this is a collection of previously published book reviews of modern poetry the poets discussed include john ashbery donald davie allen ginsberg seamus heaney ted hughes sylvia plath anne sexton and wallace stevens

presents a compilation of bloom's introductions to the modern critical views and modern critical interpretations series of books focusing on poets and poems

in sixteen chapters devoted to avant garde contemporary american poets including kenneth goldsmith adeena karasick tyrone williams hannah

weiner and barrett watten prolific scholar and purdue university professor daniel morris engages in a form of cultural repurposing by learning twice about how to attend to writers whose aesthetic contributions were not part of his education as a student in boston and chicago in the 1980s and 1990s when new formalism and post confessional modes reigned supreme morris s study demonstrates his interest in moving beyond formalism to offer what stephen fredman calls a wider cultural interpretation of literature that emphasizes the new historicist concerns with hybridity ethnicity power relations material culture politics and religion essays address from multiple perspectives prophetic diasporic ethical the vexing problems and sublime potential of disseminating lyrics the ancient form of transmission and preservation of the singular private human voice across time and space to an individual reader in an environment in which e poetry and digitalized poetics pose a crisis understood as both opportunity and threat to traditional page poetry

catullus life was akin to pulp fiction in julius caesar s rome he engages in a stormy affair with a consul s wife he writes her passionate poems of love hate and jealousy the consul a vehement opponent of caesar dies under suspicious circumstances the merry widow romances numerous young men catullus is drawn into politics and becomes a cocky critic of caesar writing poems that dub julius a low life pig and a pervert not surprisingly soon after no more is heard of catullus david mulroy brings to life the witty poignant and brutally direct voice of a flesh and blood man a young provincial in the eternal city reacting to real people and events in a rome full of violent conflict among individuals marked by genius and megalomaniacal passions mulroy s lively rhythmic translations of the poems are enhanced by an introduction and commentary that provide biographical and bibliographical information about catullus a history of his times a discussion of the translations and definitions and notes that ease the way for anyone who is not a latin scholar

most useful and exciting poetry reference of its kind for students today american poetry springs up out of all walks of life its poems are maternal as well as paternal stuff d with the stuff that is coarse and stuff d with the stuff that is fine as walt whitman wrote adding of every hue and caste am i of every rank and religion written for high school and undergraduate students this two volume encyclopedia covers u s poetry from the colonial era to the present offering full treatments of hundreds of key poets of the american canon what sets this reference apart is that it also discusses events movements schools and poetic approaches placing poets in their social historical political cultural and critical contexts and showing how their works mirror the eras in which they were written readers will learn about surrealism ekphrastic poetry pastoral elegy the black mountain poets and language poetry there are long and rich entries on modernism and postmodernism as well as entries related to the formal and technical dimensions of american poetry particular attention is paid to women poets and poets from various ethnic groups poets such as amiri baraka nathaniel mackey natasha trethewey and tracy smith are featured the encyclopedia also contains entries on a wide selection of latino and native american poets and substantial coverage of the avant garde and experimental movements and provides sidebars that illuminate key points

a study of maurice scève s sequence of love poems the délie the first french canzoniere there are two main themes scève s rendering of the intensity and complexity of the human experience of love and secondly his exploitation of the european tradition of love poetry dr coleman tackles broad issues concerning appreciation of poetry and more particularly difficult poetry comparing individual poems by horace scève and mallarmé she pinpoints the task of a serious reader to experience sensitively and intellectually human emotions couched in artistic form the book does not offer doctrines about scève s love instead it looks at the contextual linguistic formulae which create love within the poems themselves the allusiveness the intellectual rigour the tautness the juxtaposition of words combine with the voluptuousness and simplicity of the images rhythm and sound to make out of the poems a timeless an intensely personal experience

how to read a japanese poem offers a comprehensive approach to making sense of traditional japanese poetry of all genres and periods steven d carter explains to anglophone students the methods of composition and literary interpretation used by japanese poets scholars and critics from ancient times to the present and adds commentary that will assist the modern reader how to read a japanese poem presents readings of poems by major figures such as saigyō and bashō as well as lesser known poets with nearly two hundred examples that encompass all genres of japanese poetry the book gives attention to well known forms such as haikai or haiku as well as ancient songs comic poems and linked verse each chapter provides examples of a genre in chronological order followed by notes about authorship and other contextual details including the time of composition physical setting and social occasion the commentaries focus on a central feature of japanese poetic discourse that poems are often occasional written in specific situations and are best read in light of their milieu carter elucidates key concepts useful in examining

japanese poetics as well as the technical vocabulary of japanese poetic discourse familiarizing students with critical terms and concepts an appendix offers succinct definitions of technical terms and essays on aesthetic ideals and devices

these poems came out of the love dr yadusky has for his wife margaret and his children the will to create and the will to love are one poems make love visible and by doing so they uplift and heal because in the presence of love everything is healed poetry at its essence depicts a spiritual world because the mind seeks truth the heart seeks love and the spirit seeks goodness and god poems awaken something in the readers heart that is beyond knowledge we can define poetic creation in the same way that we define art itself namely spirit expressed into matter poets say tangibly what they feel intangibly to give finite form to the infinite when dr yadusky depicts this creative spirit of love he shows us the face of god

the encyclopedia of american poetry the twentieth century contains over 400 entries that treat a broad range of individual poets and poems along with many articles devoted to topics schools or periods of american verse in the century entries fall into three main categories poet entries which provide biographical and cultural contexts for the author s career entries on individual works which offer closer explication of the most resonant poems in the 20th century canon and topical entries which offer analyses of a given period of literary production school thematically constructed category or other verse tradition that historically has been in dialogue with the poetry of the united states
