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in 1980 william h whyte published the findings from his revolutionary street life project in the social life of small urban spaces both the book and the accompanying film were instantly labeled classics and launched a mini revolution in the planning and study of public spaces they have since become standard texts and appear on

dimensions of urban design the discussion moves systematically through ideas theories research and the practice of urban design from an unrivalled range of sources it aids the reader by gradually building the concepts one upon the other towards a total view of the subject the author team explain the catalysts of change and renewal and explore the global and local contexts and processes within which urban design operates the book presents six key dimensions of urban design theory and practice the social visual functional temporal morphological and perceptual allowing it to be dipped into for specific information or read from cover to cover this is a clear and accessible text that provides a comprehensive discussion of this complex subject

this book is the result of a research project designed and carried out at the department of architecture university of florence this book discusses urban public spaces and more specifically run down inactive micro spaces that are barely used due to their location dimensions morphology or semantic characteristics in literature these spaces are often defined as residual urban spaces a large abandoned industrial area on the outskirts of a town or a small interstitial space in a historical centre can be residual with respect to such a broad subject matter the book seeks to radically limit the field concentrating on public residual spaces found in the oldest parts of cities the book reflects on this theme and introduces a method for reading and assessment of the residuality of public spaces in historical contexts residuality assessment process which was tested in the historical centre of florence it is the authors view that residual spaces above all if designed according to a system logic can go from being problems to potential activators of urban and social regeneration processes offering a useful contribution to improve city life

this is a multi disciplinary scientific monograph referring to urban geography urban regions management event studies tourism geography cultural anthropology and sociology it covers issues which are typically related to the most popular type of events festivals this book studies the origins history and the main factors of festival development as well as the concept of a festival in the context of various scientific disciplines it presents the existing festival typologies as well as the author s own comprehensive typology the theoretical part concerns the basic research methods and approaches used in the analysis of these events as well as their impacts on the urban space in the physical festival facilities social a place where people may pursue their interests meet with family and friends and cultural aspect the economic aspect of festivals generating jobs and income from tourism using festivals for city branding etc is also discussed the book presents practical examples in sub chapters references to literature further reading and the case study of the influence of festivals on urban space management and urban development using

the example of Łódź a polish post socialist city it may also be treated as a supplementary course book for students of urban geography urban regions management tourism event management and to a certain extent anthropology of culture and sociology

urban spaces in japan explores the workings of power money and the public interest in the planning and design of japanese space through a set of vivid case studies of well known japanese cities including tokyo kobe and kyoto this book examines the potential of civil society in contemporary planning debates further it addresses the implications of japan s biggest social problem the demographic decline for japanese cities and demonstrates the serious challenges and exciting possibilities that result from the impending end of japan s urban growth presenting a synthetic approach that reflects both the physical aspects and the social significance of urban spaces this book scrutinizes the precise patterns of urban expansion and shrinkage in doing so it also summarizes current theories of public space urban space and the body in space which are relevant to both japan and the wider international debate with detailed case studies and more general reflections from a broad range of disciplines this collection of essays demonstrates the value of cross disciplinary cooperation as such it is of interest to students and scholars of geography and urban planning as well as history anthropology and cultural studies

the deteriorating cores and neighborhoods of towns and cities across the united states with creativity planning and commitment these centers can thrive again adding to the quality of local life and contributing to the local economy too

despite developments in urban design during the last few decades architects urban planners and designers often continue to produce areas of bland commercially led urban fabric that deliver the basic functional requirements of shelter work and leisure but are socially unsustainable and likely generators of future problems convivial urban spaces demonstrates that successful urban public spaces are an essential part of a sustainable built environment without them we are likely to drift into an increasingly private and polarized society with all the problems that would imply taking a multidisciplinary approach this book draws on research and the literature and theory of environmental psychology and urban design to advance our understanding of what makes effective public spaces practical guidance is illustrated with case studies from the uk spain germany and italy the result is a practical and clearly presented guide to urban public space for planners architects and students of the urban environment

the themed space locating culture nation and self is the first edited collection focused on the subject of the themed space twelve authors address a range of themed spaces including restaurants casinos theme parks and other spaces like airports and virtual reality ones the text is organized into four sections theming as authenticity theming as nation theming as person and theming as mind
