The Chavn Horizon 900-200 BCE The Dawn of Andean Art The Chavn culture located in the northcentral Andes of modernday Peru laid the foundation for much of later Andean art Their artistic expression characterized by a distinct stylistic unity influenced numerous subsequent cultures throughout the region This influence is often referred to as the Chavn Horizon Stylistic hallmarks Chavn art is recognizable by its highly stylized depictions of feline and serpent deities often combined into complex supernatural beings These figures rendered with intense detail possess characteristic features like fangs claws and a fierce gaze The use of a distinctive geometric and repetitive patterns often employing negative space effectively is another key element

Materials and Techniques Chavn artists skillfully employed stone carving particularly using volcanic rock to create monumental sculptures intricately decorated ceramics and massive architectural complexes Their mastery of relief carving and the use of varied textures added depth and visual interest to their works The use of hammered and polished metals like gold and copper was also emerging during this period although less prevalent than stonework

Chavn art wasnt solely decorative it was intimately tied to religious practices and served to reinforce the power and influence of the elite The most renowned example of Chavn artistry is the Lanzn a monolithic stone carving of a deity at the Chavn de Huntar site Its imposing presence and intricate detail undoubtedly instilled awe and reverence in its observers This period also saw the development of sophisticated weaving techniques laying groundwork for the later textile excellence of Andean cultures

2 Regional Developments and the Rise of New Styles 200 BCE 1000 CE

Following the Chavn Horizon Andean art witnessed a diversification of styles as regional cultures flourished developing unique artistic expressions while retaining certain elements of Chavn influence Several important regional styles emerged

Moche 100800 CE Known for their elaborate pottery portraying scenes of daily life warfare and religious ceremonies Their ceramics were often highly realistic demonstrating remarkable skill in depicting human anatomy and emotion Moche metalwork particularly gold and silver also achieved high levels of sophistication

Nazca 100 BCE 600 CE Famous for their geoglyphs massive line drawings etched into the desert floor as well as their polychrome pottery characterized by intricate designs and vibrant colors The Nazca Lines remain an enigmatic testament to their astronomical and ritualistic practices

Wari 6001000 CE This powerful empire developed a distinctive style with a preference for geometric designs and stylized representations They were known for their largescale architectural projects and elaborate administrative systems which had a profound impact on Andean society Their pottery reflects their empires reach exhibiting a standardization of forms and stylistic elements

These regional styles while diverse demonstrate a common thread the continued importance of religious themes sophisticated craftsmanship and the use of readily available materials The interaction between these cultures led to a crosspollination of ideas and techniques enriching the artistic landscape of the Andes

The Inca Empire 14381533 CE

Synthesis and Imperial Power The Inca Empire the largest preColumbian state in the Americas synthesized the artistic traditions of its predecessors while developing a distinct imperial style

the present volume stratabound ore deposits in the andes has its roots in an international seminar on stratabound ore deposits which took place in september 1986 in cusco peru sponsored by multi ciencias peru and unesco during this seminar it became clear that the amount and quality of research done on stratabound ore deposits in the andes required a synthesis researchers in industry and government as well as in academia including many which had participated at the cusco seminar were invited to contribute the

answer was extremely positive confirming the idea that a book expressing the state of the art of the study of stratabound ore deposits in the andes was long overdue as editors we sought to give maximum coverage to the present knowledge yet keeping the length and thereby the price within reasonable limits the book contains three types of contributions in the first part the reader will find review papers focusing on 1 the geologic framework 2 the metallogenesis in andean countries including also types of deposits differing from those of stratabound nature cardozo and cedillo oyarzun and 3 an introductory overview of the stratabound ore deposits in the andes emphasizing their geotectonic position as a classification tool

the objective of this volume is to examine the cenozoic tectonic and magmatic evolution from the arc to the retroarc of a distinctive end member of the andean accretionary orogen between 35 s and 39 s the evolution of the andes in this region provides an outstanding case study of an orogen where periods of contraction and extension crustal shortening and normal faulting and differences in retroarc volcanism reflect a tectonic regime that alternates in space and time structural magmatic and paleogeographic patterns correlate strongly with the dynamics of the subduction zone the region includes the neuquen basin which is one of the most prolific of the central andes the tectonic setting is important in understanding hydrocarbon systems of the sub andean basin and the potential for ore deposits in the cordillera the book is fundamental for researchers working on tectonics and magmatism in andean type systems as well as those involved in exploration publisher's website

in ancient people of the andes michael a malpass describes the prehistory of western south america from initial colonization to the spanish conquest all the major cultures of this region from the moche to the inkas receive thoughtful treatment from their emergence to their demise or evolution no south american culture that lived prior to the arrival of europeans developed a writing

system making archaeology the only way we know about most of the prehispanic societies of the andes the earliest spaniards on the continent provided first person accounts of the latest of those societies and as descendants of the inkas became literate they too became a source of information both ethnohistory and archaeology have limitations in what they can tell us but when we are able to use them together they are complementary ways to access knowledge of these fascinating cultures malpass focuses on large anthropological themes why people settled down into agricultural communities the origins of social inequalities and the evolution of sociopolitical complexity ample illustrations including eight color plates visually document sites societies and cultural features introductory chapters cover archaeological concepts dating issues and the region s climate the subsequent chapters divided by time period allow the reader to track changes in specific cultures over time

the essays in this book analyze and explain the crisis of democratic representation in five andean countries bolivia colombia ecuador peru and venezuela in this region disaffection with democracy political parties and legislatures has spread to an alarming degree many presidents have been forced from office and many traditional parties have fallen by the wayside these five countries have the potential to be negative examples in a region that has historically had strong demonstration and diffusion effects in terms of regime changes the crisis of democratic representation in the andes addresses an important question for latin america as well as other parts of the world why does representation sometimes fail to work

essays describe how the andean indians respond to environmental conditions and the plants and animals with which they live

this volume presents the most comprehensive overview in english of the languages of the central andes spoken primarily in peru

this book provides an overview of newly gathered material focusing on the opening and closure of the neuquén basin the neuquén basin contains the most important hydrocarbon reservoirs in argentina and therefore is characterized by a profound knowledge of the sedimentation mechanisms and closure times during the last 10 years a considerable amount of new information has been produced that illustrates a complex evolution that involves more than one synrift stage during its evolution an aborted sag phase associated with the inception of a first foreland basin in late early cretaceous times two extensional destabilizations in the late

cretaceous paleocene and late oligocene times and a neogene magmatic expansion coetaneous to a last mountain building these processes have produced a polyphasic complex structure that exhumed the rich sedimentary record that characterizes the basin
