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in smoldering ashes charles f walker interprets the end of spanish domination in peru and that country s shaky transition to an autonomous republican state placing the indigenous population at the center of his analysis walker shows how the indian peasants played a crucial and previously unacknowledged role in the battle against colonialism and in the political clashes of the early republican period with its focus on cuzco the former capital of the inca empire smoldering ashes highlights the promises and frustrations of a critical period whose long shadow remains cast on modern peru peru s indian majority and non indian elite were both opposed to spanish rule and both groups participated in uprisings during the late colonial period but at the same time seething tensions between the two groups were evident and non indians feared a mass uprising as walker shows this internal conflict shaped the many struggles to come including the tupac amaru uprising and other indian based rebellions the long war of independence the caudillo civil wars and the peru bolivian confederation smoldering ashes not only reinterprets these conflicts but also examines the debates that took place in the courts in the press in taverns and even during public festivities over the place of indians in the republic in clear and elegant prose walker explores why the fate of the indigenous population despite its participation in decades of anticolonial battles was little improved by republican rule as indians were denied citizenship in the new nation an unhappy legacy with which peru still grapples informed by the notion of political culture and grounded in walker s archival research and knowledge of peruvian and latin american history smoldering ashes will be essential reading for experts in andean history as well as scholars and students in the fields of nationalism peasant and native american studies colonialism and postcolonialism and state formation

the oxford handbook of the incas aims to be the first comprehensive book on the inca the largest empire in the pre columbian world using archaeology ethnohistory and art history the central goal of this handbook is to bring together recent research conducted by experts from different fields that study the inca empire from its origins and expansion to its demise and continuing influence in contemporary times

charles walker examines the largest rebellion in the history of spain s american empire led by latin america s most iconic revolutionary tupac amaru and his wife it began in 1780 as a multiclass alliance against european born usurpers but degenerated into a vicious caste war leaving a legacy that still influences south american politics today

traditional histories of north and south america often leave the impression that native american peoples had little impact on the colonies and empires established by europeans after 1492 this groundbreaking study which spans more than 300 years demonstrates the agency of indigenous peoples in forging their own history and that of the western hemisphere by putting the story of the indigenous peoples and their encounters with europeans at the center a new history of the new world emerges in which the native americans become vibrant and vitally important components of the british french spanish and portuguese empires in fact their presence was the single most important factor in the development of the colonial world by discussing the great encounter of peoples and cultures this book provides a valuable new perspective on the history of the americas

latin american colonial history looking at spanish indigenous relations

the modern world began with the clash of civilisations between spaniards and native americans their interplay and struggles ever since are mirrored in the fates of the very languages they spoke the conquistadors wrought theirs into a new world language yet the andes still host the new world s greatest linguistic survivor quechua historians and linguists see this through different but complementary perspectives this book is a meeting of minds long overdue to weave them together it ranges from inca collapse to the impacts of colonial rule reform independence and the modern day trends that so threaten native language here with its ultimate demise

this detailed volume offers an unprecedented exploration of incendiary conditions that stoked the great rebellion of 1780 1782 in upper peru bolivia that revolt claimed tens of thousands of lives and traumatized imperial psyches for decades to come it was in effect one of the most devastating political and human disasters in latin american colonial history using extensive archival research nicholas robins delves into the fractious relations between indian communities and their clergy and the role that such tensions played as a major causal factor of the rebellion among the grievous economic and social issues were the use of forced indian labor land encroachment colonial relations with native leaders and collection of indian tithes and first fruits powerful case histories offer rare insights into the daily exercise of power in colonial andean villages compelling archival evidence provides a riveting portrait of clerical abuse in rural villages and reveals how indian peoples challenged and resisted ruling powers with varying degrees of success robins substantial documentation is enriched by a wealth of often colorful detail making it an excellent choice for studies in colonial latin american history and indigenous latin american communities

based on cutting edge research these 12 essays examine connections between race and national identity in latin america and the caribbean in the post independence era they reveal how notions of race and nationhood have varied over time and across the region s political landscapes

