Crafting a Compelling Introduction The introduction is your first impression It needs to capture the readers attention and clearly articulate the purpose of your proposal Start by briefly introducing the context or background information relevant to the problem or opportunity Then concisely state the problem itself Finally clearly present your proposed solution as a direct response to the identified problem Avoid vague statements and ensure a smooth transition into the body of 2 your proposal

For example if the prompt concerns improving student engagement in a school your introduction might look like this

Recent surveys indicate a decline in student engagement at Oakwood High School This lack of participation negatively impacts academic performance and overall school morale This proposal outlines a comprehensive program of extracurricular activities designed to revitalize student involvement and foster a more positive learning environment

Developing a Detailed and Persuasive Body The body of your proposal is where you thoroughly explain your plan Break it down into logical sections using clear subheadings Each section should address a specific aspect of your
