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history for students each book presents information in two sections in the first part titles are listed according to grade levels within eras and further organized according to product type the books cover american history from north america before 1600 and the american colonies 1600 1774 to the mid twentieth century 1946 1975 and since 1975 the second section has annotated bibliographies that describe each title and includes publication information and awards won the focus is on books published since 1990 and all have received at least one favorable review some books with more illustration than text will be valuable for enticing slow or reticent readers an index helps users find resources by author title or biographical subject

between the time of the settling of jamestown and the trail of tears in the 1830 s thousands of american indians were induced to cede their lands to european settlers and move westward this book with the aid of maps and pictures relies primarily on the words of those involved to provide an historical accounting of the forced relocations presidential policies are examined as well as the various ways in which the indians attempted to maintain their cultural identity during these upheavals cultural and community splits within the creek cherokee and seminole nations are also explored in detail

the history of the modern united states is the history of coal and of coal miners trish kahle reveals miners as forgers of a coal fired social contract that was contested throughout the twentieth century as americans sought to define the meaning of citizenship in an energy intensive democracy energy citizenship traces the uncertain relationship between coal and democracy from the progressive era to the election of ronald reagan examining how miners democratic aspirations confronted the deadly record of the country s coal mines miners and their communities bore the burdens of energy production while reaping far fewer of the benefits of energy consumption but they insisted that death in the mines far from being inevitable was a political choice kahle demonstrates that coal miners struggles to democratize the workplace secure civil and social rights and obtain restitution for the human toll of progress reshaped u s laws regulatory administrations and political imaginaries energy policy in the twentieth century was about not only managing fuels but also negotiating the relationship between coal miners and the rest of the country which depended on the electric power and steel produced with the coal they mined placing coal miners at the center of a sweeping new history of the united states this book unmask the violence of energy systems and shows how energy governance cuts to the heart of persistent questions about democracy justice and equality

between the settlement of the pilgrims in new england in 1620 and the 1850s native indians were forced to move west of the mississippi river in the process they surrendered mainly reluctantly their claims to 412 000 square miles of land east of the mississippi river and north of the ohio river and the mason dixon line relying on the words of those involved and pertinent documents this study gives insight into the thoughts and attitudes of those demanding the movement and the efforts of the indians to remain the changes in governmental policies that came about as a result of the revolutionary war are noted as is the incremental weakening of the indians as the avalanche of settlers moved west attention is given to the policies of george washington and his secretary

this book examines text books used in english and american schools and determines the way in which national bias has been instilled into school children by the use of history books this study reveals that the deliberate distortion common a generation ago has disappeared but has been displaced by a more subtle form of bias that is more dangerous because it is less easily recognised it deals in particular with the treatment of the american war of independence the war of 1812 and world war i the report contains positive suggestions to authors and publishers designed to eliminate all bias and to help them achieve historical objectivity
