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the global trajectories of queerness interrogates the term queer by closely mapping what space the theorizing of same sex sexualities and sexual politics in the non west inhabits from theoretical discussions around the epistemologies of such conceptualizations of space in the global south to specific ethnographies of same sex culture this collection hopes to forge a way of tracking the histories of race class caste gender and sexual orientation that form what is called the moment of globalization the volume co edited by ashley tellis and sruti bala asks whether the societies of the global south simply borrow and graft an internationalist read euro us language of lgbt queer rights and identity politics whether it is imposed on them or whether there is a productive negotiation of that language contributing authors sruti bala laia ribera cañénguez soledad cutuli roderick ferguson iman ganji krystal ghisyan josephine ho neville hoad victoria keller haneen maikey shad naved guillermo núñez noriega

in the last 15 years queer movements in many parts of the world have helped secure the rights of queer people these moments have been accompanied by the brutal rise of crony capitalism the violent consequences of the war on terror the hyper juridification of politics the financialization managerialization of social movements and the medicalization of non heteronormative identities practices how do we critically read the celebratory global proliferation of queer rights in these neoliberal times this volume responds to the complicated moment in the history of queer struggles by analysing laws state policies and cultures of activism to show how new intimacies between queer sexuality and neoliberalism that celebrate modernity and the birth of the liberated sexual citizen are in fact reproducing the old colonial desire of civilizing the native by paying particular attention to the problematics of race religion and class this volume engages in a rigorous self reflexive critique of global queer politics and its engagements confrontations and negotiations with modernity and its investments in liberalism legalism and militarism with the objective of queering the ethics of our queer politics published by zubaan

drawing on the words and stories of queer turkish activists this book aims to unravel the complexities of queer lives in turkey in doing so it challenges dominant conceptualizations of the queer turkish experience within critical security discourses the book argues that while queer turks are subjected to ceaseless forms of insecurity in their governance opportunities for emancipatory resistance have emerged alongside these abuses it identifies the ways in which the state the family turkish islam and other socially mediated processes and agencies can expose or protect queers from violence in the turkish community

queerness remains a central fault line in contemporary south asia colonial era anti sodomy laws codified in article 377 of the penal codes in india bangladesh and pakistan or article 365 in sri lanka exemplify the shared imperial lineages of the region as also their long postcolonial afterlives across south asia and the world new authoritarianisms have reignited old fault lines around sexuality new media technologies have increasingly connected diasporic space with mainland south asia globalising queer networks yet these trajectories are necessarily discontinuous in the last two decades whilst there has been an explosion of lgbtq visibility most notably in south asian film television and new media this visibility has come with mainstream ideological agendas which do not especially represent the diversity of queer lives in south asia along key identities of caste class religion and region this book seeks to encourage critical thinking by suggesting ways in which notions of culture neoliberalism nationalism and queerness in the context of new authoritarianisms are disentangled the chapters in this volume take up these questions and offer critical imaginings of sexual politics and its imbrication with popular culture and authoritarian politics within contemporary south asia the chapters in this book were originally published as a special issue of south asian popular culture

queer politics in india simultaneously tells two interconnected stories the first explores the struggle against violence and marginalization by queer people in the indian

subcontinent and places this movement towards equality and inclusion in relation to queer movements across the world the second story about a lesbian suicide in a small village in india interrupts the first one and together these two stories push and pull the book to elucidate the failure and promise of queer politics in india and the rest of the world this book emerges at a critical time for queer politics and activism in india exploring the contemporary queer subject through the different lenses of critical psychology lacanian psychoanalysis feminist and queer theory and cultural studies in its critique of the constructions of discourses of normal sexuality it also examines how power determines further segregations of abnormal sexuality into legitimate and illegitimate queer subjectivities and authentic and inauthentic queer experiences by allowing a multifaceted and engaged critique to emerge that demonstrates how the idea of a universal queer subject fails lower class lower caste queer subjects and queer people of colour the author expertly highlights how all queer people are not the same even within queer movements as the book asks the questions which queer subject does queer politics fight for and what is the imagination of a queer subject in queer politics this hugely important and timely work is relevant across many disciplines and will be useful for students of psychology and other academic areas as well as researchers and activist organizations

