tells him she'll return a favor to him his mind is set on having a night of mind blowing
unforgettable passion will his sizzling attraction be too hot for her to handle but he's
hiding a dark secret getting too close to holly might be too risky but isn't love all about
risks

in reading banville's novels through the work of key psychoanalytical theorists john banville's narcissistic fictions brings together apparently disparate thematic strands missing twins shame false identities and presents these as manifestations of a central concern with narcissism

using printed and manuscript texts composed between 1575 and 1672 jennifer heller

defines the genre of the mother's legacy as a distinct branch of the advice tradition in early modern England that takes the form of a dying mother's pious counsel to her children. Reading these texts in light of specific cultural contexts, social trends, and historical events, Heller explores how legacy writers used the genre to secure personal and family status, to shape their children's beliefs and behaviors, and to intervene in the period's tumultuous religious and political debates. The author's attention to the fine details of the period's religious and political swings, drawn from sources such as royal proclamations, sermons, and first-hand accounts of book burnings, creates a fuller context for her analysis of the legacies. Similarly, Heller explains the appeal of the genre by connecting it to social factors, including mortality rates and inheritance practices. Analyses of related genres, such as conduct books and fathers' legacies, highlight the unique features and functions of mothers' legacies. Heller also attends to the personal side of the genre, demonstrating that a writer's education, marriages, children, and turns of fortune affect her work within the genre.

this book draws upon popular sociological political and architectural history to illustrate how divorce reflects conflicting ideologies and notions of american identity focusing primarily on work by william dean howells edith wharton mary mccarthy and john updike kimberly freeman delineates a system of tropes particular to divorce in american novels such as the association of divorce with the west and modernity the dismantling of the home and the disruption of the boundary between the public and the private these tropes suggest a literary tradition of love marriage and divorce that is central to twentieth century american fiction offering an explanation for both the treatment of divorce in the american novel as well as its predominance in american culture this book should appeal to scholars of american literature and popular culture or anyone interested in how divorce has become so american

of identity specifically those related to sexual identity it asks how these intersections are formed negotiated and resisted across time and places including the uk europe north america australia and the global south questions around queer engagements in same sex marriages civil partnerships and other practices e g adoption have created a number of provoking stances and policy provisions but what remains unanswered is how people experience and situate themselves within sometimes competing or contradictory moments as religious queers who may be tasked with queering religion additionally the presumed paradoxes of marriage queer sexuality religion and youth combine to generate a noteworthy generational absence this leads to questions about where religious queers reside resist and relate experiences of intersecting religious and sexual lives in looking at interconnectedness this collection offers international contributions which bridge the contradictions in queering religion and in making visible religious queers it provides insight into older and younger people s understandings of religiosity queer cultures and religious groups a small but active religious minority in the us has received much attention for its anti gay political activity much less attention has been paid to the more positive supportive role that religious based groups play in e g providing housing education and political advocacy for queer youth queer methodologies and intersectional approaches offer a lens both theoretically and methodologically to uncover the salience of related social divisions and identities this collection is both innovative and sensitive to blended identities and their various enactments
