the appeal to our obligations to future generations is one of the most forceful emotional and effective arguments available to politicians and citizens and is the cornerstone of all modern policies aimed at sustainable development yet the exact nature and extent of these obligations are unclear who owes what to whom exactly and why this highly accessible book provides an extensive and comprehensive overview of current research and theory about why and how we should protect future generations it exposes how and why the interests of people today and those of future generations are often in conflict and what can be done it rebuts critical concepts such as parfits non identity paradox and beckerman s denial of any possibility of intergenerational justice the core of the book is the lucid application of a veil of ignorance to derive principles of intergenerational justice which show that our duties to posterity are stronger than is often supposed tremmel s approach demands that each generation both

consider and improve the well being of future generations to measure the well being of future generations tremmel employs the human development index rather than the metrics of utilitarian subjective happiness the book thus answers in detailed concrete terms the two most important questions of every theory of intergenerational justice what to sustain and how much to sustain ultimately this book provides a theory of intergenerational justice that is both intellectually robust and practical with wide applicability to law policy economics climate change and all other contexts that affect future generations

funding for future pensions concerns about ethics between generations are everywhere in this volume sixteen philosophers explore intergenerational justice part one examines the ways in which various theories of justice look at the matter these include libertarian rawlsian sufficientarian contractarian communitarian marxian and reciprocity based approaches in part two the authors look more specifically at issues relevant to each of these theories such as motivation to act fairly towards future generations the population dimension the formation of preferences through education and how they impact on our intergenerational obligations and whether it is fair to rely on constitutional devices

focusing on contemporary social issues the environmental crisis population growth and demographic change and the question of whether reparations are owed to indigenous peoples this study presents a theory of intergenerational justice that gives citizens duties to past and future generations and explains what relationships between contemporary generations count as fair

the united nations 2030 agenda for sustainable development makes climate change and responsible consumption key priorities for both industrialized and emerging economies moving beyond the global north this book uses innovative cross national and cross generational research with urban residents in china and uganda as well as the uk to illuminate international debates about building sustainable societies and to examine how different cultures think about past present and future responsibility for climate change the authors explore to what extent different nations see climate change as a domestic issue whilst looking at local explanatory and blame narratives to consider profound questions of justice between those nations that are more and less responsible for and vulnerable to climate change
