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from the earliest records relating to virginia we learn the basics about many of these original colonists their origins the names of the ships they sailed on the names of the hundreds and plantations they inhabited the names of their spouses and children their occupations and their position in the colony their relationships with fellow colonists and indian neighbors their living conditions as far as can be ascertained from documentary sources their ownership of land the dates and circumstances of their death and a host of fascinating sometimes incidental details about their personal lives all gathered together in the handy format of a biographical dictionary publisher website january 2008

the making of american whiteness the formation of race in seventeenth century virginia changes the narrative about the origins of race and whiteness in america with an exhaustive array of archival documents carmen p thompson demonstrates not only that whiteness predates european expansion to the americas as evidenced in their participation in the transatlantic slave trade since the fifteenth century but more importantly that it was the principal dynamic in the settlement of virginia the first colony in what would become the united states of america and just as the system of white supremacy was the principal framework that fueled the transatlantic slave trade it likewise was the framework that drove the organization of civil society in virginia including the organization and structure of the colony s laws social political and economic policies as well as its system of governance the book shows what whiteness looked like in everyday life in the early seventeenth century in a way eerily prescient to whiteness today

in the late sixteenth century the english started expanding westward establishing control over parts of neighboring ireland as well as exploring and later colonizing distant north america audrey horning deftly examines the relationship between british colonization efforts in both locales depicting their close interconnection as fields for colonial experimentation focusing on the ulster plantation in the north of ireland and the jamestown settlement in the chesapeake she challenges the notion that ireland merely served as a testing ground for british expansion into north america horning instead analyzes the people financial networks and information that circulated through and connected english plantations on either side of the atlantic in addition horning explores english colonialism from the perspective of the gaelic irish and algonquian societies and traces the political and material impact of contact the focus on the material culture of both locales yields a textured specificity to the complex relationships between natives and newcomers while exposing the lack of a determining vision or organization in early english colonial projects

explores how the 1789 congressional election between two future presidents with differing views on the constitution and the bill of rights influenced the destiny of the united states

the essential history of the extraordinary year in which american democracy and american slavery emerged hand in hand in colonial virginia along the banks of the james river virginia during an oppressively hot spell in the middle of summer 1619 two events occurred within a few weeks of each other that would profoundly shape the course of history in the newly built church at jamestown the general assembly the first gathering of a representative governing body in america came together a few weeks later a battered privateer entered the chesapeake bay carrying the first african slaves to land on mainland english america in 1619 historian james horn sheds new light on the year that gave birth to the great paradox of our nation slavery in the midst of freedom this portentous year marked both the origin of the most important political development in american history the rise of democracy and the emergence of what would in time become one of the nation s greatest challenges the corrosive legacy of racial inequality that has afflicted america since its beginning

how did efforts to control wild animals affect colonization winner of the choice outstanding academic title of the choice acrl from the time europeans first came to the new world until the closing of the frontier the benefits of abundant wild animals from beavers and wolves to fish deer and bison appeared as a recurring theme in colonizing discourses explorers travelers surveyors naturalists and other promoters routinely advertised the richness of the american faunal environment and speculated about the ways in which animals could be made to serve their colonial projects in practice however american animals proved far less malleable to colonizers designs their behaviors constrained an english colonial vision of a reinvented and rationalized american landscape in wild by nature andrea l smalley argues that anglo american authorities unceasing

efforts to convert indigenous beasts into colonized creatures frequently produced unsettling results that threatened colonizers control over the land and the people not simply acted upon by being commodified harvested and exterminated wild animals were active subjects in the colonial story altering its outcome in unanticipated ways these creatures became legal actors subjects of statutes issues in court cases and parties to treaties in a centuries long colonizing process that was reenacted on successive wild animal frontiers following a trail of human animal encounters from the seventeenth century chesapeake to the civil war era southern plains smalley shows how wild beasts and their human pursuers repeatedly transgressed the lines lawmakers drew to demarcate colonial sovereignty and control confounding attempts to enclose both people and animals inside a legal frame she also explores how to possess the land colonizers had to find new ways to contain animals without destroying the wildness that made those creatures valuable to english settler societies in the first place offering fresh perspectives on colonial legal environmental and native american history wild by nature reenvisions the familiar stories of early america as animal tales

in 1619 a group of thirty two african men women and children arrived on the shores of virginia they had been kidnapped in the royal city of kabasa angola and forced aboard the spanish slave ship san juan bautista the ship was attacked by privateers and the captives were taken by the english to their new world colony this group has been shrouded in controversy ever since historian ric murphy documents a fascinating story of colonialism treason piracy kidnapping enslavement and british law

this volume details sir jerome horsey s account of his experiences in russia and other countries horsey who spent the better part of seventeen years in the country until leaving in 1591 was an employee of the muscovy company but also operated as an unofficial ambassador for both the english and russian governments he was personally acquainted with such people as ivan the terrible tsar fyodor i and boris godunov and gives lively and interesting accounts of his interactions with them as well as with many other prominent people both russian and english horsey has been accused of exaggeration chicanery and self advertisement but his account is by far the most readable and enjoyable of the many books written by english people sojourning in russia it has been published only twice both times in conjunction with giles fletcher s contemporary and more professional account of the russian state this edition with a full introduction and extensive notes is the first to present horsey s book on its own it is a travel book an adventure story and an autobiography of a controversial and significant figure

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
