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this volume features 19 original chapters on adam smith s conception of modernity the contributions demonstrate the relevance of smith as the great interpreter of modernity 250 years after the publication of the wealth of nations the chapters in part 1 focus on structural aspects of smith s work they cover topics such as smith as the theorist of a spontaneous order the systematic dimension of smith s theoretical construction and smith s role as a historian of economic thought part 2 addresses smith s conception of modern subjectivity between lectures on rhetoric and belles lettres theory of moral sentiments and wealth of nations here the contributors consider the figure of the smithian merchant and the importance of ridicule and satire for understanding modern civility and comment on the role of sympathy imagination and moral judgement in developing a sense of self the condition of the modern man in society and the virtue of self command part 3 focuses on the crucial question of the relationship between ethics and economics discussing the link between efficiency equity and justice the nature of smith s theory of value and the ethical connotation of smith s critique part 4 deals with topics inherent to the functional dynamics and development process of the smithian commercial society these topics include law and authority the relationship between work and freedom the parable of the poor man s son and the economic and political consequences of the new secular orthodoxy finally the chapters in part 5 explore themes related to history and the smithian idea of progress they focus on the link between trade and progress of civilization smith s modern sociological vision of mass commercial societies smith s judgement on savage and premodern societies and the controversial question of the immanentistic or providentialist perspective from which smith considers both the social dynamics and the historical process adam smith and modernity will appeal to scholars and advanced students on 18th century philosophy the history of economic thought and the history of social and political philosophy

this is the first work to address the legacy of wilfred cantwell smith 1916 2000 whose intellectual and institutional contributions helped shape the field of religious studies in the latter half of the twentieth century as a young scholar smith taught indian and

islamic history in lahore for several years and witnessed the partition of india upon his return to north america he obtained his phd at princeton university before embarking upon a long and distinguished career he founded the institute of islamic studies at mcgill university and served as director of the center for the study of world religions at harvard university smith emphasized the place of the scholarly study of islam in the western academy long before islam occupied its current position at the center of global politics challenged the notion of monolithic world religions and argued for the importance of dialogical processes and a personalist approach to the study of religion contributors to this volume many of whom were smith s students provide a wide ranging exploration of his influence and legacy

francis palmer smith was the principal designer of atlanta based pringle and smith one of the leading firms of the early twentieth century south smith was an academic eclectic who created traditional history based architecture grounded in the teachings of the cole des beaux arts as the architecture of francis palmer smith shows smith was central to the establishment of the beaux arts perspective in the south through his academic and professional career after studying with paul philippe cret at the university of pennsylvania smith moved to atlanta in 1909 to head the new architecture program at the georgia institute of technology he would go on to train some of the south s most significant architects including philip trammell shutze flippen burge preston stevens ed ively and lewis e crook jr in 1922 smith formed a partnership with robert s pringle in atlanta savannah chattanooga jacksonville sarasota miami and elsewhere smith built office buildings hotels and art deco skyscrapers buildings at georgia tech the baylor school in chattanooga and the darlington school in rome georgia gothic revival churches standardized bottling plants for coca cola and houses in a range of traditional period styles in the suburbs smith s love of medieval architecture culminated with his 1962 masterwork the cathedral of st philip in atlanta as his career drew to a close modernism was establishing itself in america smith s

own modern aesthetic was evidenced in the more populist modern of art deco but he never embraced the abstract machine aesthetic of high modern robert m craig details the role of history in design for smith and his generation who believed that architecture is an art and that ornament cultural reference symbolism and tradition communicate to clients and observers and enrich the lives of both this book was supported in part by generous grants from the graham foundation for advanced studies in the fine arts and the georgia tech foundation inc

for the past thirty to forty years cultural analysis has focused on developing terms to explain the surpassing of modernity discussion is stranded in an impasse between those who view the term modernity with automatic disdain as deterministic eurocentric or imperialistic and a booming interest that is renewing the study of modernism another dilemma is that the urge to move away from or beyond modernity arises because it is viewed as difficult even unsavoury yet there has always been a view of modernity as somehow difficult to live with and that has been said by figures we regard today as typical modernists mcnamara argues in this book that it is time to forget the quest to surpass modernity instead we should re examine a legacy that continues to inform our artistic conceptions our political debates our critical justifications even if that legacy is baffling and contradictory we may find it difficult to live with but without recourse to this legacy our critical cultural ambitions would remain seriously diminished how do we explain the culture we live in today and how do we as citizens make sense of it this book suggests these questions have become increasingly difficult to answer

general is but a single factor in the total scheme of human and divine purposes and that whatever the technique of satisfying the wealth interest may prove to be the place of that interest in the whole harmony of human relations has to be established by a calculus in whose equations the formulas of economic technique are merely subordinate terms all of this was understood by smith's friend dugald stewart and it was uttered by him with sufficient clearness more than a century ago it may assist our own insight to recall some of his words 1 the foregoing very imperfect hints appear to me to form not only a proper but in some measure a necessary introduction to the few remarks i have to offer on mr smith's inquiry as they tend to illustrate a connection between his system of commercial politics sic and those speculations of his earlier years in which he aimed more professedly at the advancement of human improvement and happiness it is this view of political economy that can alone render it interesting to the moralist and can dignify calculations of profit and loss in the eye of the philosopher mr smith has alluded to it in various passages of his work but he has nowhere

