kingdoms incorporated the few extant roman institutions monasteries were founded as campaigns to christianise pagan europe continued the franks under the carolingian dynasty briefly established the carolingian empire during the later 8th and early 9th century it covered much of western europe but later succumbed to the pressures of internal civil wars combined with external invasions vikings from the north magyars from the east and saracens from the south

of the 15 essays in this book 11 have been published elsewhere between 1957 and 1981 they cover no single topic but range over a number of disparate texts and issues