the contributors to new countries examine how eight newly independent nations in the western hemisphere between 1750 and 1870 played fundamental roles in the global transformation from commercial to industrial capitalism

portrays the three indigenous rebellions that threatened spanish control of its south american colonies more than a quarter century before the wars of independence 1808 1825 this collection includes maps a chronology of the rebellions and a glossary of terms

from 1980 to 1992 maoist shining path rebels peruvian state forces and andean peasants waged a bitter civil war that left some 69 000 people dead using archival research and oral interviews before the shining path is the first long term historical examination of the shining path s political economic and social antecedents in ayacucho the department where the shining path initiated its war this study uncovers rural ayacucho s vibrant but largely unstudied twentieth century political history and contends that the shining path was the last and most extreme of a series of radical political movements that indigenous peasants pursued the shining path s violence against rural indigenous populations exposed the tight hold of anti indian prejudice inside peru as rebels reproduced the same hatreds they aimed to defeat but this was nothing new heilman reveals that minute divides inside rural indigenous communities repeatedly led to violent conflict across the twentieth century

a troubled marriage describes the lives of native leaders whose resilience and creativity allowed them to survive and prosper in the traumatic era of european conquest and colonial rule they served as soldiers scholars artists artisans and missionaries within early transatlantic empires and later nation states these indian and mestizo men and women wove together cultures shaping the new traditions and institutions of the colonial americas in a comparative study that spans more than three centuries and much of the western hemisphere mckenroe challenges common assumptions about the relationships among victors vanquished and their shared progeny

the role of the religious specialist in andean cultures of the sixteenth seventeenth and eighteenth centuries was a complicated one balanced between local traditions and the culture of the spanish in the power of huacas claudia brosseder reconstructs the dynamic interaction between religious specialists and the colonial world that unfolded around them considering how the discourse about religion shifted on both sides of the spanish and andean relationship in complex and unexpected ways in the power of huacas brosseder examines evidence of transcultural exchange through religious history anthropology and cultural studies taking andean religious specialists or hechizeros sorcerers in colonial spanish terminology as a starting point she considers the different ways in which andeans and spaniards thought about key cultural and religious concepts unlike previous studies this important book fully outlines both sides of the colonial relationship brosseder uses extensive archival research in bolivia chile ecuador peru spain italy and the united states as well as careful analysis of archaeological and art historical objects to present the andean religious worldview of the period on equal footing with that of the spanish throughout the colonial period she argues andean religious specialists retained their own unique logic which encompassed specific ideas about holiness nature sickness and social harmony the power of huacas deepens our understanding of the complexities of assimilation showing that within the maelstrom of transcultural exchange in the spanish americas european paradigms ultimately changed more than andean ones

exploring peru's lively music industry and the studio producers radio djs and program directors that drive it gentleman troubadours and andean pop stars is a fascinating account of the deliberate development of artistic taste focusing on popular huayno music and the ways it has been promoted to peru's emerging middle class joshua tucker tells a complex story of identity making and the marketing forces entangled with it providing crucial insights into the dynamics among art class and ethnicity that reach far beyond the andes tucker focuses on the music of ayacucho peru examining how media workers and intellectuals there transformed the city's huayno music into the country's most popular style by marketing contemporary huayno against its traditional counterpart these agents tucker argues have paradoxically reinforced ethnic hierarchies at the same time that they have challenged them navigating between a burgeoning andean bourgeoisie and a music industry eager to sell them symbols of newfound sophistication gentleman troubadours and andean pop stars is a deep account of the real people behind cultural change

this book investigates three indian revolts in the americas the 1680 uprising of the pueblo indians against the spanish the great rebellion in bolivia 1780-82 and the caste war of yucatan that began in 1849 and was not finally crushed until 1903 nicholas a. robins examines their causes course nature leadership and goals he finds common features they were revitalization movements that were both millenarian and exterminatory in their means and objectives they sought to restore native rule and traditions to their societies and they were movements born of despair and oppression that were sustained by the belief that they would witness the dawning of a new age his work underscores the link that may be found but is not inherent between genocide millennialism and revitalization movements in latin america during the colonial and early national periods