much of the work done on the post45 literary field carries an implicitly americanist perspective even the name of the field suggests a certain literary history with certain assumptions and blind spots about national spaces identities and histories but what would post45 look like when considered from outside of the united states how do the current contours of the field exclude certain voices either in the united states or elsewhere in the world and how would such new perspectives shift the beginning and possible endpoint of that literary period what new narratives of the contemporary emerge if we begin telling the story in a different year or from a different national or global perspective this collection attempts to re frame the discussions in post45 by engaging with non american writers texts and perspectives additionally productive conversations emerge by attempting to think of canonical american writers like mark twain and ishmael reed from other national and global perspectives the authors consider both the ways texts themselves as well as their reception histories approach and challenge our understandings of the contemporary ultimately the collection interrogates prevailing narratives of history culture identity and space within the post45 field in so doing it re considers the historical periodization of the field which currently covers approximately 75 years of literary history the resulting essays thus work towards a new intertwined narrative about what defines the contemporary and how national and global literatures fit into that moment of world history

this 1985 book studies the relation between the individual and collective processes which is central to the social sciences

a radical reinterpretation of adam smith that challenges economists moral philosophers political theorists and intellectual historians to rethink him and why he matters adam smith has long been recognized as the father of modern economics more recently scholars have emphasized his standing as a moral philosopher one who was prepared to critique markets as well as to praise them but smith s contributions to political theory are still underappreciated and relatively neglected in this bold revisionary book paul sagar argues that not only have the fundamentals of smith s political thought been widely misunderstood but that once we understand them correctly our estimations of smith as economist and as moral philosopher must radically change rather than seeing smith either as the prophet of the free market or as a moralist who thought the dangers of commerce lay primarily in the corrupting effects of trade sagar shows why smith is more thoroughly a political thinker who made major contributions to the history of political thought smith sagar argues saw war not commerce as the engine of political change and he was centrally concerned with the political not moral dimensions of and threats to commercial societies in this light the true contours and power of smith s foundational contributions to western political thought emerge as never before offering major reinterpretations of smith s

political moral and economic ideas adam smith reconsidered seeks to revolutionize how he is understood in doing so it recovers smith s original way of doing political theory one rooted in the importance of history and the necessity of maintaining a realist sensibility and from which we still have much to learn

scientific culture was one of the defining characteristics of the english enlightenment the latest discoveries were debated in homes institutions and towns around the country but how did the dissemination of scientific knowledge vary with geographical location what were the differing influences in town and country and from region to region enlightenment modernity and science provides the first full length study of the geographies of georgian scientific culture in england the author takes the reader on a tour of the principal arenas in which scientific ideas were disseminated including home town and countryside to show how cultures of science and knowledge varied across the georgian landscape taking in key figures such as erasmus darwin abraham bennett and joseph priestley along the way it is a work that sheds important light on the complex geographies of georgian english scientific culture

arguing that contemporary celebrity authors like zadie smith ian mcewan martin amis kazuo ishiguro salman rushdie eimear mcbride and anna burns position their work and public personae within a received modernist canon to claim and monetize its cultural capital in the lucrative market for literary fiction this book also shows how the corporate conditions of marketing and

branding have redefined older models of literary influence and innovation it contributes to a growing body of criticism focused on contemporary literature as a field in which the formal and stylistic experimentation that came to define a canon of early 20th century modernism has been renewed contested and revised other critics have celebrated these renewals variously arguing that contemporary literature picks up on modernism's unfinished aesthetic revolutions in ways that have expanded the imaginative possibilities for fiction and revived questions of literary autonomy in the wake of postmodern nihilism while this is a compelling thesis and one that rightly questions an artificial and problematic periodization that still lingers in academic criticism those approaches generally fail to address the material conditions that structure literary production and the generation of cultural capital whether in the historical development of modernism or its contemporary permutations this book addresses this absence by proposing a materialist history of modernism's afterlives

mormonism's founder joseph smith claimed to have translated ancient scriptures he dictated an american bible from metal plates reportedly buried by ancient jews in a nearby hill and produced an egyptian book of abraham derived from funerary papyri he extracted from a collection of mummies he bought from a traveling showman in addition he rewrote sections of the king james version as a new translation of the bible smith and his followers used the term translation to describe the genesis of these english scriptures which remain canonical for the church of jesus christ of latter day saints whether one believes him or not the discussion has focused on whether smith's english texts represent literal translations of extant source documents on closer inspection though smith's translations are far more metaphysical than linguistic in joseph smith's translation samuel morris brown argues that these translations express the mystical power of language and scripture to interconnect people across barriers of space and time especially in the developing mormon temple liturgy he shows that smith was devoted to an ancient metaphysics especially the principle of correspondence the concept of as above so below that provided an infrastructure for bridging the human and the divine as well as for his textual interpretive projects joseph smith's projects of metaphysical translation place mormonism at the

productive edge of the transitions associated with shifts toward secular modernity this transition into modern worldviews intensified complexly in nineteenth century america the evolving legacies of reformation and enlightenment were the sea in which early mormons swam says brown smith s translations and the theology that supported them illuminate the power and vulnerability of the mormon critique of american culture in transition this complex critique continues to resonate and illuminate to the present day

in this accessible book gavin kennedy takes a fresh look at adam smith s moral philosophy and its links to his political economy and his lectures on jurisprudence the book provides a new analysis of wealth of nations and argues that adam smith s intellectual legacy was completely transformed in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries by economists pursuing different agendas to create ideas and policies that smith did not advocate it also provides a new explanation for the main mysteries about smith s later life

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
