give me liberty an american history is a concise clear and inclusive narrative of american history written by distinguished historian eric foner

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the racist legacy behind the western idea of freedom the era of the enlightenment which gave rise to our modern conceptions of freedom and democracy was also the height of the trans atlantic slave trade america a nation founded on the principle of liberty is also a nation built on african slavery native american genocide and systematic racial discrimination white freedom traces the complex relationship between freedom and race from the eighteenth century to today revealing how being free has meant being white tyler stovall explores the intertwined histories of racism and freedom in france and the united states the two leading nations that have claimed liberty as the heart of their national identities he explores how french and american thinkers defined freedom in racial terms and conceived of liberty as an aspect and privilege of whiteness he discusses how the statue of liberty a gift from france to the united states and perhaps the most famous symbol of freedom on earth promised both freedom and whiteness to european immigrants taking readers from the age of revolution to today stovall challenges the notion that racism is somehow a paradox or contradiction within the democratic tradition demonstrating how white identity is intrinsic to western ideas about liberty throughout the history of modern western liberal democracy freedom has long been white freedom a major work of scholarship that is certain to draw a wide readership and transform contemporary debates white freedom provides vital

new perspectives on the inherent racism behind our most cherished beliefs about freedom liberty and human rights

this book examines the many ways in which african americans made the civil war about ending slavery abraham lincoln's primary goal was to save the union rather than to absolve the institution of slavery yet slaves who escaped to union lines refused to fight for the union while remaining enslaved ultimately forcing lincoln to disband the institution

no introductory work of american history has had more influence over the past forty years than howard zinn's *A People's History of the United States* which since its publication in 1980 has sold more than three million copies zinn's iconoclastic critique of american militarism racism and capitalism has drawn bitter criticism from the right most recently from president donald trump who at his white house conference on american history in 2020 denounced zinn as a left propagandist and accused teachers aligned with zinn of indoctrinating students to hate america and be ashamed of its history *Rethinking America's Past* is the first work to use archival and classroom evidence to assess the impact that zinn's classic work has had on historical teaching and learning and on american culture this evidence refutes trump's charges showing that rather than indoctrinating students zinn's book has been used by teachers to have students debate and rethink conventional versions of american history *Rethinking America's Past* also explores the ways zinn's work fostered deeper more critical renderings of the american past in movies and on stage and television and traces the origins and assesses the strengths and weaknesses of *A People's History* in light of more recent historical scholarship

in *People Must Live by Work* Steven Attewell presents the history of an idea direct job creation that transformed the role of government in ameliorating unemployment by hiring the unemployed en masse to prevent widespread destitution in economic crises for ten years between 1933 and 1943 direct job creation was put into practice employing more than eight million Americans and making the federal government the largest single employer in the country yet in 2008 when the most dramatic economic crisis since the depression occurred the idea of direct job creation was nowhere to be found on the list of policies deemed feasible or advisable for government at any level *People Must Live by Work* traces the rise and fall of direct job creation policy how it was put into practice how it came within a hairbreadth of becoming a permanent feature of American economic and social administration and why it has been largely forgotten or discounted today contrary to more conventional arguments Attewell reveals that the New Deal ended the Great Depression before the United States entered World War II and its jobs programs continued to influence policy debates over the Employment Act of 1946 he examines the deliberations surrounding the Humphrey-Hawkins Full Employment Act that was signed into law in 1978 and demonstrates the ways in which direct job creation played a significant and polarizing role in dividing the economic establishment and the Democratic Party in the 1970s *People Must Live by Work* not only chronicles the ambition constraints and achievements of direct job creation policy in the past but also proposes a framework for understanding its enduring significance and promise for today

american slavery atlantic slavery and beyond provides an up to date summary of past and present views of american slavery in international perspective and suggests new directions for current and future comparative scholarship it argues that we can better understand the nature and meaning of american slavery and antislavery if we place them clearly within a euro american context current scholarship on american slavery acknowledges the importance of the continental and atlantic dimensions of the historical phenomenon comparing it often with slavery in the caribbean and latin america however since the 1980s a handful of studies has looked further and has compared american slavery with european forms of unfree and nominally free labor building on this innovative scholarship this book treats the u s peculiar institution as part of both an atlantic and a wider euro american world it shows how the euro american context is no less crucial than the atlantic one in understanding colonial slavery and the american revolution in an age of global enlightenment reformism and revolutionary upheavals the cotton kingdom s heyday in a world of systems of unfree labor and the making of radical abolitionism and the occurrence of the american civil war at a time when nationalist ideologies and nation building movements were widespread

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
