in civilizing the child discourses of race nation and child welfare in america katherine s bullard analyzes the discourse of child welfare advocates who argued for the notion of a racialized ideal child this ideal child limited to white often native born children was at the center of arguments for material support to children and education for their parents this book illuminates important limitations in the progressive approach to social welfare and helps to explain the current dearth of support for poor children civilizing the child tracks the growing social concern with children in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries the author uses seminal figures and institutions to look at the origins of the welfare state chapters focus on charles loring brace jacob riis residents of the hull house settlement and the staff of u s children s bureau analyzing their work to unpack the assumptions about american identity that made certain children belong and others remain outsiders bullard traces the ways in which child welfare advocates used racialized language and emphasized the civilizing mission to argue for support of white native born children this language focused on the future citizenship of some children as an argument for their support and protection

postwar images project the imago of exotica and foreignness on camels as buddhist peace messengers zohar convincingly argues that in the japanese imagination camels serve as signifiers of asia as otherness the opposite of japan s desire for self association with western cultures

the collectivity of life is a study of autobiographical writing and oral histories situated in the late twentieth century united states the central thesis is that by studying how the authors of these narratives articulate space in their stories we can uncover a recurring critique of meritocratic individualism and reconstruct a counter mythology that locates social mobility in collectivist experiences fourteen autobiographical works are studied including those of malcolm x audre lorde barack obama and numerous other from multiple ethnic and several regions of the u s ranging from 1964 through 2008 more than 40 oral histories housed in archives in several regions of the country help to establish the book s goal by using a concept of space this book shifts the focus of personal narrative from the internal resources of the individual to networks of support and collective efforts in the formation of their identities and the basis of their life accomplishments

electricity is more versatile in use because it is a highly ordered form of energy that can be converted efficiently into other forms however the disadvantage of electricity is that it cannot be easily stored on a large scale one of the distinctive characteristics of the electric power sector is that the amount of electricity that can be generated is relatively fixed over short periods of time although demand for electricity fluctuates throughout the day almost all electrical energy used today is consumed as it is generated this poses no hardship in conventional power plants where the fuel consumption is varied with the load requirements however the photovoltaic and wind being intermittent sources of power cannot meet the load demand all of the time wherever intermittent power sources reach high levels of grid penetration energy storage becomes one option to provide reliable energy supplies these devices can help to make renewable energy more smooth and reliable though the power output cannot be controlled by the grid operators they can balance micro grids to achieve a good match between generation and load demand which can further regulate the voltage and frequency also it can significantly improve the load availability a key requirement for any power system the energy storage therefore is a desired feature to incorporate with renewable power systems particularly in stand alone power plants the purpose of this book is twofold at first for the interested researcher it shows the importance of different energy storage devices but secondly and more importantly it forms a first attempt at dissemination of knowledge to the wider non expert community who may wish to consider energy storage device for specific application thus this book will be helpful to provide an indication of the tools necessary for an assessment to be made energy storage device more powerful
