this comprehensive collection of carefully edited documents speeches treaties statements and articles traces the rise and fall of the cold war the sources follow the cold war from its roots in east west tensions at the end of world war ii to the collapse of the soviet union in 1991 set in historical context by the editors concise introductions and followed by thoughtful discussion questions the documents are arranged in chronological order starting with the yalta conference and ending with gorbachev s resignation speech drawing on selections from a variety of countries and leaders involved in this prolonged global struggle the editors treat the entire cold war as an era in world history not just u s history their judicious selection makes the great events of the time come alive through the words and phrases of those who were actively involved

the cold war offers a brief but detailed treatment of one of the most complex eras of the 20th century in this fully revised second edition j p d dunbabin drawing on international scholarship and using much new material from communist sources describes a world in which covert operations could be as important as outright diplomacy soft power as influential as hard and in which competing ideologies ruled the hearts as much as the heads of the leaders in power dunbabin s account is global in scope taking into account the importance of players beyond the superpowers and shedding light on the proxy conflicts

such as those in africa and the middle east that if not caused by the continuing stalemate between the great powers were used as weapons within it

the cold war shaped the world we live in today its politics economics and military affairs this book shows how the globalization of the cold war during the last century created the foundations for most of the key conflicts we see today including the war on terror it focuses on how the third world policies of the two twentieth century superpowers the united states and the soviet union gave rise to resentments and resistance that in the end helped topple one superpower and still seriously challenge the other ranging from china to indonesia iran ethiopia angola cuba and nicaragua it provides a truly global perspective on the cold war and by exploring both the development of interventionist ideologies and the revolutionary movements that confronted interventions the book links the past with the present in ways that no other major work on the cold war era has succeeded in doing

the cold war examines the complex arguments which divided east and west following the end of the second world war and analyzes its eight major phases including the emergence of the cold war coexistence and detente glasnost in the late 1980s combining factual overview and background discussion of the key issues such as the nuclear threat and who if anyone won the cold war with analysis of source material students will find this a must have in the study of this major historical event

primary and secondary sources examine key issues of the cold war from the end of world war ii to the disintegration of the soviet union in 1991 although no war was officially declared for over four decades the soviet union and the united states waged an ideological battle that at times carried the threat of nuclear war in this anthology those who shaped the cold war and those reflecting on its impact debate the strategies these nations used to expand or protect their spheres of influence as the united states and the soviet union moved from confrontation to cooperation

there are many reference works on the cold war including the cold war encyclopedia 1996 and the recent historical dictionary of the cold war 2000 these works put a crucial period of the twentieth century into perspective they share an international focus driven in part by the global nature of the cold war the events that defined it and the people who fought it this new encyclopedia takes a different tack focusing almost exclusively on american domestic events and issues and touching on international themes only when they are relevant to the u s scene more than 700 entries are arranged alphabetically beginning with acheson dean secretary of state from 1949 to 1953 and ending with yuppies an anti establishment degreesb radical element of the hippie movement in between are entries on presidents and their opponents civil rights groups and leaders phrases and definitions the length of each entry ranging from 100 2 500 words reflects the importance of the subject or the depth of coverage needed acheson s boss harry truman earns just over four columns while truman s opponent in the infamous 1948 general election thomas dewey barely rates one column each entry is factual and concise the entry on martin luther king jr mentions his early life and education his adherence to gandhi s policy of nonviolence the march on washington and his assassination in tennessee avoiding the various controversies surrounding both king s life and death sometimes the generally objective tone of the work is missing as when for example it defines communism as paradoxical and self defeating black and white photographs enhance the text and the index is detailed this volume is a worthy addition to the cold war reference shelf its coverage of people places and events that might be ignored in works with a more international perspective makes it a good starting point for anyone interested in an american focus recommended for high school public and academic libraries rbb copyright r american library association all rights r
