on april 11 2005 in jerusalem karl plagge will be named a righteous amongthe nations hero by the state of israel he joins oskar schindler and some 380 other similarly honored germans who protected and saved jews duringthe holocaust karl plagge s story is of a unique kind of courage that of a german army officerwho subverted the system of death to save the lives of some 250 jews in vilna lithuania one of those he saved was michael good s mother haunted by his mother s stories of the mysterious officer who commanded herslave labor camp michael good resolved to find out all he could about the enigmatic major plagge for five years he wrote hundreds of letters and scoured theinternet to recover in one hard earned bit of evidence after another informationabout the man whose moral choices saved hundreds of lives this unforgettablebook is the first portrait of a modest man who simply refused to play by the rules interviewing camp survivors opening german files untouched for more thanfifty years and translating newly discovered letters good weaves an amazing tale an engineer from darmstadt plagge joined and then left the nazi party in vilna in whose teeming ghetto tens of thousands of jews faced extermination he foundhimself in charge of a camp where military vehicles were repaired time aftertime he saved jews from prison ss death squads and the ghetto by issuingthem work permits as indispensable

laborers essential to the war effort karl plagge never considered himself a hero describing himself as a fellow travelerfor not doing more to fight the regime he said that he saved jews and others because i thought it was my duty this book also reminds us of the many wayshuman beings can resist evil there are always some people pearl good said of the man who saved her life when he didn that to who decide that the horroris not to be

when the search for major plagge was published last spring the world finally learned about a unique hero and about one american doctor s extraordinary journey to tell karl plagge s story part detective story part personal quest michael good s book is the story of the german commander of a lithuanian work camp who saved hundreds of jewish lives in the vilna ghetto including the life of good s mother pearl who was this enigmatic officer pearl good had spoken of so often after five years of research interviewing survivors assembling a team that could work to open german files untouched for fifty years following every lead he could good was able to uncover the amazing tale of one man s remarkable courage and in april 2005 karl plagge joined oskar schindler and 380 other germans as a righteous among nations honored by the state of israel for protecting and saving jewish lives during the holocaust this expanded edition features new photographs and a new epilogue on the impact of the discovery of karl plagge especially the story of 83 year old alfons von deschwanden who after fifty years of silence came forward as a veteran of plagge s unit his testimony is now part of this growing witness to truth

he who saves one life it is as if he saved an entire world the holocaust will be forever numbered amongst the darkest of days in human civilisation yet even in that darkness there were sparks of light many will recognise the names of oskar schindler raoul wallenberg and miep gies but there were thousands of others throughout europe who risked their own lives to save jews from the nazis and their horrific campaign of obliteration that was the holocaust by the beginning of 2002 more than 19 000 non jews had been recognized as righteous among the nations by yad vashem the holocaust museum in jerusalem some were officials some were clergy others were citizens of countries who united in their efforts to protect jews many were merely individuals who had the courage to stand up against a growing tide of collaboration and simply say we did what we had to do martin gilbert the foremost british historian of the holocaust here presents the evidence collected over many years cumulatively these accounts from every occupied country in europe from the baltic to the mediterranean from the atlantic to the black sea and from inside the third reich itself form an inspiring tribute to those heroic individuals who without thought to the risk to their own lives dared to challenge barbarism and hold out the hand of rescue to the jews of europe

during world war ii latvia lithuania and estonia found themselves trapped between the giants of the soviet union and nazi germany over the course of the war these states were repeatedly occupied by different forces and local government organizations and individuals were forced to choose between supporting the occupying forces or forming partisan units to resist their occupation devastated during the german invasion these states then became the site of some of the most vicious fighting during the soviet counter attack and push towards berlin many would be caught up in the bitter fighting in the region and in particular in the huge battles for the courland bridgehead during operation bagration when hundreds of thousands of soldiers would fight and die in the last year of the war by the end of the war death and deportation had cost the baltic states over 20 per cent of their total population and soviet occupation was to see the iron curtain descend on the region for four decades using numerous first hand accounts and detailed archival research prit buttar weaves a magisterial account of the bitter fighting on the eastern front and the three small states whose fates were determined by the fortunes and misfortunes of war

on october 10 1941 the jewish population of the belarusian village of krucha was rounded up and shot this atrocity was not the routine work of the ss but was committed by a regular german army unit acting on its own initiative marching into darkness is a bone chilling exposé of the ordinary footsoldiers who participated in the final solution on a daily basis although scholars have exploded the myth that the wehrmacht played no significant part in the holocaust a concrete picture of its involvement has been lacking marching into darkness reveals in detail how the army willingly fulfilled its role as an agent of murder on a massive scale waitman wade beorn unearths forced labor sexual violence and grave robbing though a few soldiers refused to participate and even helped jews improvised extermination progressively became methodical with some army units going so far as to organize jew hunts the wehrmacht also used the pretense of jewish anti partisan warfare as a subterfuge by reporting murdered jews as partisans through military and legal records survivor testimonies and eyewitness interviews beorn paints a searing portrait of an army s descent into ever more intimate participation in genocide

man s inhumanity to man details and describes the holocaust s systematic torturing and murdering of more than 13 million human beings at 37 concentration camps by the nazi s and their surrogates
