akasha and enkil queen and king of the vampires in whom the core of the supernatural race resides we follow him through his heartbreaking abandonment of the vampire pandora through him we see the fall of pagan rome to the emperor constantine and the horrific sack of the eternal city itself at the hands of the visigoths bravely marius seeks a new civilization in the midst of glittering constantinople only to meet with the blood drinker eudoxia we see him ultimately returning to his beloved italy where after the horrors of the black death he is restored by the beauty of the renaissance we see him become a painter living dangerously yet happily among mortals giving his heart to the great botticelli to the bewitching courtesan bianca and to the mysterious young apprentice armand moving from rome to florence venice and dresden and to the english castle of the secret scholarly order of the talamasca the novel reaches its dramatic finale in our own time deep in the jungle where marius having told his life story seeks some measure of justice from the oldest vampires in the world

in russia at night a despairing young woman of royal blood runs away from her husband s rich estate carrying her baby in her arms to a new life as an artist 1896 in california on a playground a 10 year old girl calls on her cell phone 911 trying to save her dying grandmother s life 2006 one hundred and ten years separate these two events one hundred and ten years of one russian family seen from a child s perspective in the little girl s eyes is reflected the whole portrait of russia in the 20th century the historical moments life style traditions mentality and fates of its people like one shiny raindrop can sometimes reflect the whole world curse of russia is a page turner book with subtle dramaturgic line and amazing real living characters

this book examines the literary impact of famed british poet barry macsweeney who worked at the forefront of poetic discovery in post war britain agitated equally by politics and the possibilities of artistic experimentation barry macsweeney was ridiculed in the press his literary reputation only recovering towards the end of his life which was cut short by alcoholism with close readings of macsweeney alongside his contemporaries precursors and influences including j h prynne shelley jack spicer and sylvia plath luke roberts offers a fresh introduction to the field of modern poetry richly detailed with archival and bibliographic research this book recovers the social and political context of macsweeney s exciting challenging and controversial impact on modern and contemporary poetry

up to them and at the season s end their paths will diverge with only their hearts as guides kit and muriel must decide if they re willing to race into the unknown for the adventure of a lifetime

several times this is a must read a mesmerizing story written in an exceptionally brilliant way ninie hammon has done it again cora a myers gold promise is the third book in ninie hammon s new series through the canvas a riveting psychological thriller series about an ordinary woman ripped from her life and drawn into dark and thrilling tales by mysterious forces she can t explain get the whole through the canvas series today and start a reading journey you won t want to end

the phenomenal life of ukrainian peasant nestor makhno 1888 1934 provides the framework for this breakneck account of the downfall of the tsarist empire and the civil war that convulsed and bloodied russia between 1917 and 1921 mahkno and his people were fighting for a society without masters or slaves with neither rich nor poor they acted towards that idea by establishing free soviets unlike the soviets drained of all significance by the dictatorship of a one party state the free soviets became the grassroots organs of a direct democracy a living embodiment of the free society until they were betrayed and smashed by the red army delving into a vast array of documentation to which few other historians have had access this study illuminates a revolution that started out with the rosiest of prospects but ended up utterly confounded more than just the incredible exploits of a guerilla revolutionary par excellence skirda weaves the tale of a people and the organizations and practices of anarchism literally fighting for their lives
