come to texas urged countless advertisements newspaper articles and private letters in the late nineteenth century expansive acres lay fallow ready to be turned to agricultural uses entrepreneurial texans knew that drawing immigrants to those lands meant greater prosperity for the state as a whole and for each little community in it they turned their hands to directing the stream of spatial mobility in american society to texas they told the texas story to whoever would read it in this book barbara rozek documents their efforts shedding light on the importance of their words in peopling the lone star state and on the optimism and hopes of the people who sought to draw others rozek traces the efforts first of the state government until 1876 and then of private organizations agencies businesses and individuals to entice people to texas the appeals in whatever form were to hope hope for lower infant mortality rates business and farming opportunities education marriage and they reflected the hopes of those writing rozek states clearly that the number of words cannot be proven to be linked directly to the number of immigrants texas experienced a population increase of 672 percent between 1860 and 1920 but she demonstrates that understanding the effort is itself important using printed materials and

private communications held in numerous archives as well as pictures of promotional materials she shows the energy and enthusiasm with which texans promoted their native or adopted home as the perfect home for others texas is indeed an immigrant state perhaps by destiny certainly rozek demonstrates by design

texas pride like everything else in the state is larger than life so too perhaps are the state's challenges lone star tarnished approaches public policy in the nation's most populous red state from historical comparative and critical perspectives the historical perspective provides the scope for asking how various policy domains have developed in texas history regularly reaching back to the state's founding and with substantial data for the period 1950 to the present in each chapter cal jillson compares texas public policy choices and results with those of other states and the united states in general finally the critical perspective allows us to question the balance of benefits and costs attendant to what is often referred to as the texas way or the texas model jillson delves deeply into seven substantive policy chapters covering the most important policy areas in which state governments are active through his lively and lucid prose students are well equipped to analyze how texas has done and is doing compared to selected states and the national average over time and today readers will also come away with the necessary tools to assess the many claims of texas's exceptionalism

collection of forty documents dating from the eve of the civil war to the collapse of the confederacy chronicling the civil war in texas

this book is unique among the histories of the texas republic it is the first to examine the fledgling nation from the point of view of its dynamic political life policies with far reaching results were formulated in the nine years of texas independence and the author clearly presents the many thorny issues that were to plague texas for generations the political history of the republic is one of strong figures vying with each other for popular support of their divergent policies the author details the personal feuds and animosities that resulted and shows the effects of these differences on the governing of the nation thoughtful use of diaries memoirs and other contemporary sources gives the reader an excellent understanding of the sense of personal concern the citizens of the republic felt toward the political issues of the day

a native georgian james hughes callahan 1812 1856 migrated to texas to serve in the texas revolution in exchange for land in seguin texas where he settled he met and married a divorcée sarah medissa day 1822 1856 the lives of these two texas pioneers and their extended family would become so entwined in the events and experiences of the nascent nation and state that their story represents a social history of nineteenth century texas from his arrival as a sergeant with the georgia battalion through the ill fated 1855 expedition that bears his name to his shooting death in a feud with a neighbor callahan was a soldier a texas ranger a rancher and a land developer at every turn making his mark on the evolving guadalupe river basin separately sarah's family's journey reflected the experience of many immigrants to texas after its war of independence thomas o mcdonald traces the pair's respective paths to their meeting then follows as together they contend with conflict troublesome social mores the emergence of new industries and the taming of the land along the way helping to shape the texas culture we know today with a sharp eye for character and detail and with a wealth of material at his command author thomas o mcdonald tells a story as crackling with life as it is steeped in scholarly research in these pages the lives of the callahan and day families become a canvas on which the history of texas from revolution frontier defense and indian wars to anglo settlement and emerging legal and social systems dramatically inexorably unfolds

grape man of texas is the first biography of thomas volney munson 1843 1913 the internationally recognized horticulturist who developed over 300 new varieties of grapes some of which are still grown today on almost every continent he is perhaps best known for his work in fighting the phylloxera epidemic of the late nineteenth century which nearly destroyed the world's vineyards his solution grafting vinifera onto certain resistant native rootstocks from texas earned him the chevalier du merite agricole in the french legion of honor and numerous accolades this second edition introduces new insights into the phylloxera period munson's many papers and publications and his far sighted grasp of the needs of twentieth century agriculture and transportation it details the continuing influence of both his research and his hybrid grapes on modern viticulture and new varieties of vitis that have been bred from them around the world

