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originally published in 1928 and written by journalist daniel venegas las aventuras de don chipote is an unknown classic of american literature dealing with the phenomenon that has made this nation great immigration it is the bittersweet tale of a greenhorn who abandons his plot of land and a shack full of children in mexico to come to the united states and sweep the gold up from the streets together with his faithful companions a tramp named policarpo and a dog called skinenbones don chipote whose name means bump on the head stumbles from one misadventure to another along the way we learn what the southwest was like during the 1920s how mexican laborers were treated like beasts of burden and how they became targets for every shyster and lowlife looking to make a quick buck the author himself a former immigrant laborer spins his tale using the chicano vernacular of the time full of folklore and local color don chipote is a must read for scholars students and all who would become acquainted with the historical and economic roots as well as with the humor of the southwestern hispanic community ethriam cash brammer a young poet and scholar provides a faithful english translation while dr nicolás kanellos offers an accessible well documented introduction to this important novel in 1984

tracing the configuration of the slapstick destitute peladita peladito and the pachuca pachuco depicted in flashy zoot suits from 1928 to 2004 wild tongues is an ambitious extensive examination of social order in mexican and chicana o cultural productions in literature theater film music and performance art from the use of the peladita and the peladito as stock characters who criticized various aspects of the mexican government in the 1920s and 1930s to contemporary performance art by maría elena gaitán and dan guerrero which yields a feminist and queer studies interpretation rita urquijo ruiz emphasizes the transnational capitalism at play in these comic voices her study encompasses both sides of the border including the use of the pachuca and the pachuco as anti establishment marginal figures in the united states the result is a historically grounded interdisciplinary approach that reimagines the limitations of nation centered thinking and reading beginning with daniel venegas s 1928 novel las aventuras de don chipote o cuando los pericos mamen rita urquijo ruiz s wild tongues demonstrates early uses of the peladito to call attention to the brutal physical demands placed

on the undocumented mexican laborer it explores teatro de carpa tent theater in depth as well bringing to light the experience of mexican peladita amelia wilhelmy whose la willy was famous for portraying a cross dressing male soldier who criticizes the failed revolution in numerous other explorations such as these the political economic and social power of creativity continually takes center stage

chicano nations argues that the trans nationalism that is central to chicano identity originated in the global postcolonial moment at the turn of the nineteenth century rather than as an effect of contemporary economic conditions which began in the mid nineteenth century and primarily affected the labouring classes the spanish empire then began to implode and colonists in the new world debated the national contours of the viceroyalties this is where marissa k lopez locates the origins of chicano literature which is now and always has been post national encompassing the wealthy the poor the white and the mestizo tracing the long history of chicano literature and the diversity of subject positions it encompasses chicano nations explores the shifting literary forms authors have used to write the nation from the nineteenth to the twenty first centuries lopez argues that while national and global tensions lie at the historical heart of chicana o narratives of the nation there should be alternative ways to imagine the significance of chicano literature other than as a reflection of national identity in a nuanced analysis the book provides a way to think of early writers as a meaningful part of chicano literary history and in looking at the nation rather than the particularities of identity as that which connects chicano literature over time it engages the emerging hemispheric scholarship on u s literature

josé f aranda jr demonstrates how the burdens of modernity become the dominant discursive logic for understanding why people of mexican descent nonetheless wrote and invested in print culture without any guarantee of its social cultural or political efficacy

this volume of essays is the seventh in the series produced under the auspices of the recovering the u s hispanic literary heritage project at the university of houston this ongoing and comprehensive program seeks to locate identify preserve and disseminate the literary contributions of u s latinos from the spanish colonial period to contemporary times the eleven essays included in this volume examine key issues relevant to the

exploration of hispanic literary production in the united states including cultural identity exile thought class and women s issues originally presented at the ninth biennial conference of the recovery project encuentros y reencuentros making common ground held in in collaboration with the western historical association s annual meeting in 2006 the essays are divided into four sections history culture and ideology women s voices gender politics and culture amparo ruiz de burton literature and history and language representation and translation the work of scholars involved in making available the written record of hispanic populations in the u s is critical for any comprehensive understanding of the u s experience particularly in the west where the country s history is intricately linked with that of hispanic peoples since the sixteenth century in their introduction editors gerald poyo and tomas ybarra frausto outline the goals and challenges of the recovery project to promote scholarly collaboration in the integration of research and recovered hispanic texts in various disciplines including history and latina o studies

