comprehensive and up to date the first contemporary publication to go beyond examining broad themes and trends in the field this timely volume looks closely at specific authors and texts the book is comprehensive and as current as possible covering works by african american authors for young adults published between 1968 1993 some 200 titles by close to 50 writers in addition to established authors and bestselling titles the coverage includes material overlooked by previous studies such as works from small presses and talented new authors guidelines for evaluation an extensive introduction reviews important milestones in this body of literature and analyzes noteworthy bibliographical and critical publications about such writing it includes suggested guidelines for evaluating a work in terms of its direct and indirect treatment of such issues as race gender class ability age sexuality and sexual orientation the book also offers specific guidance for determining the appropriate readership for a work with regard to age and gender unusually extensive annotations the main body of the book is an annotated bibliography alphabetical by author with the works arranged chronologically by publication date the annotations are much more extensive than those in other bibliographies each annotation reads more like a full length book review and is from one to two pages long and explores themes plot and character development evaluates the quality of the writing judges the handling of issues of race class and gender and provides a readership recommendation written in accessible language this user friendly book presents a wide range of factual information evaluations and analyses it is a valuable tool for all teachers librarians counselors and young adults

walter dean myers preeminent author of teen fiction biography and verse refines the image of black characters that are frequently trivialized or vilified in juvenile literature advertising television and film from his saga the glory field to his novel the young landlords myers s canon surveys the complex realm of the teen years as colliding settings in home school and the street this volume introduces readers to both the writer and his work with an emphasis on the characters dates events motifs and themes from the books myers s 101 a to z entries offer concise analytical discussion on all topics and include generous citations from primary and secondary sources each entry concludes with a selected bibliography on such subjects as segregation malcolm x urbanism writing metafiction drugs and alcohol slavery and the vietnam war appendices offer a timeline of historical events in myers s writings and forty topics for group or individual projects oral analysis background material and theme development a map of harlem where many of the stories are set genealogical diagrams for characters and an author chronology contribute to a comprehensive presentation

multicultural fiction is an essential part of the american literary landscape this reference helps scholars teachers and librarians choose significant texts from both the past and present and provides guidance in approaching multicultural issues as they are discussed in fiction for young adults included are entries for 51 writers some of whom have nearly been forgotten others who are just emerging each entry provides biographical critical and bibliographical information while a general bibliography of works on multicultural literature concludes the book authors included range from the nearly forgotten such as laura adams armer to the newly discovered such as graham salisbury winner of the 1994 scott o dell award for historical fiction the breadth of authors covered ensures an historical context for the issues raised by multiculturalism and the sections on the critical reception of each author address such important issues as the authority and authenticity of the writer to comment on a different culture contributors are of many different ethnicities and include important scholars of children s literature lending authenticity and authority to the volume itself
