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this book explores philosophical ethics in arabo islamic thought examining the meaning origin and development of divine command theory it underscores the philosophical bases of religious fundamentalism that hinder social development and hamper dialogue between different cultures and nations challenging traditional stereotypes of islam the book refutes contemporary claims that islam is a defining case of ethical voluntarism and that the prominent theory in islamic ethical thought is divine command theory the author argues that in fact early arab islamic scholars articulated moral theories theories of value and theories of obligation she traces the development of arabo islamic ethics from the early islamic theological and political debates between the kharijites and the murji ites shedding new light on the moral theory of abd al jabbar al mu tazili and the effects of this moral theory on post mu tazilite ethical thought highlighting important aspects in the development of islamic thought this book will appeal to students and scholars of islamic moral thought and ethics islamic law and religious fundamentalism

a study of modern muslim ethics focused upon the lives and writings of sayyid ahmad khan and mawlana mawdudi this book sheds light upon the modern ethical problems of contemporary islam sayyid ahmad khan often called a liberal a modernist or an acculturationist represents the liberal trend of sunni muslim ethics khan s approach borrows much from reason but for khan reason and revelation are not in conflict reason guides the interpretation of islam when revelation is insufficient in contrast mawlana mawdudi s fundamentalism is at least in part anti-rational it depends upon revelation as it comes to one man in particular and is very autocratic medonough is concerned with khan and mawdudi both writers within the indo pakistan muslim tradition their conflicting views their differing interpretations of ethics that suit islam in the contemporary world exemplify the difficulties and turmoil faced by muslims the world over for these men modernity has not spelled the end of islam yet each has found a different way of relating islam to the present and the future in faithfulness to traditional islam this book will be of interest to students of contemporary islam

as well as to those interested in questions of comparative ethics for the liberal fundamentalist conflicts outlined in this monograph are analogous to manifestations of the same dichotomy in all world religions

analyzing pre modern writings on islamic legal theory this book comprehensively presents the transformation of the concept of ma la a as a vehicle of legal change from a minor legal principle to being understood as the all encompassing purpose of god s law

moral rationalism and shar a is the first attempt at outlining the scope for a theological reading of shar a based on a critical examination of why adliyya theological ethics have not significantly impacted sh readings of shar within sh works of shar a legal theory us 1 al figh there is a theoretical space for reason as an independent source of normativity alongside the qur and the prophetic tradition the position holds that humans are capable of understanding moral values independently of revelation describing themselves as adliyya literally the people of justice this allows the sh a who describe themselves as adilivya literally the people of justice to attribute a substantive rational conception of justice to god both in terms of his actions and his regulative instructions despite the sh adoption of this moral rationalism independent judgments of rational morality play little or no role in the actual inference of shar a norms within mainstream contemporary sh through a close examination of the notion of independent rationality as a source in modern sh us 1 al figh the obstacles preventing this moral rationalism from impacting the understanding of shar a are shown to be purely epistemic in line with the emic insider approach adopted these epistemic obstacles are revisited identifying the scope for allowing a reading of shar consistent with the fundamental moral rationalism of sh thought it is argued that judgments of rational morality even when not definitively certain cannot be ignored in the face of the apparent meaning of texts that are themselves also not certain an adliyya reading of shar a demands that the strength of independent rational evidence be reconciled against the strength of any other apparently conflicting evidence such that independent judgments of rational morality act as a condition for the validity of precepts attributed to a just and moral god

leirvik puts forward a discussion of how the notion of conscience may unite muslim and christians across religious divides as well as examining the relation between selfhood and otherness in interfaith dialogue
