that often obscure the complexities of lived experiences It mirrors the fragmented nature of memory trauma and the ways in which language struggles to capture the full spectrum of human experience The books difficulty is intentional pushing readers to actively engage with its layers and ambiguities prompting them to think critically about the ways we construct meaning and understanding 2 Why is there so much focus on language in Dictee Cha uses language as a primary tool to explore the ways in which power structures colonialism and patriarchy have shaped the experiences of women and marginalized communities She critiques the limitations of language highlighting how it can be used to silence control and erase marginalized voices By challenging the dominant narratives Cha seeks to reclaim language and use it as a force for liberation and selfexpression 3 What is the significance of the dictee format The dictee format a series of pronouncements or dictations emphasizes the authors voice as an act of defiance against the silencing of marginalized voices Cha uses this format to challenge the traditional authorreader relationship blurring the lines between narrator and reader and prompting engagement with the text on a more intimate personal level 4 How does Dictee connect to the experiences of KoreanAmericans Dictee draws heavily on the authors personal experiences as a KoreanAmerican woman It explores themes of cultural assimilation linguistic displacement and the impact of historical trauma on KoreanAmericans Cha highlights the challenges of navigating multiple identities and the feeling of being caught between cultures 5 What are some ways in which Dictee resonates with contemporary readers Dictee remains relevant today due to its exploration of themes that continue to be central to our contemporary world such as gender equality racial justice and the impact of globalized power structures It serves as a powerful reminder of the ongoing struggle for liberation and recognition encouraging readers to critically examine the narratives that shape our world and advocate for a more equitable future 3

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theresa hak kyung cha in black and white explores the relation between text author and reader a nexus theorized as the apparatus in cha s study of cinema by tracing two key literary intertexts in dictée henry james s the jolly corner a submerged literary resonance in apparatus cha s anthology of film theory and the writing of saint thérèse of lisieux a primary intertext at the heart of dictée in cha s film theory black and white is the flicker of the cinematic apparatus and the elements readings consider this contrasting palette in self reflexive portraits in black and white this study reads flashes of identification often in punishing self encounters and it dwells on the figure of the martyr to arrive at the death of theresa hak kyung cha the patron saint of artists and scholars fascinated by her art and her suffering

this autobiographical work is the story of several women deploying a variety of texts documents and imagery these women are united by suffering and the transcendence of suffering

for pleasure argues that aesthetic pleasure and formal experimentalism hold the twinned capacity to maintain a global racial order and also to undo it

eight authors works of personal nonfiction join with ten stories by karen tei

yamashita to illuminate the hidden histories of places large and small faced with a scant historical record karen tei yamashita turns to fiction to animate the secrets of santa cruz the city she s called home for nearly three decades her characters come alive through her signature witty humor and surreal premises transcending the past and urging themselves into the present to illuminate a hidden geography of this california coastal city unseen in textbooks alongside these stories eight nonfiction writers chart their own counternarratives of place through the greater united states diverging and converging in their scale and scope from an unnamed lot on the bank of the ohio river to the territory of guam their essays use language as an instrument of excavation uncovering layers of hurt and desire concealed in the land

examines the diasporic and transnational aspects of asian american literature and engages works of prose and poetry as aesthetic articulations of the fluid transnational identities formed by asian american writers

this book offers gendered postcolonial insights into the poetic and artistic work of four generations of female asian american artists in the san francisco bay area nancy hom betty kano flo oy wong trinh t minh ha theresa h k cha and hung liu are discussed in relation to the cultural politics of their time and their art is examined in light of the question of what it means to be an asian american artist laura fantone s exploration of this dynamic understudied artistic community begets a sensitive and timely reflection on the state of asian american women in the usa and in californian cultural institutions

asian americans have made many significant contributions to industry science politics and the arts at the same time they have made great sacrifices and endured enormous hardships this reference examines autobiographies and memoirs written by asian americans in the twentieth century included are alphabetically arranged entries on 60 major autobiographers of asian descent some of these such as meena alexander and maxine hong kingston are known primarily for their writings others such as daniel k inouye are known largely for other achievements which they have chronicled in their autobiographies each entry is written by an expert contributor and provides a reliable account of the autobiographer s life reviews major autobiographical works and themes including fictionalized autobiographies and autobiographical novels presents a meticulously researched account of the critical reception of these works and closes with a bibliography of primary and secondary sources an introductory essay considers the history and development of autobiography in american literature and culture and discusses issues and themes vital to asian american autobiographies and memoirs such as family diaspora nationhood identity cultural assimilation racial dynamics and the formation of the asian american literary canon the volume closes with a selected bibliography

is late modern art anti aesthetic what does it mean to label a piece of art affectless these traditional characterizations of 1960s and 1970s art are radically challenged in this subversive art history by introducing feeling to the analysis of this period susan best acknowledges the radical and exploratory nature of art in late modernism the book focuses on four highly influential female artists eva hesse lygia clark ana mendieta and theresa hak kyung cha and it explores how their art transformed established avant garde protocols by introducing an affective dimension this aspect of their work while often noted has never before been analyzed in detail visualizing feeling also addresses a methodological blind spot in art history the interpretation of feeling emotion and affect it demonstrates that the affective dimension alongside other materials and methods of art is part of the artistic means of production and innovation this is the first thorough re appraisal of aesthetic engagement with affect in post 1960s art

in racial things racial forms joseph jonghyun jeon focuses on a coterie of underexamined contemporary asian american poets theresa hak kyung cha myung mi kim mei mei berssenbrugge and john yau who reject many of the characteristics of traditional minority writing in the poets various treatments of things that is objects of art one witnesses a confluence of the avant garde interest in objecthood and the racial question of objectification back cover

where are the women writers of color where are their theoretical voices the fifteen contributors to other sisterhoods examine how women writers of color have contributed to the discourse of literary and cultural theory they focus on the impact of key issues such as social construction and identity politics on the works of women writers of color as well as how these women deal with differences relating to gender class race ethnicity and sexuality the book also explores the ways women writers of color have created their own ethnopoetics
