english literature in the 1960s soon threw off its post war weariness and the tepid influences of the previous decade new voices new visions and new commitments profoundly reshaped writing during the 60s and throughout the rest of the century drama thrived on its rapidly rebuilt foundations new freedoms of style and form revitalised fiction poetry too gradually recovered the variety and inventiveness of earlier years as well as comprehensively charting these changes in the literary field randall stevenson persuasively pinpoints their origins in the historical social and intellectual pressures of the times literary developments are revealingly related to the wider evolution and profound changes in english experience in the late twentieth century to shadows of war and loss of empire declining influences of class shifting relations between the genders emergent minority and counter cultures and the broadening democratization of contemporary life in general analyses of the rise of literary theory of publishing and the book trade and of the pervasive influences of modernism and postmodernism contribute further to an impressively thorough insightful description of writing in the later twentieth century a literary period stevenson shows to be far more imaginative and exciting than has yet been recognised lucid accessible and engaging this volume of the oxford english literary history presents a unique illumination of its age one we have lived through but are only just beginning to understand the first full account of its period it will set the agenda for discussion of late twentieth century literature for many years to come

setting aside barren issues such as the scientific status of history murray g murphey develops an empirical approach to historical study that can yield theories interpretations that are testable and confirmable he examines the evidence on

which historical theories are based the types of explanations used and particularly the way historical theories are tested the book treats not only the actual process of historical research but also the philosophical problems involved in historical work the treatment of causation is new as is the discussion of epistemology in his discussions murphey covers a wide range of sources and examples including frederick jackson turner the gospels perspectives on the causes of the great depression the vinland map witchcraft and material culture the book is addressed to all who do history or write about it and it will be a useful text for those who teach courses in historiography

in july 1864 union general william t sherman ordered the arrest and deportation of more than 400 women and children from the villages of roswell and new manchester georgia branded as traitors for their work in the cotton mills that supplied much needed material to the confederacy these civilians were shipped to cities in the north already crowded with refugees and left to fend for themselves this work details the little known story of the hardships these women and children endured before and most especially after they were forcibly taken from their homes beginning with the founding of roswell it examines the pre civil war circumstances that created this class of women the main focus is on what befell the women at the hands of sherman s army and what they faced once they reached such states as illinois and indiana an appendix details the roll of political prisoners from sweetwater new manchester

this book deals with theoretical problems that arise at points of contact between the concerns of philosophers and historians about the practice of historiography in bringing together these critical studies on diverse but related themes the book offers insight into the aims and methods of those working in theory of historiography in recent years especially in english speaking countries

despite the tragedy of many of the encounters axtell also finds that there was much humor in indian european negotiations over peace sex and war in the final section he conducts searching analyses of how college textbooks treat the initial century of american history how america s human face changed from all brown in 1492 to predominantly white and black by 1792 and how we handled moral questions during the quincentenary he concludes with an extensive review of the quincentenary scholarship books films tv and museum exhibits and suggestions for how we can assimilate what we have learned

the rcaf with a total strength of 4061 officers and men on 1 september 1939 grew by the end of the war to a strength of more than 263 000 men and women this important and well illustrated new history shows how they contributed to the resolution of the most significant conflict of our time

the griffith project paolo cherchi usai general editor volume 12 essays on d w griffith edited by paolo cherchi usai and cynthia rowell with contributions by william m drew helmut färber andré gaudreault philippe gauthier lea jacobs joyce jesionowski charlie keil richard koszarski arthur lennig pat loughney david mayer russell merritt jan olsson paul spehr yuri tsivian linda williams in early 1996 an international group of 35 specialists in silent cinema volunteered to write commentaries on more than six hundred films directed written produced and supervised by d w griffith or featuring him as a performer for the eleven volume series the griffith project the largest monograph ever assembled on an individual film director in conjunction with the massive retrospective held at the pordenone silent film festival from 1996 to 2008 all authors involved in the griffith project were bound to strict editorial rules most notably the fact that all titles in the series would be assigned to them in pre determined groups rather than as a result of their own individual preference for this or that specific entry the patience and commitment demonstrated by all scholars in this endeavor requires at least a symbolic recognition we therefore invited the members of the project team to write an essay on a d w griffith related topic of their own choice the papers included in this volume constitute the response to our carte blanche invitation our offer was also extended to other experts on d w griffith who for various reasons were unable to participate in the griffith project but consistently supported it with their generous advice and insight this volume brings the griffith project to completion as 2008 sees the last installment of the d w griffith program at the pordenone silent film festival with the screening of his films produced between 1925 and 1931 not surprisingly twelve years of research on d w griffith have unearthed an impressive wealth of knowledge but also an equally amazing array of new questions certainly enough of them to fill several more volumes some of them including the increasingly complex issue of d w griffith s role as production supervisor are only introduced or barely mentioned here but we are confident that what we have called the griffith project will continue at the giornate and elsewhere with more research and newly found or preserved prints paolo cherchi usai is director of the national film and sound archive of australia he is co founder of the pordenone silent film festival and of
