herodotus was the first writer in the west to conceive the value of creating a record of the recent past he found a way to co ordinate the often conflicting data of history ethnology and culture the historical method of herodotus explores the intellectual habits and the literary principles of this pioneer writer of prose donald lateiner argues against the perception that herodotus work seems amorphous and ill organized that the histories contain their own definition of historical significance he examines patterns of presentation and literary structure in narratives speeches and direct communications to the reader in short the conventions and rhetoric of history as herodotus created it this rhetoric includes the use of recurring themes the relation of speech to reported actions indications of doubt stylistic idiosyncrasies frequent reference to nonverbal behaviours and strategies of opening and ending lateiner shows how herodotus sometimes suppresses information on principle and sometimes compels the reader to choose among contending versions of events his inventories of herodotus methods allow the reader to focus on typical practice not misleading exception in his analysis of the structuring concepts of the histories lateiner scrutinizes herodotean time and chronology he considers the historian s admiration for ethnic freedom and autonomy the rule of law and the positive values of conflict despite these apparent biases he argues the text s intellectual and moral preferences present a generally cool and detached account from which an authorial personality rarely emerges the historical method of herodotus illuminates the idiosyncrasies and ambitious nature of a major text in classics and the western tradition and touches on aspects of historiography ancient history rhetoric and the history of ideas

samuel adams engages the classic problem of the relation between faith and history from the perspective of apocalyptic theology in critical dialogue with the work of n t wright he argues that historical and theological scholars must take into consideration at a methodological level the reality of god that has invaded history in jesus christ

guilds and conferences have grown up around historical theology yet no volume has ever been dedicated to the definition and illustration of the method undergirding historical theology this volume both defines and illustrates the methodology of historical theology especially as it relates to the study of early christianity and situates historical theology among other methodological

approaches to early christianity including confessional apologetics constructive theology and socio cultural history historical theology as a discipline stands in contrast to these other approaches to the study of early christianity in contrast to systematic or constructive approaches it remains essentially historical with a desire to elucidate the past rather than speak to the present in contrast to socio historical approaches it remains essentially theological with a concern to value and understand the full complexity of the abstract thought world that stands behind the textual tradition of early christian theology moreover historical theology is characterized by the methodological presupposition that unless good reason exists to think otherwise the theological accounts of the ancient church articulate the genuine beliefs of their authors the significance of this volume lies in the methodological definition it offers the strength of this volume lies in the fact that its definition of the historical method of studying theology is not the work of a single mind but that of over twenty respected scholars many of whom are leaders in the field the volume begins with an introductory essay that orients readers to various approaches to early christian literature it moves to two technical essays that define the historical method of studying early christian theology and then it illustrates the practice of this method with more than twenty essays that cover a period stretching from the first century to the dawn of the seventh

this treatise of historical methodology originally published in 1950 is based upon a liberal conception of history which excludes no narrator of past events from the ranks of historians it defines history as the accurate story which preserves the memory of the past experiences of human societies the function of history determines its method and provides the answer to the question how secure is our knowledge of the past in the author's view history is empirical and its results are for ever provisional the relative merits of dogmatism and scepticism are examined and several interpretations among english historians are scrutinized

this bibliography provides the reader with a comprehensive reference tool that will enhance understanding of methodological issues and enable the user to employ research methods appropriate to their subject of study it also provides accounting historians a comprehensive data base for the development of papers addressing methodological issues in an accounting history context access to this type of resource is particularly crucial to the development of accounting history research since the number of papers dealing with methodological issues published in accounting history literature is very small hence the references in this bibliography are drawn from the literature of general history economic and business history legal and social history and philosophy the scope and range of its

contents are broad references are taken from texts as well as papers published in over 450 journals

no discipline has been more praised or more criticized than the writing of history cioero claimed that history teaches men how to live aris totle denied it the very name of science and regwded poetry as the higher wisdom at various times history has been assigned a command ing or a demeaning statius in the hierarchy of sciences today one can admire the increasing precision and sophistication of the methods used by historia ns on the other hand thucydides history of the pezo ponesian war still serves as the ideal model of how to reconstruct the historical past even those who deny the possibility of an objective reconstruction of the past would themselves likie to be recorded by historians objectively or not dislike of history and fear of its verdict are not incompatible with reverence and awe for its practitioners the historians so man s attitude to history is ambiguous the controversy about history continues widely differing issues are at stake historians themselves however are the least engaged in the struggle rarely does a historian decide to open the door of his study and join in the melee about the meaning of history more often he slams it shut and returns to his studies oblivious of the fact that with the passage of thne the gap between his scientific work and its audience might widen the historian does not shun the battle he merely chooses his own battleground
