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the handbook of communication skills is recognised as one of the core texts in the field of communication offering a state of the art overview of this rapidly evolving field of study this comprehensively revised and updated fourth edition arrives at a time when the realm of interpersonal communication has attracted immense attention recent research showing the potency of communication skills for success in many walks of life has stimulated considerable interest in this area both from academic researchers and from practitioners whose day to day work is so dependent on effective social skills covering topics such as non verbal behaviour listening negotiation and persuasion the book situates communication in a range of different contexts from interacting in groups to the counselling interview based on the core tenet that interpersonal communication can be conceptualised as a form of skilled activity and including new chapters on cognitive behavioural therapy and coaching and mentoring this new edition also places communication in context with advances in digital technology the handbook of communication skills represents the most significant single contribution to the literature in this domain providing a rich mine of information for the neophyte and practising professional it is perfect for use in a variety of contexts from theoretical mainstream communication modules on degree programmes to vocational courses in health business and education with contributions from an internationally renowned range of scholars this is the definitive text for students researchers and professionals alike

this book explores the phenomenological investigations of edith stein by critically contextualising her role within the phenomenological movement and assessing her accounts of empathy sociality and personhood despite the growing interest that surrounds contemporary research on empathy edith stein s phenomenological investigations have been largely neglected due to a historical tradition that tends to consider her either as husserl s assistant or as a martyr however in her phenomenological research edith stein pursued critically the relation between phenomenology and psychology focusing on the relation between affectivity subjectivity and personhood alongside phenomenologists like max scheler kurt stavenhagen and hedwig conrad martius stein developed husserl s method incorporating several original modifications that are relevant for philosophy phenomenology and ethics drawing on recent debates on empathy emotions and collective intentionality as well as on original inquiries and interpretations the collection articulates and develops new perspectives regarding edith stein s phenomenology the volume includes an appraisal of stein s philosophical relation to edmund husserl and max scheler and develops further the concepts of empathy sociality and personhood these essays demonstrate the significance of stein s phenomenology for contemporary research on intentionality emotions and ethics gathering together contributions

from young researchers and leading scholars in the fields of phenomenology social ontology and history of philosophy this collection provides original views and critical discussions that will be of interest also for social philosophers and moral psychologists

this book draws attention to the ways in which an awareness of and sensitivity to embodiment can enlighten educational practices it explores discourses from a range of thinkers including merleau ponty gadamer bakhtin haraway and ahmed to name a few the book argues that attention to embodiment can help us to reimagine the goals of education in ways that fit more coherently with human concerns and that offer the chance to provide education that is more holistic and grounded in our corporeality theories of embodiment can be used to modify education at the level of curriculum and at the level of pedagogy this can help us design educational interventions that fit more naturally with how humans are inclined to learn and thus make educational experiences more meaningful attention to embodiment allows us to appreciate the extent to which the body appropriates a professional practice and the extent to which a professional practice appropriates the body of the learner it shows how greater sensitivity to the body can enliven and enlighten our educational practices especially in professional education

gregory f tague s an ape ethic and the question of personhood argues that great apes are moral individuals

because they engage in a land ethic as ecosystem engineers to generate ecologically sustainable biomes for themselves and other species tague shows that we need to recognize apes as eco engineers in order to save them and their habitats and that in so doing we will ultimately save earth s biosphere the book draws on extensive empirical research from the ecology and behavior of great apes and synthesizes past and current understanding of the similarities in cognition social behavior and culture found in apes importantly this book proposes that differences between humans and apes provide the foundation for the call to recognize forest personhood in the great apes while all ape species are alike in terms of cognition intelligence and behaviors there is a vital contrast unlike humans great apes are efficient ecological engineers therefore simian forest sovereignty is critical to conservation efforts in controlling global warming and apes should be granted dominion over their tropical forests weaving together philosophy biology socioecology and elements from eco psychology this book provides a glimmer of hope for future acknowledgment of the inherent ethic that ape species embody in their eco centered existence on this planet

aung san suu kyi spoke passionately about non violence she wrote involved articles about compatibility of democracy with buddhism and she won the hearts and minds of so many with her call for the freedom from fear it seemed for more than two decades that suu kyi was a perfect non western propagator of democracy human rights rule of law yet a deeper analysis reveals that suu kyi intellectually indeed has been a democrat all along but a burmese democrat suu kyi understands democracy in a buddhist way and she reasons about politics using buddhist ideas idioms and concepts this buddhist dominance of her political thought had several consequences the most important one being that her approach to politics has first and foremost been a moral one her vision of democracy and of politics in general is a moral vision it is something i propose to call the moral democracy the same reason that made her famous and admired worldwide now contributed to her fall from grace for too many outside burma myanmar it is impossible to understand how suu kyi yesterday s global personification of good and morality can now silently endorse crimes against humanity conducted in her country and accept forced relocation of 700 thousand people a cynic would quote bertrand russell s words we have two kinds of morality side by side one
