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corruption is a problem in prisons about which we hear very little except when there is an escape from custody or other scandal that makes the media the closed nature of correctional institutions has made the activities that go on within them less visible

to the outside world while some persons might be inclined to dismiss correctional corruption as an issue this view ignores the scale of criminality and misconduct that can go on in prison and the impact it can have upon not just the good order of the prison or the rights of prisoners but on the prospects for successful reintegration of ex prisoners into society this book is the first to examine the phenomenon in any detail or to suggest what might be done to reduce its incidence and the harms that can arise from it andrew goldsmith mark halsey and andrew groves argue that it is not enough to tackle corruption alone rather there should be a broader attempt to promote what the authors call correctional integrity

corrections and the criminal justice system is designed to help students understand corrections in relation to the entire criminal justice system this text begins with an overview of the field of criminal justice and covers the components of the criminal justice system that an offender must pass through prior to his her corrections experience police courts and sentencing the second part of the text shows students how corrections is interconnected and related to the other aspects of the criminal justice system

anyone working in corrections has been trained to handle the basics of offender management this training often fails to teach how to deal with offenders mind games the authors offer the basics of offender con games and ways to beat them at their own game chapters include winning the game the psychology of inmate deception inmate manipulation based on a sense of entitlement inmate manipulation based on the power orientation the woman offender gender based games games women offenders play based on blaming or mollification staff moves in managing inmate deception and manipulation maintaining player readiness ten commandments for prison staff and putting it all together

this book highlights a neglected area in the field of rehabilitation of female offenders with aids it provides data to show how women working as hiv peer educators in prison utilize their peer experiences as a transition point for rehabilitation both inside and outside of the penitentiary hiv and prison are inextricably linked and education has proved to be the one constant that mitigates the spread of both hiv and crime

research on female inmates in general is not frequent and this book presents unique qualitative data that includes rich accounts from the women themselves it illustrates the benefits derived by female inmates who work in an hiv prison based peer program while adding to the criminology literature on female patterns of criminality and rehabilitation it provides a greater understanding of how prison programs affect the processes of criminal desistance and behavioral changes for female inmates women involved in such programming are able to change the criminal trajectory of their life direction contributing to reduced levels of recidivism and institutional disciplinary infractions the implications for these programs is relevant within the broader perspective of women hiv and incarceration

this updated and expanded new edition resumes the theme of the first edition and the findings reveal that race ethnicity gender class and several other variables continue to play a significant and consequential role in the legal decision making process the book is structured into three sections each of which corresponds to a different body of work on latinos section one explores the historical dynamics and influence of ethnicity in law enforcement and focuses on how ethnicity impacts policing field practices such as traffic stops use of force and the subsequent actions that police departments have employed to alleviate these problems a detailed examination of critical issues facing latino defendants seeks to better understand the law enforcement process the history of immigration laws as it pertains to mexicans and latinos explains how mexicans have been excluded from the united states through anti immigrant legislation latino officers must cope with structural and political issues the community and media as these practices and experiences within the american police system are explored section two focuses on the repressive practices against mexicans that resulted in executions vigilantism and mass expulsions the topic of latinos and the fourth amendment reveals that the constitutional right of people to be protected against unreasonable searches and seizures has been eviscerated for latinos and particularly for mexicans possible remedies to existing shortcomings of the court system when processing indigent defendants are presented section three studies the issue of hispanics and the penal system the ethnic realities of life behind bars probation and parole the legacy of capital punishment and life after prison are discussed section four addresses the globalization of latinos social control and the future of latinos in the u s criminal justice system lastly the race and ethnic experience through the lens of science law and the american imagination are explored concluding with policy recommendations for social and criminal justice reform and ultimately humanizing differences written for professionals and students of law enforcement this book will promote the understanding of the historical legacy of brutality manipulation oppression marginalization prejudice discrimination power and control and white america s continued fear about racial and ethnic minorities
