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named one of the best books of 2017 by the philadelphia inquirer all hell breaks loose in the liberal bubble when a mother s life spirals out of control when she s forced to rethink her bleeding heart ideals for karen kipple it isn t enough that she works full time in the nonprofit sector for an organization that helps children from disadvantaged homes she s also determined to live her personal life in accordance with her ideals this means sending her daughter ruby to an integrated public school in their brooklyn neighborhood but when a troubled student from a nearby housing project begins bullying children in ruby s class the distant social and economic issues karen has always claimed to care about so passionately begin to feel uncomfortably close to home a daring discussable satire about gentrification and liberal hypocrisy class is also a smartly written story that reveals how life as we live it not as we like to imagine it often unfolds in gray areas

it has been more than sixty years since anyone called author ron gabriel sonny the nickname was bestowed upon him back in delaware ohio and it carried through the 1940s and 50s back then

sonny was a carefree kid who spent his days running around the neighborhood with his buddies getting into the occasional scuffle and scrape six decades later how things have changed sonny is the true account of a young man who lived out his days in the midwest back then there was no such thing as little league the kids made their own games instead running and playing as they chose as sonny grew up so did his interests he bought his first car for forty dollars and nicknamed it the green spleen he met the love of his life and became a husband and father and eventually a grandfather intended to entertain amuse and inform sonny offers a detailed recording of how the world once was before the existence of cell phones and the internet gabriel played witness to several events in history but he also created his own history as a grandfather and an ohio state fan take a step back to another time when things were more innocent people moved a bit slower and young sonny dreamed of an unknown future

established in 1955 by home builder and entrepreneur jack hoffman and incorporated in 1959 the village of hoffman estates has flourished into one of the largest suburbs in northeast illinois in this commemorative history celebrating fifty years of the village cheryl lemus uncovers the unique character and spirit that emerged as hoffman estates grew from an isolated farmland where residents woke to the sounds of cows mooing into a modern vibrant suburb with a strong business and residential community what started out as a typical neighborhood development has today blossomed into an atypical suburb defying stereotypical expectations and conventions

for the past five years american public schools have enrolled more students identified as black latinx american indian and asian than white at the same time more than half of us school children now qualify for federally subsidized meals a marker of poverty the makeup of schools is rapidly changing and many districts and school boards are at a loss as to how they can effectively and equitably handle these shifts suddenly diverse is an ethnographic account of two school districts in the midwest responding to rapidly changing demographics at their schools it is based on observations and in depth interviews with school board members and superintendents as well as staff community members and other stakeholders in each district one serving lakeside a predominately working class conservative community and the other serving fairview a more affluent liberal community erica o turner looks at district leaders adoption of business inspired policy tools and the ultimate successes and failures of such responses turner s findings demonstrate that despite their intentions to promote diversity or eliminate achievement gaps district leaders adopted policies and practices that ultimately perpetuated existing inequalities and advanced new forms of racism while suggesting some ways forward suddenly diverse shows that without changes to these managerial policies and practices and larger transformations to the whole system even district leaders best efforts will continue to undermine the promise of educational equity and the realization of more robust public schools

dr art schatz has been deeply involved with animals since he was born during his childhood in rural canada his family had no local veterinarians nearby so he learned to tend to the farm animals and turned that passion into a career after veterinary college dr schatz entered a career primarily with large animals life is not a straight path and dr schatz s is no exception after developing an insidious illness he took a side path from his veterinary career into teaching it was here that he gained his nickname dr danger from one of his students for his ability to deal with potentially dangerous large animals dr danger is a memoir about our big animal companions on farms and one of the many people who look after them between stories of his life are thoughts about the veterinary profession as it has developed in canada and a broader examination of food systems both human and animal

southern homes and plan books showcases the architectural legacy and design philosophy of leila ross wilburn 1885 1967 a legacy that includes hundreds of houses in a variety of popular house styles from bungalows to ranch houses built using wilburn s plan books during the first six decades of the twentieth century wilburn opened her own firm in atlanta in 1908 and practiced until her death in 1967 she published nine plan books that offered mail order house designs to contractors builders and prospective homeowners and allowed them the ease of choosing a preconceived design and construction plan sarah j boykin and susan m hunter provide a survey of the southern homes built from wilburn s plan books examining wilburn s architectural legacy and her achievements as a plan book architect the book provides beautiful photographs of houses built from her plans along with illustrations from the plan books themselves and other related documents from the time readers can thus see how her designs were realized as individual houses and also how they influenced the development of some of the atlanta area s beloved historical neighborhoods most notably druid hills morningside virginia highland and candler park as well as the mcdonough adams kings highway mak historic district in decatur today wilburn s houses are enjoyed as appealing historic homes and represent some of the richest examples of southern vernacular architecture to emerge from the plan book tradition

my relationship with sam bronfman and his sons edgar and charles has sometimes been compared to that of robert duvall as tom hagen the consigliere to the corleone family in the godfather in the sense that i was a surrogate son as well as an adviser to the father and a friend as well as a counsellor to the sons there s a certain amount of truth to that in that i was brought into the family as an outsider and became privy to its secrets thus begins leo kolber s account written with l ian macdonald of his remarkable relationship with the bronfman dynasty from the founding father to his sons and eventually to the dissolution of a great business empire for thirty years leo kolber was chairman of cemp investments the bronfman family trust and cadillac fairview corporation one of the largest real estate firms in north america a close adviser to the legendary sam bronfman and a close friend of his sons charles and edgar kolber was the family s consigliere on decades of deals including the buying of mgm in the 1960s which foretold the disaster that later overtook the third generation of bronfmans after edgar bronfman jr bought sold seagram s 25 percent interest in dupont to buy mca universal studios in 1995 a deal kolber strongly opposed with the vivendi merger of 2000 the empire built by mr sam and his sons with leo kolber s help was dismantled buying dupont was the deal of the century kolber writes selling it was the dumbest deal of the century as for the vivendi merger and the break up of seagram he writes that no one would have dared propose it to mr sam except perhaps over his dead body named to the senate by pierre Trudeau kolber has served there for twenty years including the last five as chairman of the senate banking committee throughout this period he was a senior bagman for the liberal party of Canada formerly chairman of claridge inc charles bronfman s investment holding company kolber also served for more than twenty five years as a director of seagram and the Toronto Dominion Bank whose famous headquarters the Six Tower TD Centre was built by his fairview corporation in the 1960s formerly chairman of cineplex odeon theatres he was also as a longtime director of dupont and mgm among other companies in which the

bronfmans once held an important interest now kolber is publishing this memoir of a life that he calls a tremendous ride with business tycoons from sam bronfman and charles bronfman to kirk kerkorian with famous politicians from pierre trudeau to brian mulroney and jean chretien with hollywood moguls and nights out with the stars from danny kaye and cary grant to frank sinatra

in seattle s women teachers of the interwar years doris pieroth describes the contributions of a remarkable group of women who dominated the seattle public school system in the early years of the twentieth century and helped to produce well educated citizens who were responsible for the widespread philanthropic volunteer and municipal activities that came to characterize the city while most publications on the history of education have emphasized theory or administration pieroth focuses on individual teachers set against the backdrop of a developing city the book provides vivid portraits of educated strong ambitious women making successful careers at a time when job opportunities for women were very limited pieroth interviewed as many of these women as she could find and quotes from the interviews enhance her lively well written narrative using details drawn from local newspapers and school publications she demonstrates that the influence of this cohort of women made modern seattle the livable place that it remains today seattle s women teachers of the interwar years is a significant contribution to the history of seattle and the region to women s history and to the history of education

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
