this much needed work on ethnicity in asia offers a major sociological analysis of hui muslims in contemporary china using both qualitative and quantitative data derived from fieldwork in lanzhou between march 2001 and july 2004 it looks at the contrast between the urban life of the han people the ethnic majority in the city of lanzhou and the hui people the largest ethnic minority in the city and assesses the link between minority ethnicity and traditional behaviour in urban sociology and research on ethnic groups of china in depth interviews and survey data provides a fresh perspective to the study of ethnic behaviour in china and offers a rich account of hui behaviour in seven aspects of urban life neighbouring interaction friendship formation network behaviour mate selection methods spouse choice marital homogamy and household structure contributing to the global discourse on islam religious fundamentalism and modernity this book will be invaluable to anyone interested in chinese society islam religion development urban studies anthropology and ethnicity

urbanization is next to global warming the largest threat to biodiversity indeed it is becoming increasingly evident that many bird species get locally extinct as a result of urban development however many bird species benefit from urbanization especially through the abundance of human provided resources and increase in abundance and densities these birds are intriguing to study in relation to its resilience and adaption to urban environments but also in relation to its susceptibility and the potential costs of urban life this research topic consisting of 30 articles one review two meta analyzes and 27 original data papers provides insights into species and population responses to urbanization through diverse lenses including biogeography community ecology behaviour life

this book investigates urban life in the slums of delhi demonstrating how individuals and communities self organise to solve problems that arise in their neighbourhoods around one quarter of the world s urban population live in informal slum and squatter settlements representing a significant economic and cultural force despite this settlements are often perceived as marginal homogenous places overlooking the resilience and agency of the diverse actors networks and social groups working collectively within them this book draws on extensive qualitative and quantitative data from squatter and resettlement colonies in and around delhi foregrounding the voices of residents to build a bottom up picture of place and urban development the book analyses the contexts in which households operate within their communities and the adaptiveness of individuals living in different slum types with differing levels of governance in doing so the book demonstrates the effect which different institutional agreements and governance systems have on enterprise empowerment resilience trust dignity and engaging in life that has purpose and meaning this book s detailed assessment of slum spaces and networks will be of interest to researchers across a range of fields including international development geography urban planning politics and sociology as well as to policy makers and civil society organisations

diverse driving forces processes and actors are responsible for different trends in the development of megacities and large urban areas under the dynamics of global change megacities are themselves changing on the one hand they are prone to increasing socio economic vulnerability due to pronounced poverty socio spatial and political fragmentation sometimes with extreme forms of segregation disparities and conflicts on the other hand megacities offer positive potential for global transformation e g minimisation of space consumption highly effective use of resources efficient disaster prevention and health care options if good strategies were developed at present in many megacities and urban areas of the developing world and the emerging economies the quality of life is eroding most of the megacities have grown to unprecedented size and the pace of urbanisation has far exceeded the growth of the necessary infrastructure and services as a result an increasing number of urban dwellers are left without access to basic amenities like clean drinking water fresh air and safe food additionally social inequalities lead to subsequent and significant intra urban health inequalities and unbalanced disease burdens that can trigger conflict and violence between subpopulations the guiding idea of our book lies in a multi and interdisciplinary approach to the complex topic of megacities and urban health that can only be adequately understood when different disciplines share their knowledge and methodological tools to work together we hope that the book will allow readersto deepen their understanding of the complex dynamics of urban and megacity populations through the lens of public health geographical and other research perspectives
