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the literary career of Friedrich Nietzsche 1844 1900 spanned less than twenty years but no area of intellectual inquiry was left untouched by his iconoclastic genius the philosopher who announced the death of God in *The Gay Science* 1882 and went on to challenge the Christian code of morality in *Beyond Good and Evil* 1886 grappled with the fundamental issues of the human condition in his own intense autobiography *Ecce Homo* 1888 most notorious of all perhaps his idea of the triumphantly transgressive Übermensch (superman) is developed in the extreme yet poetic words of thus spake Zarathustra 1883-92 whether addressing conventional Western philosophy or breaking new ground Nietzsche vastly extended the boundaries of nineteenth century thought

dead letters to nietzsche examines how writing shapes subjectivity through the example of nietzsche s reception by his readers including stanley rosen david farrell krell georges bataille laurence lampert pierre klossowski and sarah kofman more precisely joanne faulkner finds that the personal identification that these readers form with nietzsche s texts is an enactment of the kind of identity formation described in lacanian and kleinian psychoanalysis this investment of their subjectivity guides their understanding of nietzsche s project the revaluation of values not only does this work make a provocative contribution to nietzsche scholarship but it also opens in an original way broader philosophical questions about how readers come to be invested in a philosophical project and how such investment alters their subjectivity

the theme of the philosopher as therapist dominates nietzsche s entire opus from his earliest writings to the zarathustra period and beyond nietzsche wishes to hasten the coming and future sanctification of a new type of synthetic human being and his entire teaching is shaped by his own struggles against illness yet few nietzsche scholars have paid this crucial therapeutic element of his thought sufficient attention this collection of essays by leading scholars in the field is composed around the nietzschean insight which has its roots in the hippocratic tradition of ancient medicine that beliefs behaviours ideals and patterns of striving are not things for which individuals or even cultures are responsible rather they are symptoms of what an individual or culture is which symptoms

require diagnostic interpretation and evaluation the book identifies three principal approaches in nietzsche s philosophy diagnostic prognostic and therapeutic each essay takes up this essential insight into nietzsche s therapeutic philosophy from a different perspective and collectively they reveal an array of insightful approaches to self induced enhancement for both individuals and cultures

my humanity is a constant self overcoming friedrich nietzsche nietzsche s thinking revolves around a new and striking concept of humanity a humanity which has come to terms with the death of god and practises the art and science of living well free of the need for metaphysical certainties and moral absolutes how then are we to live and what do we love keith ansell pearson introduces the reader to nietzsche s distinctive philosophical style and to the development of his thought through a series of close readings of nietzsche s aphorisms he illuminates some of his best known but often ill understood ideas including eternal recurrence and the superman the death of god and the will to power and brings to light the challenging nature of nietzsche s thinking on key topics such as beauty truth and memory extracts are taken from a range of nietzsche s work including human all too human the gay science thus spoke zarathustra and on the genealogy of morality

nietzsche s mirror introduces the reader to one of the most central and pervasive themes in friedrich nietzsche s works will to power the book traces nietzsche s use of the terms power will and will to power as they are presented in both the works he authorized for publication and his literary remains called the nachlass the author demonstrates that will to power as it is presented in the nachlass differs from the way it is presented in the works nietzsche authorized for publication before his collapse in 1889 then it is argued that the problems that the nachlass poses for scholars suggests that the nachlass material should not be held in the same regard as the works nietzsche authorized for publication because of the discrepancy between the published and unpublished writings will to power should not be interpreted as a metaphysical principle operating behind the world since the metaphysical sounding passages are located in the nachlass but rather as a tool for interpreting relations especially human relations within the world the final chapter examines nietzsche s unique style of writing which the author calls mirror writing mirror writing is a technique nietzsche deliberately employs in order to have such visionary themes as will to power master morality and eternal recurrence reflect the reader s values back to himself since this book is meant to be an introduction to will to power at the end of each chapter is a list of additional books so that the reader can delve further into the themes presented in the chapter such as nietzsche s biography ethics writings on truth and eternal recurrence

this book offers an introductory review to a wide range of thinking formulated over the last half millennium in the western world about the meaning of human existence it will touch on a variety of issues of contemporary significance such as the origin and uniqueness of the human species freedom and determinism the nature of good and evil and the possibilities and limits of the sciences the book will

supply a number of explanatory comments from a christian perspective on the various views uncovered insofar as human beings are fascinated by exploring the reality of their own selves in relation to history culture the natural environment and a variety of worldviews this book will afford readers plenty of material to stimulate them in their own exploration

