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william terry couch 1901 1988 began his four decade publishing career building the university of north carolina press into one of the nation s leading university presses his editorial attacks on the social ills of the south earned him a reputation as a southern liberal by the 1940s his disaffection with new deal politics turned him toward the right resulting in his 1950 firing as director of the university of chicago press as a conservative couch sought books and articles that would sway general readers from what he saw as an intellectual torpor that accepted the growing role of government in american life the liberals who controlled the presses found him dogmatic and irascible when he tried to turn collier s encyclopedia into a journal of conservative opinion he was fired as editor in chief in 1959 he ended his career as publisher for the libertarian william volker fund which collapsed in the 1960s under charges of nazism couch was committed to publishing as a social cause and strove to disturb american complacency this is the first book length biography of couch a publisher who brought academic scholarship to the reading public to effect social political and economic change

education for empire examines how american public schools created and placed children on multiple and uneven paths to good citizenship these paths offered varying kinds of subordination and degrees of exclusion closely tied to race national origin and us imperial ambitions public school administrators teachers and textbook authors grappled with how to promote and share in the potential benefits of commercial and territorial expansion and in both territories and states how to apply colonial forms of governance to the young populations they professed to prepare for varying future citizenships the book brings together subjects in american history usually treated separately in particular the formation and expansion of public schools and empire building both at home and abroad temporally framed by the 1882 chinese exclusion and 1924 national origins acts two pivotal immigration laws deeply entangled in and telling of us quests for empire case studies in california hawaii georgia new york the southwest and puerto rico reveal that marginalized people contested resisted and blazed alternative paths to citizenship in effect destabilizing the boundaries that white nationalists including many public school officials in the united states and other self described white men s countries worked so hard to create and maintain provided by publisher

including chapters on the major literary genres intellectual political and institutional contexts film and the visual arts this text provides both close analyses of individual works of modernism and a broader set of interpretive narratives

one of the most remarkable education leaders of the late nineteenth century and the creator of the modern american research university finally gets his due daniel coit gilman a yale trained geographer who first worked as librarian at his alma mater led a truly remarkable life he was selected as the third president of the university of california was elected as the first president of johns hopkins university where he served for twenty five years served as one of the original founders of the association of american universities and at an age when most retired was hand picked by andrew carnegie to head up his eponymous institution in washington dc in daniel coit gilman and the birth of the american research university michael t benson argues that gilman s enduring legacy will always be as the father of the modern research university a uniquely american invention that remains the envy of the entire world in the past half century nothing has been written about gilman that takes into account his detailed journals reviews his prodigious correspondence or considers his broad external board service this book fills an enormous void in the history of the birth of the new american system of higher education especially as it relates to graduate education the late 1800s benson points out is one of the most pivotal periods in the development of the american university model this book reveals that there is no more important figure in shaping that model than daniel coit gilman benson focuses on gilman s time deliberating on discussing developing refining and eventually implementing the plan that brought the modern research university to life in 1876 he also explains how many university elements that we take for granted the graduate fellowships the emphasis on primary investigations and discovery the funding of the best laboratory and research spaces the scholarly journals the university presses the sprawling health sciences complexes with teaching hospitals were put in place by gilman at johns hopkins university ultimately the book shows gilman and his colleagues forced all institutions to reexamine their own model and to make the requisite changes to adapt survive thrive compete and contribute
