Do They Hear You When Cry Fauziya Kassindja Do They Hear You When You Cry Fauziya Kassindja and the Fight for Freedom The year is 1994 Fauziya Kassindja a 17yearold girl from Togo finds herself trapped in a horrifying situation She has been promised to a man twice her age in an arranged marriage a fate she vehemently refuses Escaping the clutches of her family and their cruel tradition she embarks on a perilous journey ultimately arriving in the United States seeking asylum Yet upon reaching the land of the free she faces a new nightmare detention Fauziyas story a stark testament to the universal human desire for freedom and self determination resonated deeply with the world It exposed the brutal reality of female genital mutilation FGM and the desperate lengths women would go to escape it Her case initially dismissed by immigration officials eventually became a rallying cry for human rights activists and ignited a public debate about the complexities of asylum seeking and the global struggle against FGM A Journey of Fear and Hope Fauziyas journey began with a harrowing escape from Togo Forced to flee her home she traveled through Benin Niger and finally to Ghana Along the way she endured unimaginable hardships hunger exhaustion and the constant threat of violence Her decision to seek asylum in the United States was fueled by a desperate hope for a life free from the shackles of tradition and the impending threat of FGM Upon arriving in America she was detained by the US Immigration and Naturalization Service INS a harrowing experience that mirrored the imprisonment she had sought to escape Despite her compelling narrative of fleeing persecution the INS initially denied her asylum application citing a lack of credible evidence to support her claims The Struggle for Recognition Fauziyas case became a symbol of the larger fight against FGM Her story was brought to the attention of human rights organizations and the media who highlighted the injustice of her detention and the need for broader recognition of FGM as a human rights violation Legal experts activists and even lawmakers rallied behind Fauziyas case They pointed to the devastating physical and psychological consequences of FGM arguing that it amounted to torture and a violation of womens basic human rights They also challenged the INSs restrictive interpretation of asylum law which failed to fully account for the unique challenges faced by women seeking refuge from cultural practices like FGM A Turning Point in the Fight Against FGM Fauziyas case sparked a crucial shift in the international discourse on FGM It forced the US government to acknowledge the severity of the practice and its devastating impact on womens lives Eventually after a long and arduous legal battle Fauziya was granted asylum in the United States Her story became a turning point in the fight against FGM It inspired countless women to speak out against the practice leading to greater awareness and activism around the world The case also prompted a reevaluation of asylum laws and the need to provide more comprehensive support for women fleeing persecution based on cultural practices like FGM A Legacy of Hope and Resilience Fauziyas case serves as a powerful reminder of the resilience of the human spirit in the face of oppression Her story highlights the importance of fighting for justice even when the odds seem insurmountable It also underscores the need for international cooperation and commitment to protecting the rights of women and girls everywhere Despite the hardships she endured Fauziya emerged from her ordeal as a symbol of hope and empowerment She has become a leading advocate for the rights of women and girls using her platform to speak

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like the bestsellers princess and not without my daughter do they hear you when you cry tells the dramatic compulsively readable story of a woman fighting to free herself from the injustices of her culture fauziya kassindja s harrowing story begins in togo africa where she enjoyed a sheltered childhood shielded by her progressive father from the tribal practice of polygamy and genital

mutilation but when her father died in 1993 fauziya's life changed dramatically at the age of seventeen she was forced to marry a man she barely knew who already had three wives and prepare for the tribal ritual practice of genital mutilation a practice that is performed without painkillers or antibiotics but hours before the ritual was to take place fauziya's sister helped her escape to germany and from there she travelled to the united states seeking asylum and freedom instead she was stripped shackled and imprisoned for sixteen months by the immigration and naturalization service enter layli miller bashir a twenty three year old law student who took on fauziya's case when the two women met layli found a broken emaciated girl with whom she forged an extraordinary friendship putting her heart into fauziya's case layli enlisted help from the american university international human rights clinic the clinic's acting director karen musalo an expert in refugee law assembled a team to fight on fauziya's behalf ultimately in a landmark decision that has given hope to many seeking asylum on the grounds of gender based persecution fauziya was granted asylum on 13 june 1996 here for the first time is fauziya's dramatic personal story told in her own words vividly detailing her life as a young woman in togo and her nightmarish day to day existence in american prisons it is a story of faith and freedom courage and inspiration one that you will not easily forget

