george moore 1852 1933 was one of the most influential and versatile writers and journalists of the turn of the century this five volume reset critical edition addresses scholarly interest in moore making available his generally neglected short story collections

this book examines youth cultural responses to the political economic and socio cultural changes that affected britain in the aftermath of the second world war in particular it considers the extent to which elements of youth culture and popular music served to contest the notion of consensus that historians and social commentators have suggested served to frame british polity from the late 1940s into the 1970s the collection argues that aspects of youth culture appear to have revealed notable fault lines in and across british society and provided alternative perspectives and reactions to the presumptions of mainstream political and cultural opinion in the period this perhaps was most acute in the period leading up to and after the seemingly pivotal moment of margaret thatcher s election to prime minister in 1979

this book was originally published as a special issue of contemporary british history

winch has written the first full length biography of james forten a hero of african american history and one of the most remarkable men in 19th century america born into a free black family in 1766 forten served in the revolutionary war as a teenager by 1810 he had earned the distinction of being the leading sailmaker in philadelphia soon after forten emerged as a leader in philadelphia s black community and was active in a wide range of reform activities especially prominent in national and international antislavery movements he served as vice president of the american antislavery society and became close friends with william lloyd garrison to whom he lent money to start up the liberator his family were all active abolitionists and a granddaughter charlotte forten published a famous diary of her experiences teaching ex slaves in south carolina s sea islands during the civil war this is the first serious biography of forten who stands beside harriet tubman frederick douglass booker t washington and martin luther king jr in the pantheon of african americans who fundamentally shaped american history

this second volume of alfred hitchcock s reflections on his life and work and the art of cinema contains material long out of print not easily accessible and in some cases forgotten or unknown edited by sidney gottlieb this new collection of interviews articles with the great director s byline and as told to pieces provides an enlivening perspective on a career that spanned seven decades and transformed the history of cinema in writings and interviews imbued with the same exuberance and originality that he brought to his films hitchcock ranges from accounts of his own life and experiences to provocative comments on filmmaking techniques and cinema in general wry thoughtful witty and humorous as well as brilliantly informative and insightful this volume contains much valuable material that adds to our understanding and appreciation of a titan who decades after his death remains one of the most renowned and influential of all filmmakers françois truffaut once said that hitchcock had given more thought to the potential of his art than any of his colleagues this profound contemplation of his art is superbly captured in the pieces from all periods of hitchcock s career gathered in this volume which reveal fascinating details about how he envisioned and attempted to create a pure cinema that was entertaining commercially successful and artistically ambitious and innovative in an environment that did not always support this lofty goal

this second volume of reclaiming our roots carries readers on a whirlwind journey from the eve of the reformation to developments in christianity in the twentieth century as in the first volume mark ellingsen gives special attention to the history of christianity in the southern hemisphere the church among minority cultures in north america and the role of women in church history ellingsen s careful and critical eye ranges over the entire panorama of modern church history he provides balanced theological analyses of major movements and figures as well as the interactions between them ellingsen presents church history as an opportunity to enter into a dialogue with the church s richly diverse heritage he sees the role of church history as community builder teaching the faithful their heritage safety patrol sensitizing church leaders to the errors of the past that they must still confront liberating instrument learning to look at reality from the perspective of the other no longer chained to one s own suppositions and cultural biases and source of theological creativity providing access to the stimulating insights of the great theological minds of the past this thought provoking book offers readers a sympathetic exposure to a variety of credible scholarly interpretations of major figures and encourages them to make their own judgments with the help of suggested primary source readings ellingsen closes each chapter with questions that lead readers to ponder the deeper meanings of various events in the history of christianity

in the twenty years preceding the first world war cinema rapidly developed from a fairground curiosity into a major industry and social institution a source of information and entertainment for millions of people only recently have film scholars and historians begun to study these early years of cinema in their own right and not simply as first steps towards the classical narrative cinema we now associate with hollywood the essays in this collection trace the fascinating history of how the cinema developed its forms of storytelling and representation and how it evolved into a complex industry with hollywood rapidly acquiring a dominant role these issues can be seen to arise from new readings of the so called pioneers melies lumiere porter and griffith while also suggesting new perspectives on major european filmmakers of the 1910s and 20s editor thomas elsaesser complements the contributions from leading british american and european scholars with introductory essays of his own that provide a comprehensive overview of the field the volume is the most authoritative survey to date of a key area of contemporary film research invaluable to historians as well as to students of cinema