they had just crossed the bridge into the united states their feet were now firmly planted on the soil that was their promised land they had made it blessed be the virgin of guadalupe now they had no reason to fear the villistas the carrancistas the government or the revolutionaries here they could find peace work wealth and happiness and so begins the story of the garcia family who like many of their compatriots fled their homeland during the upheaval of the mexican revolution in search of a better life in the united states originally published in 1926 in san antonio texas as el sol de texas the novel chronicles the struggles of two mexican immigrant families the garcias and the quijanos their initial hopes of returning to their homeland with enough money to buy their own piece of land are worn away by the reality of immigrant life unable to speak english they find themselves at the mercy of unscrupulous work contractors and foremen forced to work at backbreaking labor picking cotton in the fields building the burgeoning southwest railroad system and working in gulf coast oil refineries considered the first novel of mexican immigration el sol de texas under the texas sun depicts the diverse experiences of mexican immigrants from those that return to mexico beaten down by the discrimination and hardship they encounter to those who persist in their adopted land in spite of the racism they face the original spanish language text is accompanied by the first ever english translation by ethriam cash

brammer and an introduction by john pluecker publication of this fascinating historical novel will provide unique insight into the long history of mexicanimmigration to the united states and its implications for cultural historical and literary studies

containing roughly 850 entries about spanish language literature throughout the world this expansive work provides coverage of the varied countries ethnicities time periods literary movements and genres of these writings providing a thorough introduction to spanish language literature worldwide and across time is a tall order however world literature in spanish an encyclopedia contains roughly 850 entries on both major and minor authors themes genres and topics of spanish literature from the middle ages to the present day affording an amazingly comprehensive reference collection in a single work this encyclopedia describes the growing diversity within national borders the increasing interdependence among nations and the myriad impacts of spanish literature across the globe all countries that produce literature in spanish in europe africa the americas and asia are represented covering both canonical authors and emerging contemporary writers and trends underrepresented writings such as texts by women writers queer and afro hispanic texts children s literature and works on relevant but less studied topics such as sports and nationalism also appear while writings throughout the centuries are covered those of the 20th and 21st centuries receive special consideration

recovery project comes of age assimilation accommodation or resistance history in literature literature in history writing the revolution and recovering the creation of community

no contemporary development underscores the transnational linkage between the united states and spanish language américa today more than the wave of in migration from spanish language countries during the 1980s and 1990s this development among others has made clear what has always been true that the united states is part of spanish language américa translation and oral communication from spanish to english have been constant phenomena since before the annexation of the mexican southwest in 1848 the expanding number of counter national translations from english to spanish of latinx fictional narratives by mainstream presses between the 1990s and 2010 is an indication of significant change in the relationship a translational turn explores both the historical reality of spanish to english translation and the new counter national english to spanish translation of latinx narratives more than theorizing about translation this book underscores long standing contact such as code mixing and bi multilingualism between the two languages in u s language and culture although some political groups in this country persist in seeing and representing this country as having a single national tongue and community the linguistic ecology of both major cities and the suburban periphery here and in the global world is bilingualism and multilingualism

this historic fourth volume of articles represents the finished re worked product of the biennial conferences of recovery providing theoretical and practical approaches and critical studies on specific texts jose aranda and silvio torres saillant s introduction conceptualizes and unifies a broad historical swath that encompasses the spanish and english language expression of hispanic natives immigrants and exiles from the colonial period to 1960

u s latino literature is defined as latino literature within the united states that embraces the heterogeneous inter groupings of latinos for too long u s latino literature has not been thought of as an integral part of the overall shared american literary landscape but that is slowly changing this dictionary aims to rectify some of those misconceptions by proving that latinos do fundamentally express american issues concerns and perspectives with a flair in linguistic cadences familial themes distinct world views and cross cultural voices the historical dictionary

immigration has been one of the basic realities of life for latino communities in the united states since the nineteenth century it is one of the most important themes in hispanic literature and it has given rise to a specific type of literature while also defining what it means to be hispanic in the united states immigrant literature uses predominantly the language of the homeland it serves a population united by that language irrespective of national origin and it solidifies and furthers national identity the literature of immigration reflects the reasons for emigrating records both orally and in writing the trials and tribulations of immigration and facilitates adjustment to the new society while maintaining links with the old society based on an archive assembled over the past two decades by author nicolás kanellos s recovering the u s hispanic literary heritage project this comprehensive study is one of the first to define this body of work written and recorded by people from mexico cuba puerto rico the caribbean and central and south america the texts presented here reflect the dualities that have characterized the hispanic immigrant experience in the united states since the mid nineteenth century set always against a longing for homeland
