this book examines the study of american political history

by 1926 it seemed that john r brinkley s experimental rejuvenation cure transplanting goat glands into aging men had taken the nation by storm never mind that doc brinkley s medical credentials were shaky at best and that he prescribed medication over the airwaves via his high power radio stations to most in the medical field he was a quack but to his many patients and listeners he was a brilliant surgeon a savior of their lost manhood and youth his rogue radio stations xer and its successor xera eventually broadcast at an antenna shattering 1 000 000 watts and not only were a megaphone for brinkley s lucrative quackery but also hosted an unprecedented number of then unknown country musicians and other guests the bizarre careers of john r brinkley tells the story of the infamous goat gland doctor a controversial medical charlatan groundbreaking radio impresario and prescient political campaigner and recounts his amazing rags to riches to rags career a master manipulator and skilled con artist brinkley left behind a patchwork of myths and unreliable personal accounts that many writers have merely perpetuated until now alton lee brings brinkley s infamous legacy to the forefront exploring how he ruthlessly exploited the sexual frustrations of aging men and the general public s antipathy toward medical doctors lee leaves no stone unturned in this account of a man who changed the course of american institutions forever

there are so many books on so many aspects of the history of the united states offering such a wide variety of interpretations that students teachers scholars and librarians often need help and advice on how to find what they want the reader s guide to american history is designed to meet that need by adopting a new and constructive approach to the appreciation of this rich historiography each of the 600 entries on topics in political social and economic history describes and evaluates some 6 to 12 books on the topic providing guidance to the reader on everything from broad surveys and interpretive works to specialized monographs the entries are devoted to events and individuals as well as broader themes and are written by a team of well over 200 contributors all scholars of american history

in 1987 the american philosopher allan bloom published his controversial book the

closing of the american mind in which he criticized contemporary trends in american academia as well as in the culture at large the book was largely perceived to be a conservative tract and many commentators on the political right praised the work although bloom himself rejected the label conservative the controversy bloom unleashed was and is a battle between political forces for cultural sovereignty especially in the universities and the commanding heights of american intellectual life this conflict was well captured in camille paglia s famous description of the closing of the american mind as the first shot in the culture wars the purpose of this study is to inquire into the american right s reception and reconstruction of bloom s book and to determine the initial impact and lasting influence it had on american conservative thought to provide the necessary context the history of american conservatism from 1945 up to the respective points in time is also illuminated in this work

the miracle of independence is a general survey of american history from a christian perspective it covers the events beginning with the age of exploration to the second great awakening this manuscript reveals that america would have never existed nor

survived without divine intervention the hand of god is seen in the formation of this country from the time columbus set sail with three caravels across a large uncharted ocean god s presence is revealed with the founding of the original thirteen colonies and in the zeal of the god fearing people who inhabited these colonies god s miraculous power manifested itself when the forces of darkness seemed overwhelming this was true in the early years of settlement during the war of independence and in the post war era against great odds america survived grew and developed into the greatest of all nations that ever existed due to the miraculous power of an ever present and loving god robert m riffle was born in 1941 in mcclellandtown pennsylvania he attended the public schools of german township fayette county and he graduated from german township high school in 1959 he received a bachelor of arts in history from waynesburg college now waynesburg university in 1963 he later took graduate courses in history political science and english at west virginia university he taught history for seven years in the albert gallatin area school district in fayette county pennsylvania prior to moving to southern california he taught history and social studies in san diego county for twenty four years and retired from the san diego unified school district he is presently employed by palomar college in san marcos california as a tutor in history political science and economics

berghahn charles maier martin malia and carol gluck together these scholars reveal the unique perspective american historians have brought to the past of their own nation as well as that of the world formerly writing from a conviction that america had a singular destiny american historians have gradually come to share viewpoints of historians in other countries about which they write the result is the virtual disappearance of what was a distinctive american voice that voice is the subject of this book