nietzsche's on the genealogy of morals has become a central text for understanding the thinker and his impact on moral philosophy yet his account of the rise of political society and its relation to morality has generally been overlooked in large part because of its strange and often confusing character in the rise of politics and morality in nietzsche's genealogy from chaos to conscience jeffrey metzger devotes careful attention to nietzsche's analysis of the origin of political society in the second essay and its intertwining with the development of morality and religion focused on how that account places nietzsche's understanding of humanity in his larger conceptions of nature and the will to power the book further considers how nietzsche grounds his thought in the world as he presents it and the strengths and weaknesses of nietzsche's approach to this crucial moment in human development this book will interest philosophers political theorists and anyone else interested in nietzsche and his contribution to our understanding of how we became human

paying particular attention to the issue of how to read nietzsche this book presents a series of accessible essays on the work of this influential german philosopher the contributions include many of the leading nietzsche scholars in the united states today frithjof bergmann arthur danto bernd magnus christopher middleton lars gustafsson alexander nehamas richard schacht gary shapiro and ivan soll and the majority of the essays have never been published works discussed include on the genealogy of morals beyond good and evil thus spoke zarathustra twilight of the idols and the will to power

an introduction to literary theory unlike any other ten lessons in theory engages its readers with three fundamental premises the first premise is that a genuinely productive understanding of theory depends upon a considerably more sustained encounter with the foundational writings of hegel marx nietzsche and freud than any reader is likely to get from the introductions to theory that are currently available the second premise involves what fredric jameson describes as the conviction that of all the writing called

theoretical lacan's is the richest entertaining this conviction the book pays more and more careful attention to the richness of lacan's writing than does any other introduction to literary theory the third and most distinctive premise of the book is that literary theory isn't simply theory about literature but that theory fundamentally is literature after all ten lessons in theory argues and even demonstrates that theoretical writing is nothing if not a specific genre of creative writing a particular way of engaging in the art of the sentence the art of making sentences that make trouble sentences that make or desire to make radical changes in the very fabric of social reality as its title indicates the book proceeds in the form of ten lessons each based on an axiomatic sentence selected from the canon of theoretical writing each lesson works by creatively unpacking its featured sentence and exploring the sentence's conditions of possibility and most radical implications in the course of exploring the conditions and consequences of these troubling sentences the ten lessons work and play together to articulate the most basic assumptions and motivations supporting theoretical writing from its earliest stirrings to its most current turbulences provided in each lesson is a working glossary specific critical keywords are boldfaced on their first appearance and defined either in the text or in a footnote but while each lesson constitutes a precise explication of the working terms and core tenets of theoretical writing each also attempts to exemplify theory as a practice of creativity foucault in itself

nietzsche described himself as a godless anti metaphysician these writings encourage the student to question any reading that fails to address nietzsche's sense of irony with respect to his own philosophical claims the anthology includes the best recent writings on nietzsche it covers all the main themes of nietzsche's philosophy and pays particular attention to nietzsche's discussion of value and the need for a re evaluation of values his critique of metaphysics and the problem of knowledge and his account of art and politics

the nietzsche disappointment examines the workings of time in nietzsche's philosophy it asks how he explains the great changes that according to him turned the past into the present catastrophic transformations of morality language human nature or that may yet make a desirable future out of this sorry present age the question is essential nietzsche attacks morality by appeal to the past and future where philosophy had fancied itself eternal imagining all times to be more or less like the present nietzsche sets the subject in motion with his attention to abrupt utterly consequential events everything eternal becomes temporal but after whetting his readers' appetites for past and future cataclysms nietzsche makes them seem impossible birth of tragedy raises the question of where socrates could have come from and then can't answer in beyond good and evil nietzsche pins his hopes on the birth of future philosophers even as he shows how many obstacles prevent their being born on the genealogy of morals posits occurrences like the triumph of slave morality that violate nietzsche's own claims about what can happen what stops nietzsche from telling the very stories that he wanted philosophy to attend to perhaps that question can't be answered without considering how nietzsche understands his own place in the flow of time considering for instance his wish to be an original philosopher the nietzsche disappointment is both critical and sympathetic it interrogates nietzsche in terms that he should understand it closes by asking whether there is some way of being critical that is also self critical for then a good reading may free the reader from nietzsche's person while continuing to confront the challenge

he bequeathed to philosophy

teach yourself nietzsche is a comprehensive guide to one of the most influential and controversial philosophers of modern times

an important figure in the development of nietzsche scholarship mazzino montinari 1928 86 dedicated himself to the detailed study of the philosopher s writings this lifetime of scholarship crystallized in montinari s work as coeditor of the critical edition of nietzsche s collected writings reading nietzsche now available in english for the first time is a group of essays that grew out of this monumental work in reading nietzsche montinari tackles such subjects as the relationship between nietzsche and wagner early drafts of thus spoke zarathustra and the philosopher s reputation among the nazis and marxists of the 1930s and 1940s he also deals authoritatively with a number of figures who have had an unfortunate influence upon the way nietzsche has been understood from the chief nazi interpreter of nietzsche alfred bäumler to the chief marxist interpreter georg lukàcs to nietzsche s sister elisabeth

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
