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schizophrenia has long puzzled researchers in the fields of psychiatric medicine and anthropology
why is it that the rates of developing schizophrenia long the poster child for the biomedical model
of psychiatric illness are low in some countries and higher in others and why do migrants to
western countries find that they are at higher risk for this disease after they arrive t m luhrmann
and jocelyn marrow argue that the root causes of schizophrenia are not only biological but also

sociocultural this book gives an intimate personal account of those living with serious psychotic disorder in the united states india africa and southeast asia it introduces the notion that social defeat the physical or symbolic defeat of one person by another is a core mechanism in the increased risk for psychotic illness furthermore care as usual treatment as it occurs in the united states actually increases the likelihood of social defeat while care as usual treatment in a country like india diminishes it

interrogating the relationship between women and psychosis from a variety of perspectives this edited collection explores personal literary spiritual psychological biological and psychodynamic approaches the contributors reflect on medieval mystics and witches postpartum psychosis disordered eating art and literature feminism and male female differences in schizophrenia women with experience of psychosis psychotherapists and a shaman provide first person accounts to give the book a personal grounding curated with the intent to expand the way we think about women and psychosis the contributors to this collection recognize that voices and visions do not occur in a vacuum but are experienced within and are influenced by particular socio cultural contexts

this book discusses what jacques lacan s oeuvre contributes to our understanding of psychosis presenting a close reading of original texts stijn vanheule proposes that lacan s work on psychosis can best be framed in terms of four broad periods

in the 100 years since eugen bleuler unveiled his concept of schizophrenia which had dissociation at its core the essential connection between traumatic life events dissociative processes and psychotic symptoms has been lost psychosis trauma and dissociation is the first book to attempt to reforge this connection by presenting challenging new findings linking these now disparate fields and by comprehensively surveying from a wide range of perspectives the complex relationship between dissociation and psychosis a cutting edge sourcebook psychosis trauma and dissociation brings together highly respected professionals working in the psychosis field with renowned clinicians and researchers from the fields of traumatic stress dissociation and the dissociative disorders and will be of interest to those working with or studying psychotic or dissociative disorders as well as trauma related conditions such as borderline personality disorder or complex post traumatic stress disorder it makes an invaluable contribution to the burgeoning literature on severe mental disorders and serious life events the book has three sections connecting trauma and dissociation to psychosis an exploration of the links between trauma dissociation and psychosis from a wide range of historical and theoretical perspectives comparing psychotic and dissociative disorders a presentation of empirical and clinical perspectives on similarities and differences between the two sets of disorders assessing and treating hybrid and boundary conditions consideration of existing and novel diagnostic categories such as borderline personality disorder and dissociative psychosis that blend or border dissociative and psychotic disorders along with treatment perspectives emphasising humanistic and existential concerns

this practical and informative text lays out the product of a number of years of clinical research into suicide behaviour and its prevention while the focus is on non affective psychosis and the schizophrenia spectrum disorders the mechanisms underlying suicide behaviour in this group may well underlie or at least influence suicide behaviour in other disorders the authors describe methods of assessment through individual formulation and a cognitive behavioural intervention through case studies to reduce the risk of suicide this book argues that suicide behaviour lies on a cognitive behavioural continuum from ideation through intention to action mechanisms based on biased information processing systems the development of suicide schema and appraisal styles are likely to be fruitful in explaining suicidal thoughts and behaviours a psychological theory of suicide behaviour is needed in order to develop a mechanism of suicide and to understand the components of suicidal thoughts and behaviours suicide risk can be reduced through the use of the intervention methods described within the text cognitive behavioural prevention of suicide in psychosis evaluates practical applications of contemporary research on this topic and will therefore be of interest to practitioners post graduates in training and researchers studying suicide and or psychosis

this case series book offers a practical and accessible approach to psychiatry addressing major clinical problems ranging from psychosis to aging effects each of which is tackled as it arises in everyday settings with its emphasis on everyday practice strongly linked to underlying theory the book combines clinical knowledge with the realities of managing clinical problems and will provide a basis for developing sound analytical and confident decision making skills presenting different visions of clinical psychiatry and expanding psychiatrists interventions by integrating innovative neuroscience approaches such as neuroimaging neuropsychology tms and cognitive rehabilitation it will help clinicians and students alike gain a sound understanding of the wide range of signs and symptoms that indicate psychiatric disorders and how the diagnosis management and treatment options can differ from those in other medical specialties the volume includes learning activities with questions on each clinical case followed by detailed explanatory answers and self assessment exercises to assist with learning and revision throughout the book tips and key features are highlighted with boxes algorithms tables and figures which the reader can refer back to for exam revision and well into her his career

this handbook examines state of the art research and clinical findings on attenuated psychosis syndrome aps across the globe it addresses symptoms assessment methods and treatment approaches as they differ and converge across countries and cultures the handbook explores how the illness impairs many aspects of daily functioning with high rates of suicide and a reduced life span it details how early detection is critical and may greatly reduce the public health burden of the illness chapters describe the early identification and intervention efforts that are currently underway across the world the book offers international findings from prominent researchers elaborating culturally relevant illness symptoms help seeking behaviors and assessment and intervention strategies in addition chapters illustrate wide variations in symptom expression and

