the beginnings of jazz and the story of charles buddy bolden 1877 1931 are inextricably intertwined just after the turn of the century new orleanians could often hear bolden's powerful horn from the city's parks and through dance hall windows despite his lack of formal training his unique style both musical and personal made him the first king of new orleans jazz and the inspiration for such later jazz greats as king oliver kid ory and louis armstrong for years the legend of buddy bolden was overshadowed by myths about his music his reckless lifestyle and his mental instability in search of buddy bolden overlays the myths with the substance of reality interviews with those who knew bolden and an extensive array of primary sources enliven and inform donald m marquis's absorbing portrait of the brief but brilliant career of the first man of jazz this paperback edition includes a new preface and appendix relating events and discoveries that have occurred since the book's original publication in 1978

because it all seems so improbable—so horribly impossible to me now sitting here safe and sane in my own library—i hesitate to record an episode which already appears to me less horrible than grotesque yet unless this story is written now i know i shall

never have the courage to tell the truth about the matter—not from fear of ridicule but because i myself shall soon cease to credit what i now know to be true yet scarcely a month has elapsed since i heard the stealthy purring of what i believed to be the shoaling undertow—scarcely a month ago with my own eyes i saw that which even now i am beginning to believe never existed as for the harbor master—and the blow i am now striking at the old order of things—but of that i shall not speak now or later i shall try to tell the story simply and truthfully and let my friends testify as to my probity and the publishers of this book corroborate them on the 29th of february i resigned my position under the government and left washington to accept an offer from professor farrago—whose name he kindly permits me to use—and on the first day of april i entered upon my new and congenial duties as general superintendent of the water fowl department connected with the zoological gardens then in course of erection at bronx park new york for a week i followed the routine examining the new foundations studying the architect's plans following the surveyors through the bronx thickets suggesting arrangements for water courses and pools destined to be included in the enclosures for swans geese pelicans herons and such of the waders and swimmers as we might expect to acclimate in bronx park it was at that time the policy of the trustees and officers of the zoological gardens neither to employ collectors nor to send out expeditions in search of specimens the society decided to depend upon voluntary contributions and i was always busy part of the day in dictating answers to correspondents who wrote offering their services as hunters of big game collectors of all sorts of fauna trappers snarers and also to those who offered specimens for sale usually at exorbitant rates to the proprietors of five legged kittens mangy lynxes moth eaten coyotes and dancing bears i returned courteous but uncompromising refusals—of course first submitting all such letters together with my replies to professor farrago one day towards the end of may however just as i was leaving bronx park to return to town professor lesard of the reptilian department called out to me that professor farrago wanted to see me a moment so i put my pipe into my pocket again and retraced my steps to the temporary wooden building occupied by professor farrago general superintendent of the zoological gardens the professor who was sitting at his desk before a pile of letters and replies submitted for approval by me pushed his glasses down and looked over them at me with a whimsical smile that suggested amusement impatience annoyance and perhaps a faint trace of apology

the egúngún society is one of the least studied and written about aspects of african diasporic spiritual traditions it is the society of the ancestors the society of the dead its primary function is to facilitate all aspects of ancestor veneration though it is fundamental to yorùbá culture and the ifá Òrìṣà tradition of the yorùbá it did not survive intact in cuba or the us during the forced migration of the yorùbá in the middle passage taking hold only in brazil the egúngún cult has thrived since the early 1800s on the small island of itaparica across the bay of all saints from salvador bahia existing almost exclusively on this tiny island until the 1970s migrating to rio de janeiro and eventually recife this ancient cult was preserved by a handful of families and flourished in a strict orthodox manner brian willson spent ten years in close contact with this lineage at the candomblé temple xango cá te espero in rio de janeiro and was eventually initiated as a priest of egúngún representing the culmination of his personal involvement interviews research and numerous visits to brazil this book relates the story of egúngún from an insider's view very little has been written about the cult of egúngún and almost exclusively what is written in english

is based on research conducted in africa and falls into the category of descriptive and historical observations part personal journal part metaphysical mystery part scholarly work and part field research in search of ancient kings illuminates the nature of egúngún as it is practiced in brazil

anthropology is a kind of debate between human possibilities a dialectical movement between the anthropologist as a modern man and the primitive peoples he studies in search of the primitive is a tough minded book containing chapters ranging from encounters in the field to essays on the nature of law schizophrenia and civilization and the evolution of the work of claudé lévi strauss above all it is reflective and self critical critical of the discipline of anthropology and of the civilization that produced that discipline diamond views the anthropologist who refuses to become a searching critic of his own civilizations as not merely irresponsible but a tool of western civilization he rejects the associations which have been made in the ideology of our civilization consciously or unconsciously between western dominance and progress imperialism and evolution evolution and progress

