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when liddell hart s sherman was first published in 1929 it received encomiums such as these a masterly performance one of the most thoroughly dignified one of the most distinguished biographies of the year henry steele commager new york herald tribune it is not often that one comes upon a biography that is so well done as this book nearly every page bears evidence of the fact that it is the product of painstaking and exhaustive research mature thought and an expert understanding of the subject in hand saturday review of literature

a study of the establishment of inspection practices in the united states army told chronologically in large part through the experiences of officers assigned to the inspection service the record of the inspectorate illustrates those daily concerns that influenced the institutional development of the inspector general corps as a whole

public anger at perceived ethical and legal failures in recent wars has reinforced the importance of understanding military ethics ethics law and military operations is one of the first texts to examine both the ethical and the legal considerations of contemporary military conflict it adopts a practical approach to explore the ways in which legal and normative issues combine to affect

the entire spectrum of military operations from high intensity conflict to peacekeeping activities and the provision of humanitarian aid with an operational perspective in mind this text delivers accessible frameworks for evaluating and applying fundamental legal and ethical concepts written by an international team of military practitioners and academics this book provides interdisciplinary insights into the major issues facing military decision makers the first half of the book explores the ethical and legal underpinnings of warfare later chapters use case studies to examine specific issues in the contemporary operating environment

this history of american armored warfare through the twentieth century boasts some of the best available analysis of mobile war as practiced by the us publishers weekly camp colt to desert storm is the only complete history of us armed forces from the advent of the tank in battle during world war i to the campaign to drive iraq out of kuwait in 1991 with comprehensive analysis it traces the development of doctrine for operations at the tactical and operational levels of war and assesses how this fighting doctrine translates into the development of equipment beginning with the army s first tank school camp colt in gettysburg pennsylvania this volume examines how armored warfare effected and was influenced by the evolution of twentieth century combat the tank revolutionized the battlefield in world war ii in the years since developments such as nuclear weapons ballistic missiles computer assisted firing and satellite navigation have continued to transform armored warfare s role in combat

general william tecumseh sherman s devastating march to the sea in 1864 burned a swath through the cities and countryside of georgia and into the history of the american civil war as they moved from atlanta to savannah destroying homes buildings and crops killing livestock and consuming supplies sherman and the union army ignited not only southern property but also imaginations in both the north and the south by the time of the general s death in 1891 when one said the march no explanation was required that remains true today legends and myths about sherman began forming during the march itself and took more definitive shape in the industrial age in the late nineteenth century sherman s march in myth and memory examines the emergence of various myths surrounding one of the most enduring campaigns in the annals of military history edward caudill and paul ashdown provide a brief overview of sherman s life and his march but their focus is on how these myths came about such as one description of a 60 mile wide path of destruction and how legends about sherman and his campaign have served a variety of interests caudill and ashdown argue that these myths have been employed by groups as disparate as those endorsing the old south aristocracy and its lost cause and by others who saw the march as evidence of the superiority of industrialism in modern america over a retreating agrarianism sherman s march in myth and memory looks at the general s treatment in the press among historians on stage and screen and in literature from the time of the march to the present day the authors show us the many ways in which sherman has been portrayed in the media and popular culture and how his devastating march has been stamped into our collective memory

major general william t sherman commanded three field armies under a single command all having the same operational objective modern doctrine states that two to five field armies constitute an army group therefore by definition sherman was an army group commander general of the army omar n bradley's actions in forming the 12th army group during world war two established modern doctrine for field army groups bradley chose british field marshall alexander's army group as his model but could have used an american example of this type of organization by studying sherman and the atlanta campaign sherman has never been looked at before as an army group commander this study examines sherman and the atlanta campaign focusing on the shaping and management of his army group command relationships both personal and professional are investigated through messages letters and orders of sherman and his army commanders

this paper examines sherman's growth as a strategic thinker and successful strategist it explores how his life shaped him to fill the role that he did in the civil war and what things contributed to his development into the soldier who could plan and execute the north's strategy in the last year of the war it also focuses on specific instances of success and failure that led him to the position from which he could influence if not actually author the strategy followed by the union in the last year of the war it also examines what sherman brought to his relationship with ulysses s grant and how that relationship affected the evolving strategy that guided the union army after grant ascended to the leadership of all union armies