to the western eye there is something jarringly incongruous even shocking about the image of a six year old girl being held down by loving relatives so that her genitals can be cut yet two million girls experience this each year most westerners upon learning of the practice of female circumcision have responded with outrage those committed to improving the status of women have gone beyond outrage to action by creating various programs for eradicating the practice but few understand the real life complexities families face in deciding whether to follow the traditional practices or to take the risk of change in the female circumcision controversy ellen gruenbaum points out that western outrage and western efforts to stop genital mutilation often

provoke a strong backlash from people in the countries where the practice is common she looks at the validity of western arguments against the practice in doing so she explores both outsider and insider perspectives on female circumcision concentrating particularly on the complex attitudes of the individuals and groups who practice it and on indigenous efforts to end it gruenbaum finds that the criticisms of outsiders are frequently simplistic and fail to appreciate the diversity of cultural contexts the complex meanings and the conflicting responses to change drawing on over five years of fieldwork in sudan where the most severe forms of genital surgery are common gruenbaum shows that the practices of female circumcision are deeply embedded in sudanese cultural traditions in religious moral and aesthetic values and in ideas about class ethnicity and gender her research illuminates both the resistance to and the acceptance of change she shows that change is occurring as the result of economic and social developments the influences of islamic activists the work of sudanese health educators and the efforts of educated african women that does not mean that there is no role for outsiders gruenbaum asserts and she offers suggestions for those who wish to help facilitate change by presenting specific cultural contexts and human experiences with a deep knowledge of the tremendous variation of the practice and meaning of female circumcision gruenbaum provides an insightful analysis of the process of changing this complex highly debated practice

women around the world routinely suffer from beatings rape torture and murder these are not the practices of a few demented individuals but are often institutionalized culturally sanctioned behaviors millions of women live in a constant state of isolation terror and fear for most escape is nearly impossible due to economic social or cultural restrictions forsaken females describes the many types of global brutalization that occur against women including feticide infanticide female genital mutilation sexual slavery honor killing acid attacks trafficking dowry death rape and intimate partner violence the violence is varied in both method and practice and is often supported by patriarchal ideologies or policies that maintain the social conditions and cultural framework that accept women s brutalization forsaken females also addresses the physical emotional and economic impact of the violence the discussion is structured around the experiences of women who describe their personal victimization each chapter concludes with examples of promising policies and practices developed to address and reduce violence perpetrated against women

according to susan deller ross many human rights advocates still do not see women s rights as human rights yet women in many countries suffer from laws practices customs and cultural and religious norms that consign them to a deeply inferior status advocates might conceive of human rights as involving torture extrajudicial killings or cruel and degrading treatment all clearly in violation of international human rights and think those issues irrelevant to women yet is female genital mutilation practiced on millions of young girls and even infants not a gross violation of human rights when a family decides to murder a daughter in the name of honor is that not an

extrajudicial killing when a husband rapes or savagely beats his wife knowing the legal authorities will take no action on her behalf is that not cruel and degrading treatment women's human rights is the first human rights casebook to focus specifically on women's human rights rich with interdisciplinary material the book advances the study of the deprivation and violence women suffer due to discriminatory laws religions and customs that deny them their most fundamental freedoms it also provides present and future lawyers the legal tools for change demonstrating how human rights treaties can be used to obtain new laws and court decisions that protect women against discrimination with respect to employment land ownership inheritance subordination in marriage domestic violence female genital mutilation polygamy child marriage and the denial of reproductive rights ross examines international and regional human rights treaties in depth including treaty language and the jurisprudence and general interpretive guidelines developed by human rights bodies by studying how international human rights law has been and can be implemented at the domestic level through local courts and legislatures readers will understand how to call upon these newly articulated human rights to help bring about legislation court decisions and executive action that protect women from human rights violations
