteenth century paris music was often a feature of these occasions and private salons provided important opportunities for musicians especially singers to develop their careers such recitals included excerpts from favourite operas but also the more traditional forms of french song the romance and its successor the m die drawing on extensive research into the musical press of the period david tunley paints a vivid portrait of the nineteenth century parisien salons and the performers who sang in them against this colourful backdrop he discusses the development of french romantic song with its hallmarks of simplicity and clarity of diction combined with italian influences and the impression made by schubert s songs the french romance developed into a form with greater complexity the m die salons singers and songs describes this transformation and the seeds it sowed for music by later composers such as faur duparc and debussy

this collection of essays explores the ways in which talking therapies have been depicted in twentieth century and contemporary narratives life writings fiction and poetry in french this vibrant corpus of francophone literary engagements of therapy has so far been widely unexplored but it offers rich insights into the connections between literature and psychoanalysis as the number of autobiographical and fictional depictions of the therapeutic encounter is still on the rise these creative outputs raise pressing questions why do narratives of the therapeutic encounter continue to fascinate writers and readers what do these works tell us about the particular culture and history in which they are written what do they tell us about therapeutic and other human encounters the volume highlights the important role that the creative arts have played in offering representations and explorations of our minds our relationships and our mental health or more pressingly ill health the volume s focus is not only on the patient s experience as expressed via

the creative act and as counterweight to the practitioner s case study but more specifically on the therapeutic encounter specifically the relationship between therapist and patient the contributors here engage with ideas and methodologies within contemporary psychoanalytic thought including but not limited to those of sigmund freud melanie klein andré green julia kristeva jacques lacan and donald winnicott highlighting the dynamic research culture that exists in this field and maintaining a dialogue between the humanities and various therapeutic disciplines narratives of the therapeutic encounter combines the analysis of psychoanalytic and fictional texts to explore the implications that arise from the space between the participants in therapy including creative and aesthetic inspirations therapeutic potentials and ethical dilemmas

lyric theater in ancien régime france was an eminently political art tied to the demands of court spectacle this was true not only of tragic opera tragédie lyrique but also its comic counterpart opéra comique a form tracing its roots to the seasonal trade fairs of paris while historians have long privileged the genre s popular origins opéra comique was brought under the protection of the french crown in 1762 thus consolidating a new venue where national music might be debated and defined in the comedians of the king julia doe traces the impact of bourbon patronage on the development of opéra comique in the turbulent prerevolutionary years drawing on both musical and archival evidence the book presents the history of this understudied genre and unpacks the material structures that supported its rapid evolution at the royally sponsored comédie italienne doe demonstrates how comic theater was exploited in and worked against the monarchy s carefully cultivated public image a negotiation that became especially fraught after the accession of the music loving queen marie antoinette the comedians of the king examines the aesthetic and political tensions that arose when a genre with popular foundations was folded into the bourbon propaganda machine and when a group of actors trained at the parisian fairs became official representatives of the sovereign or comédiens ordinaires du roi

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
