this work is designed as the core text for undergraduate introductory courses on world music supported by case studies from a variety of cultures the text defines musical terms and concepts and discusses how musical organization and structure differs across cultures

the performing arts represent a significant part of the artistic production in our culture correspondingly the fields of drama film music opera dance and performance studies are expanding however these arts remain an underexplored territory for aesthetics and the philosophy of art expression in the performing arts tries to contribute to this area the volume collects essays written by international scholars who address a variety of themes concerning the core philosophical topic of expression in the theory of the performing arts specific questions about the ontology of art the nature of the performances the role of the performer and the relations between spectators and works emerge from the study of the performing arts besides these arts challenge the unchanging physicality of other kinds of works of art usually the direct result of creative individual artist and barely affected by the particular circumstances of their exhibition expression is one of the issues that adopt a special character in the performing arts do singers dancers or actors express the feelings a work is expressive of how does the performer contribute to the expressive content of the work how does the spectator emotionally respond to the physical proximity of the performers is aesthetic distance avoided in the understanding of the performing arts how are the expressive properties of work performance and characters related and how are the subjectivities they embody revealed the contributions presented here are not all in agreement on the right answers to theses questions but they offer a critical and exciting discussion of them in addition to original proposals on the theoretical aspect of expression in the performing arts the collection includes analyses of individual artists historical productions and concrete works of art as well as reflections on performative practice

argues for the importance of musical activity in human life and for the importance of music in education this book presents a model for teaching the musical practices of the nation s constituent cultural groups in schools in terms of their respective cultural meanings

trying to understand the complex interplay between effective learning and personal experience is one of the main challenges for instrumental music education much of the research that focuses on effective learning outcomes often adopts experimental methodologies that do not allow for a thorough examination of the subjective and social processes that accompany each student s musical journey on the contrary contributions dedicated to the detailed analysis of the learners lived experience often do not offer generalizable outcomes to different types of learning and teaching

since the beginning of human civilization music has been used as a device to control social behavior where it has operated as much to promote solidarity within groups as hostility between competing groups music is an emotive manipulator that influences attitude motivation and behavior at many levels and in many contexts this volume is the first to address the social ramifications of music s behaviorally manipulative effects its morally questionable uses and control mechanisms and its economic and artistic regulation through commercialization thus highlighting not only music s diverse uses at the social level but also the ever fragile relationship between aesthetics and morality

in the age of digital music it seems striking that so many of us still want to produce music concretely with our bodies through the movement of our limbs lungs and fingers in contact with those materials and objects which are capable of producing sounds the huge sales figures of musical instruments in the global market and the amount of time and effort people of all ages invest in mastering the tools of music make it clear that playing musical instruments is an important phenomenon in human life by combining the findings made in music psychology and performative ethnomusicology marko aho shows how playing a musical instrument and the pleasure musicians get from it emerges from an intimate dialogue between the personally felt body and the sounding instrument an introduction to the general aspects of the tactile resources of musical instruments musical style and the musician is followed by an analysis of the learning process of the regional kantele style of the perho river valley in finnish central ostrobothnia

how sound leaves a fundamental imprint on who we are making sense of sound is one of the hardest jobs we ask our brains to do in of sound mind nina kraus examines the partnership of sound and brain showing for the first time that the processing of sound drives many of the brain s core functions our hearing is always on we can t close our ears the way we close our eyes and yet we can ignore sounds that are unimportant we don t just hear we engage with sounds kraus explores what goes on in our brains when we hear a word or a chord or a meow or a screech our hearing brain kraus tells us is vast it interacts with what we know with our emotions with how we think with our movements and with our other senses auditory neurons make calculations at one thousandth of a second hearing is the speediest of our senses sound plays an unrecognized role in both healthy and hurting brains kraus explores the power of music for healing as well as the destructive power of noise on the nervous system she traces what happens in the brain when we speak another language have a language disorder experience rhythm listen to birdsong or suffer a concussion kraus shows how our engagement with sound leaves a fundamental imprint on who we are the sounds of our lives shape our brains for better and for worse and help us build the sonic world we live in
