chitarra e una bibbia le persone a lui pi vicine sapevano che questi erano i due oggetti da cui non si separava mai e che gli erano pi cari questo ebook un piccolo contributo per riportare alla luce una dimensione fondamentale della vita e dellarte di bob marley rimasta fino ad oggi troppo nellombra
