growing up once i learned of my true identity i remember letting my environment dictate my behavior in larger groups of boys i was completely out of my element but get me in a group of girls and i was with my peeps i was everyone s friend laughin it up tradin easy baking secrets and dishin on barbie s latest do now fast forward 20 years and it s amazing how environment still dictates my behavior

convert to being heterosexuals in this groundbreaking book longtime psychiatrist martin kantor md himself homosexual and once immersed in therapy to become straight explains why so called reparative therapy is not only ineffective but should not be practiced due its faulty theoretical bases and the deeper lasting damage it can cause this standout work delves into the history of reparative therapy describes the findings of major research studies and discusses outcome studies and ethical and moral considerations author kantor identifies the serious harm that can result from reparative therapy exposes the religious underpinnings of the process and addresses the cognitive errors reparative therapy practitioners make while also recognizing some positive features of this mode of treatment one section of the book is dedicated to discussing the therapeutic process itself with a focus on therapeutic errors that are part of its fabric finally the author identifies affirmative eclectic therapy not reparative therapy as an appropriate avenue for gays who feel they need help with goals of resolving troubling aspects of their lives that may or may not be related to being homosexual and of self acceptance rather than self mutation

polari is a secret form of language mainly used by homosexual men in london and other cities during the twentieth century derived in part from the slang lexicons of numerous stigmatised and itinerant groups polari was also a means of socialising acting out camp performances and reconstructing a shared gay identity and worldview among its speakers this book examines the ways in which polari was used in order to construct gay identities linking its evolution to the changing status of gay men and lesbians in the uk over the past fifty years

2013 finalist for the lambda literary awards lgbt studies category barton argues that conventional southern manners and religious institutions provide a foundation for homophobia in the bible belt in the bible belt it s common to see bumper stickers that claim one man one woman marriage church billboards that command one to get right with jesus letters to the editor comparing gay marriage to marrying one s dog and nightly news about homophobic attacks from the family foundation while some areas of the unites states have made tremendous progress in securing rights for gay people bible belt

states lag behind not only do most bible belt gays lack domestic partner benefits lesbians and gay men can still be fired from some places of employment in many regions of the bible belt for being a homosexual in pray the gay away bernadette barton argues that conventions of small town life rules which govern southern manners and the power wielded by christian institutions serve as a foundation for both passive and active homophobia in the bible belt she explores how conservative christian ideology reproduces homophobic attitudes and shares how bible belt gays negotiate these attitudes in their daily lives drawing on the remarkable stories of bible belt gays barton brings to the fore their thoughts experiences and hard won insights to explore the front lines of our national culture war over marriage family hate crimes and equal rights pray the gay away illuminates their lives as both foot soldiers and casualties in the battle for gay rights

do the conventional insights of depth psychology have anything to offer the gay patient can contemporary psychoanalytic theory be used to make sense of gay identities in ways that are helpful rather than hurtful respectful rather than retraumatizing in psychoanalytic therapy and the gay man jack drescher addresses these very questions as he outlines a therapeutic approach to issues of sexual identity that is informed by traditional therapeutic goals such as psychological integration and more authentic living while still respecting even honoring variations in sexual orientation drescher s exploration of the subjectivities of gay men in psychoanalytic psychotherapy is more than a long overdue corrective to the inadequate and often pathologizing tomes of traditional psychoanalytic writers it is a vitally human testament to the richly varied inner experiences of gay men drescher does not assume that sexual orientation is the entire or even major focus of intensive psychotherapy but he does argue passionately and convincingly that issues of sexual identity which encompass a spectrum of possibilities for any gay man must be addressed in an atmosphere of honest encounter that allows not only for exploration of conflict and dissociation but also for restitutive confirmation of the patient s right to be himself through its abundance of first person testimony from both clinical and literary sources psychoanalytic therapy and the gay man provides the reader with an unforgettable

grasp of what it is like to discover that one is gay in our society and then to find the courage and humanity to live with that knowledge any mental health professional regardless of his or her sexual orientation who wishes to deal therapeutically with gay men will find Drescher's work indispensable but it will also be compelling reading for anyone seeking psychological insight into gay men's lives and concerns

this book explores the everyday lives of gay men in hainan an island province of the people s republic of china taking an ethnographic and phenomenological approach it asks how these men construct and experience ways of sexual being as gay homosexual tongzhi and or in the scene and what these mean for the ways of living they see as possible within a socio cultural political and material context characterised by pervasive heteronormativity it explores what it means for gay men in hainan to come into the scene how internet and mobile technologies figure in their everyday processes of sexual categorisation and how these men negotiate orientations and disorientations towards the future in relation to dominant heterosexual life scripts of marriage and reproduction this book offers vital insights into the production and restriction of non heterosexual lives in diverse settings while addressing universal questions of how certain ways of living are enabled and curtailed in living together with others through powerful conditions of uncertainty and precarity this book will be of interest to scholars in lgbtq studies particularly those with a focus on same sex intimacies and identities in china
