and a well functioning democracy conducting extensive interviews applying a survey to 650 pb delegates doing detailed analysis of budgets and engaging in participant observation wampler finds that the three most important factors explaining the variation are the incentives for mayoral administrations to delegate authority the way civil society organizations and citizens respond to the new institutions and the particular rule structure that is used to delegate authority to citizens
