the universe is collapsing and only someone with might over all can save life from extinction god the almighty has to re create the universe in a positive dimension to undo its pattern of ultimate destruction this bok reveals the events leading up to the present situation the task god the almighty has to accomplish is described in detail this account of things to come is more than just prophecy it is the work establishing the spiritual patterns that will trigger and determine the events of the change of dimensions on this planet in the solar system and throughout the entire universe

this book offers a tour of the known galaxy here defined as the region of interstellar space closest to earth the phrase the known galaxy has a particular resonance in science fiction as it refers to the part of the milky way that from the perspective of a point in time centuries from now may have been explored and settled by human beings in the known galaxy there are gloomy ocean worlds illuminated by the light of exploding stars there are worlds where precious gems could be as common as pebbles there are

planets eternally wandering between the stars like the flying dutchman there are lava worlds steam worlds hot jupiters cold jupiters and maybe even worlds like our earth the purpose of the book is to begin to give this region a sense of place in the same way that mars is now starting to be appreciated as a location rather than just a planet in doing so the book merges our current scientific knowledge of the known galaxy with speculative fiction and with older legends and myths a sense of place is the feeling that some locations have a special meaning this emotional connection arises from a combination of cultural and environmental factors that make individuals care about a particular place it is challenging to create a sense of place for distant locations that no human has visited and for which our current knowledge is limited this book attempts to take a step in this direction by dividing the known galaxy into a number of clearly described distinct regions by providing scientific descriptions of the likely environmental conditions on the known planets of these regions and by linking these planets to their literary and mythological context the book is aimed at fans of both science fact and science fiction it combines a tour of real planets outside of our solar system with tales of their fictional counterparts the combination of solid scientific facts and analysis with speculation and imagination will be appealing to readers who want to gain a feeling for these planets as places with a back story rather than just as names somewhere out there in the sky

out there the world's first space colony adventures and dangers beyond human ken excerpt a million miles beyond the moon nelson and ramos sped on toward mars in their tiny plastic bubble spacecraft they were on the alert it didn't pay to take anything for granted in the big vacuum the way between the worlds was mostly empty space except for the outlaws of the void who drifted patiently and vengefully waiting for a victim then struck nelsen and ramos tensed blips on the radar screen maybe meteors more blips and fist sized chunks of rock flicked through their fragile vehicles air puffed out and nelson and ramos were fighting for their lives a million miles beyond the moon

book 1 what happens when 12 civilizations from different planets meet for the very first time will their common origin unite them into a mighty intergalactic empire or will they destroy each other the people of the planet schyllus in the canis major dwarf galaxy possess the intergalactic map which plots 12 planets in the local group of galaxies colonized by the first ones schyllus is one of the planets earth is another there are 10 more scientists on schyllus discover that the maker has created a device in deep space the gryben anomaly that allows them to instantaneously travel between the 12 planets the first planet they travel to is earth all they know is that earth was colonized by the first ones thousands of years ago just like schyllus was but otherwise they know nothing about it what happens when 196 418 travelers from schyllus arrive on an unsuspecting and unprepared earth the travelers are peaceful explorers yet their arrival results in billions of human deaths from the chaos that ensues will their arrival on earth be the demise of the human race or will mankind join the travelers in expeditions to the other planets thijar hyperios kikrit freytus acfarr vaagon minyos ozkozania dagomere and pluvikerr these planets were all colonized by the first ones thousands of years ago but have evolved into vastly different civilizations and unbeknownst to the humanoids inhabiting the 12 planets a malevolent entity known as torajii has vowed to exterminate all humanoids from the universe book 2 taking advantage of the worldwide blackout the travelers from the planet schyllus unite the nations of earth into a single supnation called pangaea governed by the world council travelers dominate the world council and have surreptitiously placed travelers in strategic positions in the government military and society but are the traveler's intentions for earth good or evil simultaneously

