i think i shall be among the english poets after my death john keats soberly prophesied in 1818 as he started writing the blankverse epic hyperion today he endures as the archetypal romantic genius who explored the limits of the imagination and celebrated the pleasures of the senses but suffered a tragic early death edmund wilson counted him as one of the half dozen greatest english writers and t s eliot has paid tribute to the shakespearean quality of keats s greatness indeed his work has survived better than that of any of his contemporaries the devaluation of romantic poetry that began early in this century this modern library edition contains all of keats s magnificent verse lamia isabella and the eve of st agnes his sonnets and odes the allegorical romance endymion and the five act poetic tragedy otho the great presented as well are the famous posthumous and fugitive poems including the fragmentary the eve of saint mark and the great la belle dame sans merci perhaps the most distinguished literary ballad in the language no one else in english poetry save shakespeare has in expression quite the fascinating felicity of keats his perception of loveliness said matthew arnold in the faculty of naturalistic interpretation in what we call natural magic he ranks with shakespeare

composition dates identifying quotations and allusions in the notes and referring readers to the best critical interpretations of the poems the introduction provides central facts about Keats' life and describes the themes of his best work

this authoritative edition was originally published in the acclaimed Oxford Authors series under the general editorship of Frank Kermode it brings together a unique combination of Keats' poetry and prose all the major poems complemented by a generous selection of Keats' letters to give the essence of his work and thinking in his tragically short life Keats wrote an astonishing number of superb poems his stature as one of the foremost poets of the Romantic movement remains unassailable this volume contains all the poetry published during his lifetime including *Endymion* in its entirety the odes *Lamia* and both versions of *Hyperion* the poetry is presented in chronological order illustrating the staggering speed with which Keats' work matured further insight into his creative process is given by reproducing in their original form a number of poems that were published posthumously Keats' letters are admired almost as much as his poetry and were described by T. S. Eliot as certainly the most notable and most important ever written by any English poet they provide the best biographical detail available and shed invaluable light on Keats' poems

a reassessment of the historical dimension of Keats' poetry that addresses the influence on his work of the immediate post-Waterloo period and traces his source materials a new reading of Keats' major poems is presented as well as of many less studied pieces

although his poems were not generally well received by critics during his lifetime his reputation grew after his death and by the end of the 19th century he had become one of the most beloved of all English poets he

had a significant influence on a diverse range of poets and writers jorge luis borges stated that his first encounter with keats s work was the most significant literary experience of his life the poetry of keats is characterised by sensual imagery most notably in the series of odes this is typical of romantic poets as they aimed to accentuate extreme emotion through the emphasis of natural imagery today his poems and letters are some of the most popular and most analysed in english literature some of the most acclaimed works of keats are i stood tip toe upon a little hill sleep and poetry and the famous sonnet on first looking into chapman s homer

keats is celebrated as a writer in three forms lyric verse narrative verse and letters all three are represented here in a volume which reprints all the famous odes a selection os sonnets and other short poems both versions of hyperion extentsive selections from endymion and the complete isabella lamia and the eve of st agnes finally there are letters in which keats discusses his attitude to poetry and to other poets

john keats was one of the major english romantic poets whose peers included lord byron and percy bysshe shelley keats poetry was not popular during his lifetime but his reputation grew greatly after his death and he is now one of england s most loved poets keats poetry is easily distinguished for its sensual imagery and its use of odes this is a collection of poems that keats wrote in 1820

the book female voices in keats s poetry studies some major women figures in john keats s poetry in the light of recent criticism of sexual ambiguity in keats sexual ambiguity as scholars have discussed refers to the sexual identity or fragmented poetic self as reflected in john keats s verse it examines some central women characters of keatsian verse in the light of this dual strand first as to how far these women figures are projections of keats s own poetic self and secondly what do they reveal as regards attitudes of a male poet towards women a study of these women figures provides interesting observations on feminine projections besides trying to correlate the shaping of these attitudes with the psychological and biographical strands of the poet s life the study of keatsian verse complicates the issue of gender has already been highlighted by recent criticism the book examines the female characters in his poetry in the light of deeper conflicts complexities and confusions within keats s own poetic self