sir william blackstone s commentaries on the laws of england 1765 1769 stands as the first great effort to reduce the english common law to a unified and rational system blackstone demonstrated that the english law as a system of justice was comparable to roman law and the civil law of the continent clearly and elegantly written the work achieved immediate renown and exerted a powerful influence on legal education in england and in america which was to last into the late nineteenth century the book is regarded not only as a legal classic but as a literary masterpiece previously available only in an expensive hardcover set commentaries on the laws of england is published here in four separate volumes each one affordably priced in a paperback edition these works are facsimiles of the eighteenth century first edition and are undistorted by later interpolations each volume deals with a particular field of law and carries with it an introduction by a leading contemporary scholar introducing this third volume of private wrongs john h langbein discusses blackstone s account of

procedure and jurisdiction jury trial and equity he also examines blackstone s uneasy attitude toward the celebrated legal frictions of english civil procedure

each of these essays illuminates an important dimension of the complex array of black male experiences as workers artists warriors and leaders the essays describe the expectations and demands to struggle to resist and facilitate the survival of african american culture and community black manhood was shaped not only in relation to black womanhood but was variously nurtured and challenged honed and transformed against a backdrop of white male power and domination and the relentless expectations and demands on them to struggle resist and to facilitate the survival of african american culture and community

the five volume oxford history of protestant dissenting traditions series is governed by a motif of migration out of england it first traces organized church traditions that arose in britain and ireland as dissenters distanced themselves from a state church defined by diocesan episcopacy the book of common prayer the thirty nine articles and royal supremacy but then follows those traditions as they spread beyond britain and ireland and also analyses newer traditions that emerged downstream in other parts of the world from earlier forms of dissent secondly it does the same for the doctrines church practices stances toward state and society attitudes toward scripture and characteristic patterns of organization that also originated in earlier british and irish dissent but that have often defined a trajectory of influence independent of ecclesiastical organizations the oxford history of protestant dissenting traditions volume v follows the spatial cultural and intellectual changes in dissenting identity and practice in the twentieth century as these once european traditions globalized while in europe dissent was often against the religious state dissent in a globalizing world could redefine itself against colonialism or other secular and religious monopolies the contributors trace the encounters of dissenting protestant traditions with modernity and globalization changing imperial politics challenges to biblical denominational and pastoral authority local cultures and languages and some of the century s major themes such as race and gender new technologies and organizational change in so doing they identify a vast array of local and globalizing illustrations which will enliven conversations about the role of religion and in particular christianity

this second installment of the methodist story shaped by controversy examines eight of the major controversies that epitomize aspects of methodism s inter family dialogue and trauma these theological ecclesial and ethical controversies tried the values tested the patience and strained our familial relationships ultimately they divided the methodist movement ironically controversy was often rooted in something that was good and right about the methodist movement a commitment to addressing what had somehow gotten out of balance and become destructive internal struggles over matters related to class economic status gender and race shook methodism precisely because the inclusion of all people from diverse backgrounds and walks of life was a foundational aspect of the early methodism contentious controversies have revolved around matters like 1 the nature of spiritual life faith and good works 2 predestination and the nature christian assurance of salvation 3 the difficulties of living out christian perfection in a world full of imperfect people 4 the pain and trauma of ecclesiastical separation 5 women s leadership in the church 6 the debilitating effects of racism and segregation 7 governance and shared leadership

and 8 the affirmation and full inclusion of lgbtq people these controversies within the church family have challenged and pained methodists deeply they have also forced methodists to examine their own priorities and clarify what matters most to them how the methodists responded to these controversies for good or for ill has shaped the identity of the methodists as people of faith hopefully both guidance and encouragement can be found in this history because the past is often like a distant mirror that reflects very clearly upon lives lived today
