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state of white supremacy investigates how race functions as an enduring logic of governance in the united states perpetually generating and legitimating racial hierarchy and privilege

how christian supremacy gave birth to white supremacy the witchcraft of white supremacy when words create worlds the symbolic capital of new testament love the cruciform christ christian love in a weighted world

an anthology of original essays that examine white supremacy around the globe through the lens of anthropology white supremacy an entrenched global system that emerged alongside european colonialism is based on presumed biological and cultural differences racist practices the hypervaluation of whiteness and the devaluation of nonwhites anthropology has been shaped by and has helped to shape white supremacy yet the discipline also offers powerful tools for understanding this system at a global scale the anthropology of white supremacy gathers original essays from a diverse international group of anthropologists to explore how this phenomenon works both within anthropology and in cultural and political structures around the world the book features historical and ethnographic analysis about brazil iceland japan mexico nigeria palestine senegal south africa and the united states and addresses the ways white supremacy impacts a broad range of issues including finance advertising and media representations militarism police training migration and development the anthropology of white supremacy demonstrates not only how anthropology can help us to better comprehend white supremacy but also how the discipline can help us begin to dismantle it the contributors include omolade adunbi samar al bulushi aisha m beliso de jesús michael l blakey mitzi uehara carter subhadra mitra channa celina de sá vanessa díaz britt halverson faye v harrison sarah ihmoud anthony r jerry darryl li kristín loftsdóttir christopher a loperena keisha khan y perry jemima pierre jean

the story of three locations in the united states in mississippi minnesota and oklahoma where the indigenous people were driven out by european colonists where vicious racial killings took place in the last century and how these places are coming to terms with the past creating new organizations dedicated to racial repair and reconciliation as they aspire to a more inclusive more promising future

now in paperback the rural face of white supremacy presents a detailed study of the daily experiences of ordinary people in rural hancock county georgia drawing on his own interviews with over two hundred black and white residents mark schultz argues that the residents acted on the basis of personal rather than institutional relationships as a result hancock county residents experienced more intimate face to face interactions which made possible more black agency than their urban counterparts were allowed while they were still firmly entrenched within an exploitive white supremacist culture this relative freedom did create a space for a range of interracial relationships that included mixed housing midwifery church services meals and even common law marriages

racism has never been simple it wasn't more obvious in the past and it isn't less potent now from the birth of the united states to the contemporary police shooting death of an unarmed black youth beneath the surface of white supremacy investigates ingrained practices of racism as well as unquestioned assumptions in the study of racism to upend and deepen our understanding in moon kie jung's unsettling book dred scott v sandford the notorious 1857 supreme court case casts a shadow over current immigration debates and the war on terror the story of a 1924 massacre of filipino sugar workers in hawaii i pairs with statistical relentlessness of black economic suffering to shed light on hidden dimensions of mass ignorance and indifference the

histories of asians blacks latina os and natives relate in knotty ways state violence and colonialism come to the fore in taking measure of the united states past and present while the undue importance of assimilation and colorblindness recedes ultimately jung challenges the dominant racial common sense and develops new concepts and theory for radically rethinking and resisting racisms

the politics of racism have returned with a bang what was once a whisper is now a roar in the wake of public outrage over charges of police racism that claimed the lives of racialized minorities and indigenous peoples yet confusion and uncertainty unsettle the challenge of clarifying the nature and scope of racism in general systemic racism in particular resulting in a glaring disconnect between public perceptions and lived experiences reckoning with racism is themed around the prospect of problematizing the idea of racism as articulated understood and debated in response to new realities emergent demands and contested dynamics a profoundly new racism world is evolving one so fundamentally different from the iterations of the past as to trigger a foundational shift in reconceptualizing how see think and talk about and act on racism changing the conversation on racism must also acknowledge its uncanny knack of reinventing itself while intersecting with other axes of identity and differentiation to amplify the inequalities of exclusion

bell hooks writes about the meaning of feminist consciousness in daily life and about self recovery about overcoming white and male supremacy and about intimate relationships exploring the point where the public and private meet

argues for the necessity of a new ethos for middle class white anti racism building on her book revealing whiteness shannon sullivan identifies a constellation of attitudes common among well meaning white liberals that she sums up as white middle class goodness an orientation she critiques for being more concerned with establishing anti racist bona fides than with

confronting systematic racism and privilege sullivan untangles the complex relationships between class and race in contemporary white identity and outlines four ways this orientation is expressed each serving to establish one's lack of racism the denigration of lower class white people as responsible for ongoing white racism the demonization of antebellum slaveholders an emphasis on colorblindness especially in the context of white childrearing and the cultivation of attitudes of white guilt shame and betrayal to move beyond these distancing strategies sullivan argues white people need a new ethos that acknowledges and transforms their whiteness in the pursuit of racial justice rather than seeking a self-righteous distance from it

to help educators adopt more authentically justice-oriented approaches to antiracism this volume exposes the racism upheld by schools and districts that claim an antiracist commitment
