the latest version of an important academic resource published about once a decade since 1963

presents a selection of forty six readings that provide an introduction to the sociological perspective look at how sociologists conduct research examine the cultural underpinnings of social life and discuss social groups and social structure gender and sexuality deviance and social stratification institutions and change

the book offers a deep dive into the range of societal issues ranging from government and gender identity to inequalities globalisation and even the disneyfication of today s world the book is an academic type and provides self guide to final year ba students as well as for civil services and other competative examinations the book covers fundamental aspects perspectives and outlook to sociology readers may find it very helpful in understanding the fundamentals of sociology

sociology is experiencing what can only be described as hyperdifferentiation of theories there are now many approaches competing for attention in the intellectual arena from this perspective we should see a weeding out of theories to a small number but this is not likely to

occur because each of the many theoretical perspectives has a resource base of adherents as a result theories in sociology do not compete head on with each other as much as they coexist this seminal reference work was brought together with an eye to capturing the diversity of theoretical activity in sociology specifically the forefront of theory contributors describe what they themselves are doing right now rather than what others have done in the past the goal of this volume is to allow prominent theorists working in a variety of traditions who wouldn't usually come together to review their work the chapters in this volume represent a mix of theoretical orientations and strategies but these theories are diverse and represent the prominent theoretical discussions in sociology today some areas included are section i theoretical methodologies and strategies section ii the cultural turn in sociological theorizing section iii theorizing interaction processes section iv theorizing from the systemic and macrolevel section v new directions in evolutionary theorizing section vi theorizing on power conflict and change sectionvii theorizing from assumptions of rationality this handbook will be of interest to those wanting a broad spectrum and overview of late 20th early 21st century sociological theory

the term social science is often used to refer to the fields that sociology and anthropology fall under the field is particularly influential within the realm of the social sciences sociology is sometimes referred to as the science of society which is exactly what the name sociology implies when taken in its most literal definition in the first half of the 19th century specifically in the year 1837 a new academic field known as sociology emerged as a specialized science to elucidate the fundamental laws that govern societal phenomena human social relationships in this book the primary focus has been on analyzing the issues and societies of the modern western world as a result it is common practice and generally recognized to connect sociology with the investigation of contemporary industrialized cultures found in the western world an introduction to sociology is a presentation of the theoretical perspectives the techniques of investigation

and the ideas that sociologists use to organize the complex phenomena that arise from social interaction this book offers an instance of specific research that may give some insights into fundamental aspects of society and the behaviour of social groups this book also covers the institutionalized aspects of society such as the family the economy and politics among other topics

most texts on classical social theory offer exhaustive coverage of every possible theorist making it difficult to use the book in one semester capitalism and classical social theory second edition represents a departure from this approach by offering solid coverage of the classical triumvirate marx durkheim and weber but also extending the canon strategically to include simmel four early female theorists and the writings of du bois the result is a manageable but thorough examination of the key classical theorists the second edition has been updated throughout and includes two new chapters one on weber and rationalization and one on du bois and his writings on race a new concluding chapter links classical theory to current developments in capitalism during an age of austerity