the queer politics of television is a radical book which brings together the fields of political theory and television studies in one of the first books to do so samuel a chambers exposes and explores the cultural politics of television by treating television shows including six feet under buffy the vampire slayer desperate housewives the l word and big love as serious important texts and reading them in detail through the lens of queer theory chambers makes the case for the profound significance of the cultural politics of television the way in which the text of a television show itself engages with the politics of its day he argues for queer theory s essential contribution to any understanding of the political and initiates a larger project of queer television studies treading the same path as queer film studies this book makes an

important and fresh contribution to queer theory and to the understanding of television as politics

the first book to explore the queer politics of lgbtq pride in global terms exploring the impacts controversies and potential of pride across the world drawing from extensive fieldwork in south africa south and east asia cuba and new york the queer politics of pride explores and conceptualises the contemporary politics of lgbtq pride and queer activism in global contexts building on critical queer scholarship the book includes the perspectives and critiques of grassroots queer activists and applies contemporary social political and international theory to conceptualise pride as part of the global processes of capitalism and the socio political and spatial dynamics of gentrification by exploring the politics and controversies of pride conway addresses broader questions about the contemporary lgbtq advocacy movement including the influence and place of corporate sponsorship and advocacy relationship with state and international institutions and the rise of an lgbtq global elite

in post queer politics ruffolo looks at the work of foucault butler bakhtin deleuze guattari and others in his creative refocus on the queer heteronormative dyad that has largely consumed queer studies and contemporary politics he offers a radical and intersectional new way of thinking about class race sex gender sexuality and ability that extends beyond queer studies to be truly transdisciplinary in its focus and political implications it will appeal to readers across a range of subjects including gender and sexuality studies philosophy cultural studies political science and education

from the birth of the gay liberation through the rise of the aids coalition to unleash power act up in 1987 the global justice movement in 1994 the largest day of antiwar protest in world history in february 2003 the republican national convention protests in august 2004 and the massive immigrant rights rallies in the spring of 2006 the streets of cities around the world have been filled with a new theatrical model of protest elements of fun creativity pleasure and play are cornerstones of this new approach toward protest and community building no movement has had a larger influence on the emergence of play in social movement activity than the gay liberation and queer activism of the past thirty years this book examines the role of play in gay liberation and queer activism and the ways in which queer notions of play have influenced a broad range of social movements

in this collection political and public policy analysts explore the concerns of lesbians gays bisexuals and the transgendered what has come to be known as lgbt or queer politics issues ranging from legal equality to recognition in policymaking of family and relational diversity to the regulation of sexuality itself are explored

queerness and christianity often depicted as mutually exclusive both challenge received notions of the good and the natural nowhere is this challenge more visible than in the identities faiths and communities that queer christians have long been creating as christians they have staked a claim for a christianity that is true to their self understandings how do queer identified persons understand their religious lives and in what ways do the lived experiences of queer christians respond to traditions and reshape them in contemporary practice queer christianities integrates the perspectives of queer theory religious studies and christian theology into a lively conversation

both transgressive and traditional about the fundamental questions surrounding the lives of queer christians the volume contributes to the emerging scholarly discussion on queer religious experiences as lived both within communities of christian confession as well as outside of these established communities organized around traditional christian states of life celibacy matrimony and what is here provocatively conceptualized as promiscuity this work reflects the ways in which queer christians continually reconstruct and multiply the forms these states of life take queer christianities challenges received ideas about sexuality and religion yet remains true to christian self understandings that are open to further enquiry and to further queerness

this book examines different forms and practices of queer media that is the films websites zines and film festivals produced by for and about lesbian gay bisexual transgender and queer lgbtq people in china in the first two decades of the twenty first century it traces how queer communities have emerged in urban china and identifies the pivotal role that community media have played in the process it also explores how these media shape community cultures and perform the role of social and cultural activism in a country where queer identities have only recently emerged and explicit forms of social activism are under serious political constraints importantly because queer media is niche and narrowcasting rather than broadcasting and mass communication the subject compels a rethinking of some often taken for granted assumptions about how media relates to the state the market and individuals overall the book reveals a great deal about queer communities and identities queer activism and about media and social and political attitudes in china