experience reinforcing the necessity of culturally attuned practice in patient centered care the book concludes by examining the implications challenges and opportunities for future research and clinical practices from an international perspective topics featured in the handbook include barriers to service in low resourced countries the role of traditional or culturally acceptable care in developing early intervention models the reliability and validity of tools for assessing and identifying possible medical diagnoses that can present with psychosis symptoms and how to differentiate these conditions from other possible conditions the handbook of attenuated psychosis syndrome across cultures is a must have resource for researchers professors clinicians and related professionals as well as graduate students in child and school psychology psychiatry social work and related disciplines

this book focuses on the priority that psychoanalysis places on the individual how the treatment is conceived theoretically and the ways it can be incorporated in the overall organisation of an institution it brings together the histories of a number of psychoanalytically informed hospitals

in incorporating acceptance and mindfulness into the treatment of psychosis brandon gaudiano brings together the researchers and clinicians working at the cutting edge of acceptance mindfulness therapies for psychosis to compare and contrast emerging approaches and discuss them within the context of the more traditional cognitive behavioral interventions

this is a book written not just by a professional transpersonal psychotherapist but by someone who has walked the heart rending path and experienced the psychological trauma of loving someone in psychosis psychosis which still remains the greatest taboo in society today together with its implicit diagnosis of a lifelong sentence of medication and no cure it is in the main a personal and moving narrative of a mother looking to help her son avoid such a lifelong sentence of medication whilst trying to research holistic resources and alternative approaches for treatment at the same time as negotiating the vagaries of the current mental health system it is often a tale of despair and frustration yet also gives a compassionate voice transpersonal and transgenerational psychotherapeutic insights back up the personal narrative it includes an accessible inquiry into how unconscious forces influence our mind our bodies and the entire family system its hypothesis is that if we cannot understand our own unconscious responses how can we understand those of our loved ones in psychotic episodes

there is abundant evidence showing a strong association between trauma exposure psychotic symptoms and posttraumatic stress disorder ptsd early trauma exposure contributes to the formation of psychotic symptoms and the development of psychotic disorders or severe mental illnesses such as schizophrenia bipolar disorder and treatment refractory major depression furthermore among persons with psychotic disorders multiple traumatization over the lifetime is common due to factors such as social stigma the criminalization of severe mental illness and increased vulnerability to interpersonal victimization in addition to these factors is the traumatic

nature of experiencing psychotic symptoms and coercive treatments such as involuntary hospitalization and being placed in seclusion or restraints not surprisingly these high rates of trauma lead to high rates of PTSD in people with psychotic disorders which are associated with more severe symptoms worse functioning and greater use of acute care services in addition to the impact of trauma on the development of psychotic disorders and comorbid PTSD traumatic experiences such as childhood sexual and physical abuse can shape the nature of prominent psychotic symptoms such as the content of auditory hallucinations and delusional beliefs additionally traumatic experiences have been implicated in the role of stress responsivity and increased risk for transition to psychosis in those identified as being at clinical high risk of developing psychosis finally although the diagnostic criteria for PTSD primarily emphasize the effects of trauma on anxiety avoidance physiological over arousal and negative thoughts it is well established that PTSD is frequently accompanied by psychotic symptoms such as hallucinations and delusions that cannot be attributed to another DSM V axis I disorder such as psychotic depression or schizophrenia understanding the contribution of traumatic experiences to the etiology of psychosis and other symptoms can inform the provision of cognitive behavioral therapy for psychosis including the development of a shared formulation of the events leading up to the onset of the disorder as well as other trauma informed treatments that address distressing and disabling symptoms associated with trauma and psychosis until recently the trauma treatment needs of this population have been neglected despite the high rates of trauma and PTSD in persons with psychotic disorders and in spite of substantial gains made in the treatment of PTSD in the general population fortunately progress in recent years has provided encouraging evidence that PTSD can be effectively treated in people with psychotic disorders using interventions adapted from PTSD treatments developed for the general population in contrast to clinician fears about the untoward effects of trauma focused treatments on persons with a psychotic disorder research indicates that post traumatic disorders can be safely treated and that participants frequently experience symptom relief and improved functioning there is a need to develop a better understanding of the interface between trauma psychosis and post traumatic disorder this frontiers research topic is devoted to research addressing this interface

this practical guide outlines the latest advances in understanding and treating psychotic symptoms and disorders articulating step by step the clinical skills and knowledge required to effectively treat this patient population a clinical introduction to psychosis takes an evidence based approach that encourages a wider perspective on clinical practice with chapters covering stigma and bias cultural factors the importance of social functioning physical health sleep and more a broad array of treatment modalities are discussed including cognitive behavioral therapy cognitive remediation psychosocial interventions trauma informed therapies and recovery oriented practice the book also provides a concise overview of the latest advances regarding cognitive profiles in people with psychotic disorders the developmental progression of cognitive abilities and the clinical relevance of cognitive dysfunction the book additionally familiarizes readers with issues and controversies surrounding diagnostic classification transdiagnostic expression and

dimensional assessment of symptoms in psychosis provides treatment and assessment methods for psychotic symptoms and disorders looks at how psychosis develops and the impact of stigma on clinicians and clients studies the links between trauma ptsd and psychosis as well as sleep and psychosis covers digital technologies for treating and assessing psychosis outlines strategies for treating visual and auditory hallucinations examines how to incorporate consumer and clinician perspectives in clinical practice