the one source that sets reference collections on latin american studies apart from all other geographic areas of the world the handbook has provided scholars interested in latin america with a bibliographical source of a quality unavailable to scholars in most other branches of area studies latin american research review beginning with volume 41 1979 the university of texas press became the publisher of the handbook of latin american studies the most comprehensive annual bibliography in the field compiled by the hispanic division of the library of congress and annotated by a corps of more than 130 specialists in various disciplines the handbook alternates from year to year between social sciences and humanities the handbook annotates works on mexico central america the caribbean and the guianas spanish south america and brazil as well as materials covering latin america as a whole most of the subsections are preceded by introductory essays that serve as biannual evaluations of the literature and research under way in specialized areas the handbook of latin american studies is the oldest continuing reference work in the field lawrence boudon of the library of congress hispanic division has been the editor since 2001 and katherine d. mccann has been assistant editor since 2000 the subject categories for volume 59 are as follows anthropology economics geography government and politics international relations sociology electronic resources for the social sciences

andrés canchí became the cacique or indigenous leader of cenotillo yucatán in january 1834 by his retirement in 1864 he had become an expert politician balancing powerful local alliances with his community's interests as early national yucatán underwent major political and social shifts in maya caciques in early national yucatán rajeshwari dutt uses canchí's story as a compelling microhistory to open a new perspective on the role of the cacique in post-independence yucatán in most of the literature on yucatán caciques are seen as remnants of spanish colonial rule intermediaries whose importance declined over the early national period dutt instead shows that at the individual level caciques became more politicized and in some cases gained power rather than focusing on the rebellion and violence that inform most scholarship on post-independence yucatán dutt traces the more quotidian ways in which figures like canchí held onto power in the process she presents an alternative perspective on a tumultuous period in yucatán's history a view that emphasizes negotiation and alliance making at the local level at the same time dutt's exploration of the caciques' life stories reveals a larger narrative about the emergence evolution and normalization of particular forms of national political conduct in the decades following independence over time caciques fashioned a new political repertoire forming strategic local alliances with villagers priests spanish and creole officials and other caciques as state policies made political participation increasingly difficult maya caciques turned clientelism or the use of patronage relationships into the new modus operandi of local politics dutt's engaging

exploration of the life and career of andr s canch  and of his fellow maya caciques illuminates the realities of politics in yucat n revealing that seemingly ordinary political relationships were carefully negotiated by indigenous leaders theirs is a story not of failure and decline but of survival and empowerment

in a pioneering study of childhood in colonial spanish america bianca premo examines the lives of youths in the homes schools and institutions of the capital city of lima peru situating these young lives within the framework of law and intellectual history from 1650 to 1820 premo brings to light the colonial politics of childhood and challenges readers to view patriarchy as a system of power based on age caste and social class as much as gender although spanish laws endowed elite men with an authority over children that mirrored and reinforced the monarch s legitimacy as a colonial father king premo finds that in practice lima s young often grew up in the care of adults such as women and slaves who were subject to the patriarchal authority of others during the bourbon reforms city inhabitants of all castes and classes began to practice a new politics of the child challenging men and masters by employing enlightenment principles of childhood thus the social transformations and political dislocations of the late eighteenth century occurred not only in elite circles and royal palaces premo concludes but also in the humble households of a colonial city

a premier volume in oxford s pivotal moments in world history series americanos offers an engagingly written compact history of the latin american wars of independence proceeding almost cinematically scene by vivid scene john charles chasteen introduces the reader to lead players basic concepts key events and dominant trends braided together in a single taut narrative he vividly depicts the individuals and events of those tumultuous years capturing the gathering forces for independence the clashes of troops and decisions of leaders and the rich elaborate tapestry of latin american societies as they embraced nationhood

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
