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how are global forces impacting on local lifestyles where does the personal stand in relation to globalization global forces and local life worlds explores these questions using a mixture of sociological and anthropological analysis and case study methods demonstrating the tensions between retaining cultural integrity in the face of the levelling processes associated with modernity this book locates the problems of globalization and localization in the appropriate anthropological and sociological dimensions examines the relationship between culture and identity and explores the varieties of modernity

cultural anthropology global forces local lives is an accessible ethnographically rich cultural anthropology textbook which gives a coherent and refreshingly new vision of the discipline and its subject matter—human diversity the fifteen chapters and three extended case studies present all of the necessary areas of cultural anthropology organizing them in conceptually and thematically meaningful and original ways a full one third of its content is dedicated to important global and historical cultural phenomena such as colonialism nationalism ethnicity and ethnic conflict economic development environmental issues cultural revival fundamentalism and popular culture the more conventional topics of anthropology language economics kinship politics religion race are integrated into this broader discussion to reflect the changing content of contemporary courses this well written and well organised text has been trialled both in the classroom and online the author has extensive teaching experience and is especially good at presenting material clearly matching his exposition to the pace of students understanding specially designed in colour to be useful to today's students cultural anthropology global forces local lives supports study with chapter case studies on subjects as diverse as doing anthropology at microsoft to banning religious symbols in france explains

the book is about new dynamic forces that are driving change in japan it is developed around two key concepts of civil society and social capital the focus is on pathways to japan's social renewal that promotes stronger communities and more participatory citizenship beyond the reach of economic growth

this book examines the movement for living wages at the local level and what it tells us about urban politics oren m levin waldman studies the role that living wage campaigns may have had in recent years in altering the political landscape in four cities where they have been adopted los angeles detroit baltimore and new orleans it is the author's belief that the living wage movements are a result of policy failure at the local level they are the by product of the failure to adequately address the changes that were occurring mainly the changing urban economic base and growing income inequality the author undertakes a scholarly analysis of the issue through the disciplinary lenses of political science while also employing some of the economists tools

in 1977 a seminal paper was published by avinash dixit and joseph stiglitz that revolutionized the modeling of imperfectly competitive markets it launched what might be called the second monopolistic competition revolution which has been far more successful than the first one initiated by edward chamberlin and joan robinson in the 1930s in this 2003 collection of essays experts in the fields of macroeconomics international trade theory economic geography and international growth theory address the question of why the second revolution was so successful they also highlight what is missing and look forward to the next step in the modeling of imperfectly competitive markets the text includes a comprehensive survey of both monopolistic competition revolutions and previously unpublished working papers by dixit and stiglitz that led to their famous 1977 paper with contributions from dixit ethier neary and stiglitz amongst others this collection will excite interest amongst researchers advanced students and economists

this book proposes that community development has been increasingly influenced and co-opted by a modernist soulless rational philosophy reducing it to a shallow technique for solving community problems in contrast this dialogical approach re-maps the ground of community development practice within a frame of ideas such as dialogue hospitality and depth for the first time community development practitioners are provided with an accessible understanding of dialogue and its relevance to their practice exploring the contributions of internationally significant thinkers such as p freire m buber d bohm and h g gadamer j derrida g esteva and r sennett what makes the book distinctive is that first it identifies a dialogical tradition of community development and considers how such a tradition shapes practice within contemporary contexts and concerns economic social political cultural and ecological second the book contrasts such an approach with technical and instrumental approaches to development that fail to take complex systems seriously third the approach links theory to practice through a combination of storytelling and theory reflection ensuring that readers are drawn into a practice theory that they feel increasingly confident has been tried and tested in the world over the past 25 years

provincial lives tells the story of the development of a regional middle class in the antebellum middle west it traces the efforts of waves of americans to transmit their social structures behavior and values to the west and construct a distinctive regional middle class culture on the urban frontier intertwining local regional and national history with social immigration gender and urban history mahoney examines how a succession of settlers from good society farmers entrepreneurs professionals and genteel men and women from the urban east interacted with accommodated and compromised with those already there to construct a middle class society

this book uncovers the contradictions and convergences of racism decolonisation migration and

living international relations that were shaped by the shift from colonialism to postcolonialism and from nationalism to transnationalism between the 1950s and the present it takes up the story of nicholaos charalambou kanaris a colonial migrant to the uk from cyprus as a reflection on how the everyday lives of minor figures offer an unexplored window into international relations the research uncovers and offers insight into the complexities and messiness of everyday life and of transnational identities as they are lived and have been lived at the heart of imperial colonial and postcolonial systems and processes the innovative methodological approach adopts memoirs gathered through a series of life narrative interviews and is guided by theories of minor transnationalism that look to foreground horizontal relations between minor figures various themes of international relations are examined through the lens of nicholaos story and his family life including colonialism geopolitics citizenship security migration and transnationalism examining how these themes play out in everyday life permits his practice and lived experience to theorise the international politics of colonialism migration and citizenship this book argues that politics and international relations can benefit from a transnational approach and offers a method of theory in practice for exploring the everyday experience of transnationalism through the methodology of life narrative and memoir

the richly diverse population of the mid atlantic region distinguished it from the homogeneity of puritan new england and the stark differences of the plantation south that still dominate our understanding of early america in many identities one nation liam riordan explores how the american revolution politicized religious racial and ethnic identities among the diverse inhabitants of pennsylvania delaware and new jersey attending to individual experiences through a close comparative analysis riordan explains the transformation from british subjects to u s citizens in a region that included quakers african americans and pennsylvania germans in the face of a gradually emerging sense of nationalism varied forms of personal and group identities took on heightened public significance in the revolutionary delaware valley while quakers in burlington new jersey remained suspect after the war because of their pacifism newly freed slaves in new castle delaware demanded full inclusion and bilingual pennsylvania germans in easton pennsylvania successfully struggled to create a central place for themselves in the new nation by placing the public contest over the proper expression of group distinctiveness in the context of local life riordan offers a new understanding of how cultural identity structured the early jacksonian society of the 1820s as a culmination of the american revolution in this region this compelling story brings to life the popular culture of the revolutionary delaware valley through analysis of wide ranging evidence from architecture folk art clothing and music to personal papers newspapers and local church tax and census records the study s multilayered local perspective allows us to see how the revolutionary upheaval of the colonial status quo penetrated everyday life and stimulated new understandings of the importance of cultural diversity in the revolutionary nation

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
