this book uses the psychological literature on rationality to weigh in on the recent debate between virtue epistemologists and epistemic situationists it argues that both sides have misconstrued the literature and that an interactionist framework is needed to square epistemic theory with empirical facts about reasoning and inference the explosion of empirical literature on human rationality has led to seismic shifts across a multitude of academic disciplines this book considers its implications for epistemology in particular it critically evaluates the treatment of the rationality literature within the recent controversy between virtue epistemologists who attempt to ground knowledge in stable epistemic virtues and epistemic situationists who claim that such a project is doomed by empirical evidence of widespread irrationality it links this foundational controversy to two of the most important debates in psychology the rationality wars and the person situation debate the book argues that both virtue theorists and epistemic situationists have misunderstood the implications of these debates leading them to focus exclusively on personal dispositions and situational factors as two independent sources of epistemic success failure and improvement a more accurate reading of the empirical literature implies that interactions between epistemic agents and their social informational and institutional environments are the fundamental drivers of both rational and irrational behaviour an interactionist framework motivated by this insight conceives of epistemic virtues and vices as both responsive to and responsible for the environments in which they re manifested and cultivated the central aim of this book is to present and defend this novel type of virtue epistemology rationality in context will be of interest to scholars and advanced students

since the turn of the century the idea that intellectual capacity is fixed has been generally accepted but increasingly psychologists educators and others have come to challenge this premise outsmarting iq reveals how earlier discoveries about iq together with recent research show that intelligence is not genetically fixed intelligence can be taught david perkins renowned for his research on thinking learning and education identifies three distinct kinds of intelligence the fixed neurological intelligence linked to iq tests the specialized knowledge and experience that individuals acquire over time and reflective intelligence the ability to become aware of one's mental habits and transcend limited patterns of thinking although all of these forms of intelligence function simultaneously it is reflective intelligence perkins shows that affords the best opportunity to amplify human intellect this is the kind of intelligence that helps us to make wise personal decisions solve challenging technical problems find creative ideas and learn complex topics in mathematics the sciences management and other areas it is the kind of intelligence most needed in an increasingly competitive and complicated world using his own pathbreaking research at harvard and a rich array of other sources perkins paints a compelling picture of the skills and attitudes underlying learnable intelligence he identifies typical pitfalls in multiple perspectives and neglecting evidence he reveals the underlying mechanisms of intelligent behavior and he explores new frontiers in the development of intelligence in education business and other settings this book will be of interest to people who have a personal or professional stake in increasing their intellectual skills to those who look toward better education and a more thoughtful society and not least to those who follow today's heated debates about the nature of intelligence

immediate certainty and gullibility and the like the chapters are divided into four key sections foundational issues individual virtues collective virtues and methods and measurements and the chapters explore the most salient questions in this areas of research including how are individual intellectual virtues and vices affected by their social contexts does being in touch with other open minded people make us more open minded conversely does connection to other dogmatic people make us more dogmatic can groups possess virtues and vices distinct from those of their members for instance could a group of dogmatic individuals operate in an open minded way despite the vices of its members each chapter receives commentary from two other authors in the volume and each original author then replies to these commentaries together the authors form part of a collective conversation about how we can know about what we know in so doing they not only theorize but enact social virtue epistemology

the spanish society of experimental psychology sepex was born from an agreement of 16 pioneering researchers from different spanish universities gathered in the university of almería on july 1st 1997 for its foundation in that first meeting the first statutes of sepex were drafted and the first board of directors was elected whose composition partially changes every 2 years the objectives of the society are to promote the development of scientific knowledge in all fields of psychology promote research and the dissemination of its results among researchers and promote the relationship with national and

international homologous societies and organizations organize and promote scientific meetings periodically inform members of the society about activities related to experimental psychology from its foundations in 1997 sepex has grown to more than 400 members and has become the referent in the field for the exchange of scientific research in Spain from the first sepex conference held in Granada in 1998 to the last one held in Almería in 2022 the society has promoted the holding on a biannual basis of fourteen consecutive editions all of them included plenary conferences given by Spanish and foreign researchers of recognized international prestige the XIV sepex conference at the University of Almería has featured 125 oral communications including 9 thematic sessions 113 written communications posters one emerging researcher award lecture given by Dr Garikoitz Lerma Usabiaga Basque Center on Cognition Brain and Language and three plenary talks the Pio Tudela lecture given by Professor Nuria Sebastián Universitat Pompeu Fabra Barcelona and the keynote lectures given by Professor Kimberly Noble Columbia University New York USA and Professor Michael Anderson University of Cambridge UK this XIV meeting has also included a special symposium to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the foundation of sepex in this symposium 7 of the founding researchers have illustrated their beginnings in the field of psychological research a good reflection of the conditions in which research was carried out in our country at that time through the presentation of their experimental work they tried to explain the questions of interest in their respective fields of study the resources and equipment they had at their disposal and the various vicissitudes that usually accompanied research work at that time you can find further information about sepex in websepex.com

critics of intelligence tests writers such as robert sternberg howard gardner and daniel goleman have argued in recent years that these tests neglect important qualities such as emotion empathy and interpersonal skills however such critiques imply that though intelligence tests may miss certain key noncognitive areas they encompass most of what is important in the cognitive domain in this book keith e stanovich challenges this widely held assumption stanovich shows that iq tests or their proxies such as the sat are radically incomplete as measures of cognitive functioning they fail to assess traits that most people associate with good thinking skills such as judgment and decision making such cognitive skills are crucial to real world behavior affecting the way we plan evaluate critical evidence judge risks and probabilities and make effective decisions

iq tests fail to assess these skills of rational thought even though they are measurable cognitive processes rational thought is just as important as intelligence stanovich argues and it should be valued as highly as the abilities currently measured on intelligence tests

itself no matter how alluring the model is unfortunately most of us have a deep aversion to situations that involve even a hint of ambiguity recent research in neuroscience has revealed the reason for this ambiguity is processed in the parts of the brain which regulate our emotional responses as a result many people associate ambiguity with feelings of anxiety when kids feel anxious they turn to transitional objects such as teddy bears or security blankets providing them with a sense of stability when situations or events seem overwhelming we contend that as grown ups we don't actually stop using teddy bears they take a different form backed by research we illustrate that management models fads and frameworks are akin to teddy bears they provide the same sense of comfort and certainty to corporate managers and minions as real teddies do to distressed kids this is not a problem in many cases children usually outgrow their need for a teddy unless if development is disrupted or arrested in some way if this happens the transitional object can become a fetish an object that is held on to with a pathological intensity simply for the comfort that it offers in the face of ambiguity the corporate reliance on simplistic solutions for the complex challenges faced is akin to little johnny believing that everything will be ok provided he clings on to teddy ambiguity is a primal force that drives much of our behaviour it is typically viewed negatively something to be avoided or to be controlled the truth however is that it is a force that can be used in positive ways too the force that gave the dark side their power in the star wars movies was harnessed by the jedi in positive ways similarly this new management book shows how ambiguous situations so common in the corporate world are processed by the brain and the behaviours that often arise as a consequence more importantly though it shows you how to harness that ambiguity to achieve outstanding results