history passed in review along the highways of texas in the century 1761 1860 this was the century of exploration and settlement for the big new land and many thousands of people traveled its trails traders revolutionaries missionaries warriors government agents adventurers refugees gold seekers prospective settlers land speculators army wives and filibusters their reasons for coming were many and varied and the travelers viewed the land and its people with a wide variety of reactions political and industrial revolution famine and depression drove settlers from many of the countries of europe and many of the states of the united states some were displeased with what they found in texas but for many it was a haven a land of renewed hope so large was the migration of people to texas that the land that was virtually unoccupied in 1761 numbered its population at 600 000 a century later several hundred of these travelers left published accounts of their impressions and adventures collectively the accounts tell a panoramic story of the land as its boundaries were drawn and its institutions formed spain gave way to mexico mexico to the republic of texas the republic to

statehood in the united states and statehood in the union was giving way to statehood in the confederate states by 1860 the travelers accounts reflect these changes but more important they tell the story of the receding frontier in travelers in texas 1761 1860 the author examines the texas seen by the traveler writer opening with a chapter about travel conditions in general roads or trails accommodations food she also presents at some length the travelers impressions of the country and its people she then proceeds to examine particular aspects of texas life the indians slavery immigration law enforcement and the individualistic character of the people all as seen through the eyes of the travelers the discussion concludes with a critical essay on sources containing bibliographic discussions of over two hundred of the more important travel accounts

please note this is a companion version not the original book sample book insights 1 the traditional view of the alamo defenders is that they were the highest minded of freedom fighters who died in defense of liberty republican government and democratic principles however many of the men who fought for texas liberty were slave owners 2 the mexican government unlike the american government was opposed to slavery the first americans to settle west of missouri in a vast land ruled by other powers the anglo celts who migrated to texas brought no such enlightened thought with them 3 slavery was a main economic factor in the development of texas and it was defended because few colonists doubted the truth that without it the state would be destroyed 4 the alamo was a symbol of the american dream but it was also a symbol of how easily race mixing could result in a unified people the fear of an abolitionist mexico played on the historic southern based paranoia of the texas colonists

the sons of the republic of texas tells the story of the republic of texas beginning with its birth on april 21 1836 includes a brief history of the sons of the republic of texas from 1893 to the present the text is complemented by over 100 pages of family and ancestral biographies of members of the sons of the republic of texas past and present indexed

ferdinand lindheimer was already renowned as the father of texas botany when in late 1852 he became the founding editor of the neu braunfelser zeitung a german language weekly newspaper for the german settler community on the central texas frontier his first year of publication was a pivotal time for the settlers and the american indians whose territories they occupied based on an analysis of the paper s first year and drawing on methods from documentary and narrative history ethnohistory and literary analysis daniel j gelo and christopher j wickham deliver a new chronicle of the frontier in 1853 in keeping with lindheimer s background as a naturalist the natural resources available are a constant subject for reporting one special concern is the availability and ownership of wood so essential for building lumber fencing and fuel most dramatically the discovery of trace amounts of gold encouraged prospecting by german and anglo settlers which later influenced decisions to remove indians to reservations the activities of the area s indian peoples emerge in weekly details not found in other sources some lipan apaches are killed when the army does not learn of their peaceful intentions restitution is made at fredericksburg a settler named gadt is murdered and tonkawas are suspected a horse raid southeast of san antonio is blamed on the lipans but turns out to be the work of non indians in disguise the delawares are driven temporarily to indian territory comanche men leave their families at fort chadbourne to embark on a raid against the lipans the penateka band of comanches honors the peace agreement they signed with the germans six years earlier but their days in the region are numbered lindheimer enhances the reportage with lengthy features on related subjects and exerts a strong editorial voice as he seeks to influence the development of a distinctive texas german identity his work explained in this new study will appeal not only to students of texas history and ecology indigenous populations immigration intercultural encounters and nineteenth century americana but also to general readers who enjoy the rediscovery of hidden history

the united states today is a divided nation and some say the country may be heading toward breakup or possibly civil war that has happened before and the result was disastrous as many as 750 000 americans perished during the civil war a study of the causes of our last civil war may help to prevent another the knights of the golden circle kgc played a major role in starting the civil war in the united states although intended to remain a secret organization of conspirators it is perhaps the most well documented conspiracy in united states history the goal of the kgc was the creation of a new society separate from the united states dedicated to the preservation and expansion of slavery into latin america the kgc existed in almost every state in the union but nowhere was it as powerful and successful as it was in texas several governors many senators and military leaders were members having taken an oath to support the organization and their fellow members most of the documents generated by the kgc were destroyed after the war ended as its members feared execution for treason not everything was destroyed though this book relies on documents created by the organization and its members that have not previously been used by researchers many members of this organization remained in positions of authority in state affairs after the abolition of slavery this book goes far beyond previous published work in establishing the identities of the members of this organization who promoted and encouraged the most disastrous war in american history randolph w farmer is a native texan from a family whose ancestors first came to texas as early as 1817 when it was still a spanish possession he is the author of two previously published books on texas history

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
