there has been a considerable amount of literature in the last 70 years claiming that the american founders were steeped in modern thought this study runs counter to that tradition arguing that the founders of america were deeply indebted to the classical christian natural law tradition for their fundamental theological moral and political outlook evidence for this thesis is found in case studies of such leading american founders as thomas jefferson and james wilson the pamphlet debates the founders invocation of providence during the revolution and their understanding of popular sovereignty the authors go on to reflect on how the founders political thought contained within it the resources that undermined in principle the institution of slavery and explores the relevance of the founders political theology for contemporary politics this timely important book makes a significant contribution to the scholarly debate over whether the american founding is compatible with traditional christianity

american civilization has been shaped by four decisive forces the frontier migration sectionalism and federalism the frontier has offered abundance to those who would could take advantage of its opportunities stimulated technological innovation and been the source of continuous change in social structure and economic organization migration has been responsible for relocating cultures from the old world to the new various sections of geographic territories have adjusted to the overall american culture without losing their individual distinctiveness and federalism has shaped the united states political and social organization the metropolitan frontier and american politics was begun in the late 1950s under the auspices of the university of illinois institute of government and public affairs as a study of the eight lesser metropolitan areas in illinois what started out as a design for community maps of each area with the intent to outline their particular political systems led to a major study of metropolitan cities of the prairie the heartland area between the great lakes and the continental divide with an examination of the processes that have shaped american politics the distinctive features of the geographic areas that elazar discovered can best be understood as reflections of the differences in cultural backgrounds of their respective settlers proper understanding of these communities therefore requires an examination of their place in the federal system the impact of frontier and section upon them and a study of the cultures that inform them as civil communities the volume is consequently divided into three parts cities frontiers and sections streams of migration and political culture and cities states and nation each of which explores elazar s concerns in discovering the interrelationship between the cities of the frontier and american politics a prequel to the closing of the metropolitan frontier the metropolitan frontier and american politics will be of great interest to students of politics american history and ethnography

this book situates the origins of american political science in relation to the transatlantic history of liberalism in a corrective to earlier accounts it argues that as political science took shape in the

nineteenth century american academy it did more than express a pre existing american liberalism the pioneers of american political science participated in transatlantic networks of intellectual and political elites that connected them directly to the vicissitudes of liberalism in europe the book shows how these figures adapted multiple contemporary european liberal arguments to speak to particular challenges of mass democratic politics and large scale industry as they developed in america political science s pioneers in the american academy were thus active agents of the americanization of liberalism when political science first secured a niche in the american academy during the antebellum era it advanced a democratized classical liberal political vision overlapping with the contemporary european liberalism of tocqueville and john stuart mill as political science expanded during the dramatic growth of university ideals and institutions in the gilded age divergence within its liberalism came to the fore in the area of political economy in the late nineteenth century this divergence was fleshed out into two alternative liberal political visions progressive liberal and disenchanted classical liberal with different analyses of democracy and the administrative state during the early twentieth century both visions found expression among early presidents of the new american political science association and subsequently within contests over the meaning of liberalism as this term acquired salience in american political discourse in sum this book showcases how the history of american political science offers a venue in which we see how a distinct current of mid nineteenth century european liberalism was divergently transformed into alternative twentieth century american liberalisms

this work challenges the thesis first formulated by de toqueville and later systematically developed by louis hartz that american political culture is characterized by a consensus on liberal capitalist values ranging over three hundred years of history and drawing upon the seminal work anthropologist mary douglas richard ellis demonstrates that american history is best understood as a contest between five rival political cultures egalitarian community competitive individualism hierarchical collectivism atomized fatalism and autonomous hermitude

this carefully crafted ebook common sense political classics series is formatted for your ereader with a functional and detailed table of contents common sense was published anonymously on january 10 1776 at the beginning of the american revolution and became an immediate sensation written in clear and persuasive prose thomas paine marshaled moral and political arguments to encourage common people in the colonies to fight for egalitarian government it common sense made public a persuasive and impassioned case for independence which before the pamphlet had not yet been given serious intellectual consideration he connected independence with common dissenting protestant beliefs as a means to present a distinctly american political identity structuring common sense as if it were a sermon historian gordon s wood described common sense as the most incendiary and popular pamphlet of the entire revolutionary era thomas paine 1737 1809 was an english american political activist philosopher political theorist and revolutionary one of the founding fathers of the united states he authored the two most influential pamphlets at the start of the american revolution and he inspired the rebels in 1776 to declare independence from britain paine s ideas reflected enlightenment era rhetoric of transnational human rights

please note this is a companion version not the original book sample book insights 1 acton s view of history as a morality tale in which liberty and truth unfold over time was unfashionable during his lifetime it was only during the second world war that his unyielding moral outlook came into its own and was seen as a prophetic warning against totalitarianism 2 acton like de toqueville believes that history is the progress of increasing freedom he believes that liberty is the result of a mature civilization and that it takes a long time for freedom to become rooted in institutions 3 acton defines liberty as the assurance that every man shall be protected in doing what he believes his duty against the influence of authority and majorities he believes that the history of liberty is the history of the deliverance of man from the power of man 4 acton believed that america was founded on the right balance between democracy and liberty he noted that while democracies have allowed the slave trade to flourish many of the most religiously intolerant societies have been democracies