this text traces the growth and development of two related disciplines anthropology and the study of religions locating these disciplines within the intellectual climate of the 19th century the study considers the contributions of scholars such as james george frazer f max muller emile durkheim mary douglas and clifford geertz within an historical framework the author argues that both anthropologists and students of religion have abandoned an objective approach in favour of personal engagement with their subjects replacing observation with conversation monologue with dialogue a text based with people based approach he reveals how each discipline has influenced the other both in terms of methodology and by the provision of data the book also explores the criticism levelled at both disciplines that they have aided colonial domination of the developing world

few classical stories are as exciting as that of jason and the golden fleece the legend of the boy who discovers a new identity as son of a usurped king and leads a crew of demi gods and famous heroes has resonated through the ages rumbling like the clashing rocks which almost pulverised the argo the myth and its reception inspires endless engagements while it tells of a quest to the ends of the earth of the tyrants pelias and aetes of dragons teeth of the loss of hylas beloved of hercules stolen away by nymphs and of jason s seduction of the powerful witch medea later betrayed for a more useful princess it speaks to us of more of gender and sexuality of heroism and lost integrity of powerful gods and terrifying monsters of identity and otherness of exploration and exploitation the argonauts are emblems of collective heroism yet also of the emptiness of glory from pindar to j w waterhouse apollonius of rhodes to ray harryhausen and robert graves to mary zimmerman the argonaut myth has produced later interpretations as rich salty and complex as the ancient versions helen lovatt here unravels like untangled sea kelp the diverse

strands of the narrative and its numerous and fascinating afterlives her book will prove both informative and endlessly entertaining to those who love classical literature and myth

this volume brings together essays by leading german and american historians on the subject of german emigration in the eighteenth century when germans were moving to a variety of destinations russia prussian lithuania and various other german territories as well as north america what drove men and women from different regional and social backgrounds to leave their homes during this time some migrations were forced as for the mennonites the salzburger emigrants and the french huguenots some were voluntary and determined by the wish for one s own land and greater social and economic opportunity in all groups religion was a prominent motivator and primary element of social identification and cohesion inevitably migrants carried with them traditional skills and other indispensable cultural baggage a key strength of this book is that contributors emphasize the mutual exchanges that occurred among cultures

the extraordinary life and ideas of one of the greatest and most neglected minds in history sir thomas browne 1605 1682 was an english writer physician and philosopher whose work has inspired everyone from ralph waldo emerson to jorge luis borges virginia woolf to stephen jay gould in an intellectual adventure like sarah bakewell s book about montaigne how to live hugh aldersey williams sets off not just to tell the story of browne s life but to champion his skeptical nature and inquiring mind mixing botany etymology medicine and literary history aldersey williams journeys in his hero s footsteps to introduce us to witches zealots natural wonders and fabulous creatures of browne s time and ours we meet browne the master prose stylist responsible for introducing hundreds of words into english including electricity hallucination and suicide aldersey williams reveals how browne s preoccupations how to disabuse the credulous of their foolish beliefs what to make of order in nature how to unite science and religion are relevant today in search of sir thomas browne is more than just a biography it is a cabinet of wonders and an argument that browne standing at the very gates of modern science remains an inquiring mind for our own time as stephen greenblatt has written browne is unnervingly one of our most adventurous contemporaries

translation is a journey a journey undertaken by the text hopping around the world and mischievously border crossing from one language to another from one culture to another for a translator this journey can become a truly creative engagement with the otherness of the source text an experience of self discovery leading to understanding and enrichment and ultimately towards a new text this singular literary experiment intends to magnify the idiosyncrasy of this translational journey in the process translation reveals itself as an increasingly creative activity rather than simply a linguistic transfer this volume consists of twelve translations of one poem les fenêtres by the french poet apollinaire the translators embarking on this project all from different backgrounds and working contexts poets professional translators academics visual artists were asked to engage with the inherent multimodality of this poem inspired by robert delaunay s les fenêtres series of paintings the result is a kaleidoscopic diversity of approaches and final products each translation is accompanied by self reflective commentary which provides insight

into the complex process and experience of translation enticing the reader to join this journey too

in the 1920s mexican composer julián carrillo 1875 1965 developed a microtonal system he metaphorically called el sonido 13 the 13th sound although his pioneering role as one of the first proponents of microtonality gave him a cult figure status among european avant garde circles in the 1960s and 1970s his music and legacy have remained largely ignored by scholars and critics this book explores his ideas not only in relation to the historical moments of their inception but also in relation to the various cultural projects that kept them alive and resignified them into the 21st century

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
