in 1983 the seminal report issued by the national commission on excellence in education a nation at risk charged that most american high schoolers were following a general course of instruction choosing neither the college preparatory track nor the vocational option this pattern the report complained had fostered low expectations and a curricular hodge podge of classes that failed to prepare students for college or work the commission called on states to implement academic requirements for all students regardless of background including four years of english and three years each of science