the world's elite have established themselves in 144 utopian cities scattered throughout the globe declaring their independence from Pangaea in utter defiance of the world council. Civil war breaks out but the 144 are protected by private armies armed with sophisticated weapons including nuclear electromagnetic pulse weapons and anti-nanobot defenses. Now on the planet Schyllus, Christiaan is deeply concerned about the traveler's duplicitous actions on Earth but before he can intervene he is given a rare eternity orb by the being who sends him to distant planets on a mission to unite the 12 planets into a mighty intergalactic empire. On his otherworldly journeys, Christiaan encounters the mysterious philosopher, a civilization trapped in a virtual world controlled by a devious AI, and a planet controlled by the godlike machine. All the while, the malevolent Torajii, a sentient virus created when he was blasted with gamma rays and other high energy radiation in the aftermath of a supernova, continues to enact his plan to exterminate every humanoid in the universe. Book 3, the adventures of Christiaan, Daniel, and Hannah, continue on the planet Hyperios, it's the third planet among the 12 planets the three Tellurians have visited. It doesn't go well; they endure crisis after crisis when Christiaan mysteriously vanishes while trying to return to Schyllus. Daniel goes in search of him, leaving Hannah all alone on Hyperios for decades. Just as things go from bad to apocalyptic, Daniel eventually finds his dad in a strange solar system in the unknown part of the universe called Eternity, where phantasmal laws prevail. There they encounter a mysterious race of humans called the Vandekirians who hold answers to the origin and true purpose of the 12 planets. Meanwhile, Torajii births new enemies more powerful than himself: enemies who lust to make the 12 planets their playthings.

Planets in Play is the first foundational book that lets the reader reimagine his or her inner life through the self-exploratory language of astrology. Author Laurence Hillman, a widely respected astrologer with a loyal following and a formidable online presence, reconnects the planets with the character traits given them by the ancients. Whether one accepts astrology as being real, its language and concepts can go a long way toward helping us see the archetypes that play on our lives. In observing the strengths, weaknesses, and character traits of each planet and zodiac sign, readers will receive a toolbox filled with instruments with which to newly understand their lives. The reader will then be able to make more conscious choices about how he or she is living out these different aspects. To that end, Hillman provides specific tactics and highly practical ideas of how to expressly nourish or minimize these tendencies through choice of behavior, lifestyle, and personal surroundings. Case examples, stories, and anecdotes run throughout the book to demonstrate and ease this process. In its appendices, *Planets in Play* provides a guide in how to get a quality astrological reading with an emphasis on one's dominant archetypes. In addition, Hillman offers a basic grounding in astrology for those readers, therapists, or counselors who wish to learn how the ancient art works at a psychological level without necessarily committing themselves to its study.

A fascinating account of the pioneering astronomer who claimed erroneously to have discovered a planet outside the solar system, there are innumerable planets revolving around innumerable stars across our galaxy. Between 2009 and 2018, NASA's Kepler space telescope discovered thousands of them, but exoplanets—planets outside the solar system—appeared in science fiction before they appeared in telescopes. Astronomers in the early decades of the twentieth century spent entire careers searching for planets in other stellar systems. In *The Lost Planets*, John Wenz offers an account of the pioneering astronomer Peter van de Kamp, who was one of the first to claim discovery of exoplanets. Van de

kamp working at swarthmore college s observatory announced in 1963 that he had identified a planet around barnard s star the second closest star system to the sun he cited the deviations in barnard s star s path wobbles that suggested a large object was lurching around the star van de kamp became something of a celebrity appearing on a television show with mr wizard don henry but subsequent research did not support his claims wenz describes van de kamp s stubborn refusal to accept that he was wrong discusses the evidence found by other researchers and explains recent advances in exoplanet detection including transit radial velocity direct imaging and microlensing van de kamp retired from swarthmore in 1972 and died in 1995 at 93 in 2009 swarthmore named its new observatory the peter van de kamp observatory in the 1990s astronomers discovered and confirmed the first planet outside our solar system in 2018 an exoplanet was detected around barnard s star not however the one van de kamp thought he had discovered in 1963
